WATER SAFETY: STAY SAFE WITH AHS' SUMMER TIPS

Alberta Health Services (AHS) wants Albertans to stay safe while enjoying the province's lakes and rivers this summer. Following these safety tips will help you avoid serious injury and illness during recreational water activities.

There is always a risk of injury when swimming, especially in unmonitored bodies of water. Here are a few ways you can prevent water-related injuries and illness:

•Wear a proper fitting Canadian-approved life-jacket or Personal Flotation Device (PFD) in a boat, kayak, canoe or other water sports and make sure it fits

•Make sure young children wear lifejackets when they are in, on, or around the water and be aware of fast-moving water. Stay right beside your child.

•Swim with others when there is no lifeguard present.

•Avoid alcohol, cannabis and any other substance that may affect your judgment before and during water activities.

Lakes, rivers and streams may contain illness-causing microorganisms.

•Check for recreational water advisories or look for posted advisory signs at public beaches. Not all beaches are monitored for biological, chemical, and physical hazards.

•Do not swim or wade and keep pets out of water in areas where cyanobacterial (bluegreen algae) blooms are visible.

•Never drink or cook with untreated water directly from any lake or reservoir, at any time. Water-borne organisms, including fecal bacteria, can cause vomiting and diarrhea.

Swimmer's itch is a rash caused by an allergic reaction to the larvae of certain parasites. The parasites can get under your skin when you swim in lakes, ponds, creeks, streams and rivers. You can't get swim-

mer's itch from swimming pools that are treated with chlorine.

•Shower and dry yourself off with a towel as soon as you leave the water.

•Stay away from swimming areas that have weeds. Do not wade or swim in those areas.

FEDERAL CAPITAL GAINS TAX: MINISTER HORNER

Submitted by Government of Canada

President of Treasury Board and Minister of Finance Nate Horner sent the following letter to Canada's Deputy Prime Minister and Minister of Finance on the changes to the federal capital gains tax:

"I am writing to convey Alberta's strong objections to your budget proposal to raise the capital gains inclusion rate. It adds a further layer to the expanding array of federal policies harmful to savings and investment and, by extension, Canadian productivity and our future standard of living.

"Your proposed tax increase is also damaging and unfair to the many small business owners who

planned for retirement and are relying on the assets they built up and held in their small businesses. I urge you to reconsider the fairness of a retroactive tax increase on their savings and investments. These individuals and families do not have the luxury of a taxpayer-supported defined benefit pension plan that you and your cabinet colleagues have.

"Like other provinces, we are also frustrated that the federal government proposed such a major change to the shared federal-provincial tax base without consultation or engagement. Measures like these are forced upon provinces and undermine our progrowth economic policies that seek to propel our

whole country forward.

"Canada's lacklustre productivity is among the biggest challenges facing Canadians, and a serious threat to our continued prosperity and high standards of living. While you argue that Canada continues to attract significant investment and that our Marginal Effective Tax Rate is still the best in the G7, you cannot deny that this tax increase will further chip away at our tax advantage. And, more significantly, it builds on the piling of federal policies harmful to investment. These policies are weakening our standing in the world, and the standard of living of our people.

"As has been noted by the Canadian, Ontario and Alberta Medical Associations, your tax increase also comes at a time when the Canadian healthcare system is under extreme pressure and our ability to attract and retain physicians is a serious challenge. Raising taxes on these professionals will only exacerbate the crisis and put more financial strain on provincial governments.

"On behalf of the Government of Alberta, I am calling on you to cancel your proposed tax increase on capital gains. Canada needs policies that promote investment, innovation, and risk-taking, not new taxes that hinder productivity."





FAMILIES ENCOURAGED TO TALK ABOUT ORGAN, TISSUE DONATION

AHS launches public awareness campaign, new name for program

Alberta Health Services (AHS) has launched a new public awareness campaign and revealed a new name for its provincial donation program during National Organ and Tissue Donation Awareness Week, April 21-27.

All the Ways is a series of video and print ads showing creative methods of informing loved ones about your decision to donate organs and tissues. While the campaign's tone is

light-hearted, the goal is to normalize talks about deceased donation. Grieving families faced with the difficult decision to donate often find it easier if they know what their loved one wanted.

The Alberta Organ and Tissue Donation Program is now Give Life Alberta. The new name is a call to action for Albertans to register their intent to donate online at GiveLifeAlberta.ca to tell loved ones about their decision. Albertans can also continue to register to donate at motor vehicle registry offices. Signing the back of your Alberta Health card is still accepted, although

not preferred over online registration, and families must be informed in case the card is lost.

"The Government of Alberta is proud to support this life-saving program and campaign," says Adriana LaGrange, Minister of Health. "Increasing donation rates will reduce wait times for transplants and allow seriously ill patients to get back to life."

One organ donor can save up to eight lives, and a tissue donor can save or dramatically improve lives for up to 75 people. While Alberta marked another record year – with 273 organ and tissue donors in 2023 – there are almost 300 people waiting for life-saving transplants in our province. Last year, nearly 50 people on the wait-list died.

Kinza Barney applauds the effort to encourage Albertans to act on their good intentions. When the Airdrie resident received news that her 15-year-old son Zachary would not survive a dirt bike crash, her family knew what he would want. He had an important conversation with his mother weeks before, while practising for his driver's test.

"He had asked me, 'Are you a donor?' because

he knew that going in to get his driver's licence, eventually that was something that was going to be asked of him," says Barney.

"I showed him my licence and said, 'See it says 'donor' and there's a little heart at the bottom. What do you think?' And he said, 'Absolutely. I want to be an organ donor.'"

Zachary's road test was scheduled for his 16th birthday in 2022. Instead, he donated his organs that day, saving five lives.

"Looking back, what a coincidence to have had

that conversation with a 15-year-old ... only to be here today and having to make a decision that reflects his wishes," says Barney. "It made our decision a lot easier for sure."

AHS donor coordinators are approaching more families than ever since Alberta's Bill 205 took effect one year ago. The bill creates a more structured pathway for the organ and tissue donation process, and ensures specialists have adequate time to identify and assess potential donors and discuss the option with families.

"The families that have

talked about organ and tissue donation, they are able to know exactly what their loved one's wishes are and either sign the consent or not," says donor coordinator Carey Beninger. "It makes such a difference in such a stressful time. They don't want to get it wrong. They want to be sure this is what their loved one would have wanted."

DRAYTON VALLEY RCMP RESPOND TO THEFT OF VEHICLE AND DANGEROUS DRIVING

On August 3, 2024 at 6:36 p.m. Drayton Valley RCMP began receiving reports of a dangerous driver in a yellow Mus-

tang in Drayton Valley. Around the same time RCMP received a report of a theft of Yellow Mustang in Breton, Alta. RCMP quickly located the vehicle however it failed to stop for officers

and continued to drive in a dangerous manner. RCMP disengaged however were again able to locate the vehicle and arrest the driver.

The driver, who has been identified as a 15

-year-old resident of Breton, remains in custody with several charges pending.

Did you know?

Older adults and children

are more likely to become dehydrated? Older adults have a diminished thirst sensation, and young children may not always be attentive to their thirst signals when they are busy playing. Watch for signs of dehydration, which include dizziness, headaches, feeling tired, or having a dry mouth, lips, and tongue.

Be mindful of your hydration levels at all times. Drink beverages and eat foods with fluid content to help you stay hydrated. Here are some refreshing tips to beat the heat:

• Add flavour – Infuse your water with fruits and herbs like lemon, cucumber, or fresh berries with mint

for a cool and citrusy twist.

- Enjoy variety Besides water, choose unsweetened drinks like lower fat milk (1%, 2%, and skim), fortified plant-based soy or almond beverage, or iced herbal teas.
- Make fruit easy-to-go
 Pack up fruit kabobs by threading strawberries, blueberries, raspberries, and grapes onto skewers.

Serve with a yogurt dip.

- Prepare a tangy and sweet fruit salad – Combine chopped apples, oranges, and pears in a bowl. Add lime juice and spice it up with a hint of chili powder for a tangy flavour.
- Make a zesty cucumber smash salad – Smash cucumbers with a rolling pin until they form bite size pieces. Add rice vinegar, sesame oil, and a dash of soy sauce. Mix and enjoy.

Common beliefs and misconceptions about drinks

Does adding a pinch of salt to water make it more hydrating?

A recent social media trend claimed that adding salt to water can hydrate better than plain water because it replaces electrolytes. It is true that electrolytes like sodium play an important role in maintaining fluid balance; however, adding salt (which contains sodium) to water is unnecessary for the general, healthy population. Most people get enough salt from the foods they eat. Adding extra salt to your water will not improve your hydration and for some people, it can harm their health. Drink tap or filtered water and eat a balanced diet to stay hydrated and maintain your electrolyte balance.

Do you need sports drinks after exercising?

You may lose more water and electrolytes if you exercise longer than one hour, or intensely, in hot and humid conditions. In this scenario, a sports drink (which contains water, sugar, and electrolytes like sodium and potassium) may help replace the water and sodium you lose in sweat. However, for most active people drinking water is enough for proper hydration.

Does coconut water hydrate better than water?

Coconut water is not more hydrating than water. Just like sports drinks, coconut water contains sodium, potassium, and sugar in various amounts depending on the brand. Aside from the additional flavour that coconut water offers, research suggests that there is little to no difference between drinking coconut water or plain water for hydration in healthy adults.

The bottom line?

Water works! Choose water most often to stay hydrated.
