On Aug. 2, 2024, at 10 a.m., Parkland RCMP responded to an attempted theft of a motor vehicle on Harmony Crescent in Stony Plain. Upon arrival, emergency workers tended to a 42-year-old victim who was transported to hospital with serious life-threatening injuries. Investigation has revealed that the victim observed that his work truck was in the process of being stolen when he jumped into the box of the truck in an attempt to stop the thief. The truck drove at a high rate of speed before driving off the road and sticking a parked vehicle and house. The suspect exited the truck and entered a second vehicle being driven by a second suspect and fled the area.

Police are in the early stages of this investigation and are asking the public for assistance.

The suspect vehicle is described as a blue Dodge truck with chrome rims and accents.

Stay right beside your child.

• Swim with others when there is no lifeguard present.

• Avoid alcohol, cannabis and any other substance that may affect your judgment before and during water activities.

Lakes, rivers and streams may contain illness-causing microorganisms.

• Check for recreational water advisories or look for posted advisory signs at public beaches. Not all beaches are monitored for biological, chemical, and physical hazards.

• Do not swim or wade and keep pets out of water in areas where cyanobacterial (blue-green algae) blooms are visible.

• Never drink or cook with untreated water directly from any lake or reservoir, at any time. Water-borne organisms, including fecal bacteria, can cause vomiting and diarrhea.

Swimmer's itch is a rash caused by an allergic reac-

tion to the larvae of certain parasites. The parasites can get under your skin when you swim in lakes, ponds, creeks, streams and rivers. You can't get swimmer's itch from swimming pools that are treated with chlorine.

Shower and dry yourself off with a towel as soon as you leave the water.
Stay away from swimming areas that have weeds. Do not wade or swim in those areas.

COUNTY CROP INSPECTIONS FOR CLUBROOT OF CANOLA

Starting Soon!

Lac Ste. Anne County performs an annual inspection of all canola fields throughout the region, per Policy 02-010-003 Control of Clubroot Disease. This is done to monitor the pathogen's movement and reduce the spread throughout the County. In order to help producers make their own informed cropping decisions and reduce their risks, the County offers a map that shows where clubroot has been identified in canola. A copy of this map is available for viewing on our website.

Field staff will take all necessary bio-security precautions when entering a field for inspection including wearing disposable gloves and boot covers and sanitizing equipment between fields.

BLUE-GREEN ALGAE ADVISORIES IN PLACE Lac La Nonne Added to the Growing List of Lakes

Alberta Health Services (AHS) has issued a BLUE-GREEN ALGAE ADVISORY for Isle Lake, the Paddle River Dam Reservoir, Lac Ste. Anne, and recently added Lac La Nonne. Signs are posted at the affected lakes. Further advisories are anticipated in the region.

To protect yourself and your pets, AHS advises to avoid contact with bluegreen algae blooms, don't swim in water where blue-green algae is visible, and do not drink or cook with water from this lake.

If you suspect a problem related to blue-green algae or if you require further information on health concerns and blue-green algae, please call Health Link at 811. Additional information is also available online at **ahs.ca/eph**.

Please note that areas of the lake in which the blue-green algae bloom is not visible can still be used for recreational purposes, even while this Blue-Green Algae Health Advisory is in place.

Alberta's government is ensuring Albertans have affordable and reliable power by making changes to electricity market rules.

Every hour of every day, power generators offer to sell their electricity to Alberta's grid. In Alberta's unique energy-only market, power generators are only paid for the power they generate. The lowest priced electricity is bought and dispatched first. To ensure generators are able to recoup their cost of production, generators may offer their power at prices above their marginal cost, a practice called economic withholding.

Economic withholding was designed as a legitimate tool to encourage new investment in the province's power market. The slightly higher prices that economic withholding causes in the short-term attracts new competitors to Alberta, leading to lower prices in the long-

That all changed when the accelerated phaseout of baseload coal, and emphasis on intermittent renewables, altered Alberta's supply mix. The negative impacts of economic withholding would normally be offset by having adequate competition in the market. However, the accelerated coal phaseout significantly increased the impact of economic withholding on ratepayers, beyond the original intent of the policy.

While Alberta's government undertakes the important work of restoring balance in Alberta's electricity market, it is enacting temporary rules to limit the practice of economic withholding, lowering power prices.

"Albertans need to have affordable and reliable power. That's why our government is taking action to prevent price spikes on their utility bills, while ensuring the grid has a reliable supply of generation. These new regulations are just

the start of how our government is working to modernize Alberta's electricity system."

The current market rules around economic withholding were designed two decades ago, when coal was the primary source of power generation. The rules did not account for what Alberta's power supply mix would look like today. Alberta's accelerated coal phaseout significantly reduced the amount of reliable baseload power, decreasing the amount of competition in Alberta's market. This led to Albertans seeing prices spike on their power bills, as competition was no longer able to offset the negative impacts of economic withholding.

Based on recommendations from Alberta's Market Surveillance Administrator (MSA) and the Alberta Electric System Operator (AESO), Alberta's government is introducing new regulations to ensure Albertans have reliable and

affordable power. The Market Power Mitigation Regulation addresses economic withholding while ensuring generators make a reasonable rate of return by limiting the offer price for large generators if their net revenues exceeds a monthly predefined threshold. The Supply Cushion Regulation ensures our grid will remain reliable by requiring natural gas power plants to be online in times of high demand if there is not enough power supply to meet Alberta's needs.

Alberta's government is encouraging investment in the electricity market so that the province's energy sector can continue to create jobs in the long-term, while making sure electricity is affordable for Albertans. These two changes still allow power generators to earn revenue while ensuring Albertans have access to affordable and reliable power as Alberta's government works to modernize the province's electricity system.

SOLID YEAR-END SETS STAGE FOR **PROSPEROUS ALBERTA FUTURE**

Positive 2023-24 year-end results display the government's commitment to fiscal responsibility that ensures prosperity and opportunity for Albertans.

For the third consecutive year, Alberta has balanced its budget, ending the fiscal year with a \$4.3-billion surplus. By staying true to fiscal discipline, government was able to pay down debt, save for the future in the Alberta Heritage Savings Trust Fund, and support Albertans through measures such as income tax indexation and fuel tax relief.

This responsible strategy has earned Alberta credit rating upgrades from multiple firms, including Fitch's recent upgrade to AA. Improved credit ratings make borrowing cheaper and attract investment and growth that will ultimately create more jobs and opportunities for Albertans and Alberta businesses.

"Our government has kept its promise to balance our budget and provide Albertans the services and supports they need. We will keep building opportunity so that our children and grandchildren can continue to benefit, grow and share in the province's prosperity."

Alberta's government is committed to paying down debt. The government is allocating \$3.7 billion to debt repayment, with \$1.7 billion repaid in 2023-24 and another \$2 billion to pay debt coming due in 2024-25. This is part of the province's strategic payment plan to reduce the overall debt burden on Albertans.

The province also grew the

market value of the Heritage Fund to a record high of \$22.9 billion. That includes \$1.7 billion in annual investments earnings. Another \$2 billion in surplus cash has also been set aside to further grow the Heritage Fund this coming year. Alberta's government is embarking on a plan that will return the Heritage Fund to its original vision of building intergenerational wealth, with its long-term goal to grow the Fund to between \$250 billion and \$400 billion by 2050.

At the same time, Alberta's government provided the highest-ever levels of funding in 2023-24 to strengthen health care and education, while also supporting Albertans through last year's wildfires, floods, drought and the high cost of living.

To help Albertans, communities and farmers facing devastating consequences from natural disasters, the government provided \$3 billion in disaster and emergency relief. This included \$1.1 billion for the wildfires. Another \$1.9 billion went to help farmers and producers through the severe drought.

Albertans saved \$1.1 billion in 2023-24 as the government paused the fuel tax, saving Albertans a full 13 cents a litre in 2023. Albertans continue to save when they fuel up their vehicles in 2024 at a reduced rate that is in line with the fuel tax program and a drop in the price of oil. Since 2022, Albertans have saved \$2.2 billion from the fuel tax program.

Indexation of personal income taxes to inflation saved Albertans another \$680 million in 2023-24, while those receiving social benefits saw their payments rise.

New screening tools for Alberta's youngest learners will ensure they continue succeed in the classroom by identifying any learning gaps early.

Alberta's government is building an education system that ensures no student falls through the cracks. Through a phased-in approach, students in kindergarten to Grade 5 will be assessed on their foundational literacy and numeracy skills. Beginning fall 2024, teachers and educational staff will be able to identify areas where students may need an extra hand earlier on in a student's education journey.

"Supporting our youngest

learners as they develop essential literacy and numeracy skills is fundamental for their success in school and life. These skills are the foundation for living, working and succeeding in our modern world. These additional assessments will tell teachers, schools and parents about potential learning issues and better position them to support students."

Under the new requirements, beginning in fall 2024, students in grades 1 to 3 will be assessed twice a year, and students receiving extra support will be assessed a third time in June to monitor their progress. In January 2025, an early literacy and numeracy screening will be introduced for kindergarten students, and in September 2026, there will be new screening requirements for students in grades 4 and 5.

"Research studies around the world have clearly shown that there should be early screening and frequent monitoring of children's reading and mathematics performance. Alberta's new framework for Early Learning Assessments is perfectly in line with this research. Early screening and monitoring of children's literacy and numeracy skills is a human right, and I am happy to see Alberta's government prioritize this."

Alberta's government is committed to ensuring each and every Alberta student has a supportive learning environment where they thrive. The new early years assessment framework was developed with input from school authorities, academic experts and other education stakeholders. School authorities will be provided with a list of approved assessments for staff and will have the autonomy to select the screening and assessment tools needed to support their students. The assessments will enable school authorities to make local decisions to better support students' specialized learning needs.


