### STONY PLAIN WELCOMES NEW FIRE CHIEF: CHIEF JASON NESBITT

The Town of Stony Plain is pleased to introduce Chief Jason Nesbitt as the new Fire Chief, bringing a wealth of experience in firefighting and emergency management to the community. Chief Nesbitt's career in public safety began in 2000 in law enforcement, but his passion for firefighting was ignited in 2005 when he started as a volunteer fire-

fighter with the Peace River Fire Department. Over the past two decades, he has held various roles in fire services across Alberta, including Captain and acting Fire Chief in the Town of Sexsmith, and Deputy Chief of Training and Logistics for the County of Grande Prairie Regional Fire Service.

During his tenure in Grande Prairie, Chief Nesbitt oversaw multiple fire stations and led emergency response efforts across a

vast region. His leadership experience is complemented by his active participation in major emergency deployments throughout Alberta, including the Slave Lake wildfires in 2011, the Fort McMurray fire in 2016, and the Chuckegg Creek wildfire in 2019. Most recently, he was on the front lines of the Dunes West, Peavine Creek, and Kleskun Creek wildfires in 2023 and 2024.

## PREVENT STAIRWAY INJURIES

Stairs are a necessity in many homes. While stairs serve a practical purpose, they also have the potential to be dan-

gerous.

According to the National Safety Council, more than one million injuries result each

year from stairway falls. Staircase and stairway accidents constitute the second leading cause of accidental injury, second only to motor vehicle accidents. Each year, there are 12,000 stairway accident deaths. The Canadian Mortgage and Housing Corporation states that a large portion of Canadians who visit hospitals after a fall on or from stairs or steps in their homes are seniors (men and women age 65 years or older).

However, many stairway falls can be prevented with some simple planning.

Install sturdy handrails. A common contributor to stairway falls is a failure to

use handrails. Sturdy handrails can decrease fall rates. Even if a person slips, he or she may be able to prevent the fall by grabbing on to the handrails and regaining some of his or her balance.

Rely on highlighters or friction strips. According to a study titled "Safety on stairs: Influence of a tread edge highlighter and its position," by Richard J. Foster, fall risk may be reduced by using a highlighter positioned flush with the tread edge. This helps make stairs more visible, particularly for those with impaired vision.

- Improve lighting on staircases. Failure to see steps may contribute to falls as well. Staircases should be well lit so that residents and guests know where to step. Subtle foot-level lighting can be installed to make it easier for people who frequently use steps at night.

- Use slip-resistant materials. Slip-resistant surface material acceptable for normal floors should work on stair treads. Loose rugs should not be placed at the top or bottom of the landing. Outdoors, rough finishes are recommended, particularly on stairs that are subject to get-

ting wet.

- Improve step geometry. If slips and falls frequently occur on a particular staircase, consider the relationship between the rise and the run, advises the Canadian Centre for Occupational Health and Safety. The National Building Code of Canada says that, within a staircase, treads should have a uniform run and tread depth that does not vary more than 0.5 to 1 cm. Steep steps with high risers and/or short treads can increase the risk of falls.

- Clear away clutter. One easy way to prevent falls is to keep stairs free of clutter. This means removing shoes, toys and other belongings that

may be left on stairs or landings.

Many falls on stairs can be prevented by being mindful of

certain risk factors.

feel comfortable, while keeping it safe and dry. For the best results, install a rigid board insulation, like Roxul ComfortBoard IS, against the concrete foundation before you stud the wall. The board is mechanically fastened or adhered to the concrete foundation wall, which prevents thermal bridging through the studs, providing better thermal performance. Finish with a moisture-resistant and dimensionally stable insulation between the studs, like R14 Comfortbatt, to protect against common basement issues such as mold, mildew and rot.

Choose a functional design. Draw out plans, carefully taking into consideration any low ceilings or small windows. Try to incorporate structural features, such as attractive wood beams, into your design. Keep the space as open as possible. Select lighting that provides a bright, airy feel.

Don't forget to soundproof it. Soundproofing is the ultimate solution to maximize your basement's quiet and privacy. Whether your new-found space will function as a home theatre, music room, home office or playroom, it will benefit from quality acoustic insulation, like Roxul Safe 'n' Sound. Not only is it highly effective, but it's also easy to install.

Consider fire safety. Since many basements are now being renovated as income suites, fire protection is also a vital consideration. Whenever possible, select building materials with a high fire-resistance rating and
