Council has approved the updated Housing Accelerator Fund Action Plan. Whitecourt has submitted an application to the Housing Accelerator Fund - Round 2, and if approved will provide grants to homeowners, non-profits, housing bodies and developers to increase the housing supply in Whitecourt, and undertake other initiatives to cut red tape and speed up housing approvals.

Tru-West Company Ltd. has been awarded the contract to complete the Mc-Leod Arena Roof Upgrade at a cost of \$347,800.

Council has adopted an amendment to the Land Use Bylaw to allow changes to The Meadows Manufactured Home Park Land Use District.

Council has approved a 0.87% increase to the franchise fee rate for 2025. The new Power Franchise Fee Rate is set at 5.34% which equates to an annual change of \$10.08 for the average resident.

Whitecourt Town Council has approved the Intermunicipal Collaboration Framework Agreement with Woodlands County, and will be scheduling a joint signing in the first week of October.

Council has adopted a new Code of Conduct Bylaw. Bylaw 1579 establishes standards of conduct for both Council and Council Committee Members in their duties as representatives of the municipality.

Street closures in the downtown core have been approved for November 16 for the Whitecourt & District Chamber of Commerce's Santa Claus Parade. LOWERING COSTS FOR MUNICIPALITIES

Alberta is lowering the cost of borrowing for municipalities, enabling them to invest more in services and infrastructure.

These entities will now pay the same interest rate as the province on money borrowed for infrastructure and other capital projects. The change is expected to save municipalities about \$7 million in 2025-26 and about \$12 million in 2026-27.

In a time of high interest rates, Alberta's government is reducing the budgetary pressures faced by local governments and frees up funds for purposes other than servicing debt.

With Alberta's balancing of the budget, the province has been able to reduce outstanding debt by more than \$19 billion. With continued strong results, Alberta's borrowing costs are expected to remain low.

The Loans to Local Authorities program allows even the smallest municipalities in Alberta to benefit from the province's fiscal strength and well-established access to global capital markets. The province lends money to local authorities to help finance their capital projects, such as roads and upgrades to local water, sewer, gas and electric

services.

BRINGING MOBILE LUNG SCREENING TO RURAL ALBERTA

Submitted by Government of Alberta

More Albertans living in remote communities will soon have better and more timely access to lung screening, leading to improved treatment and health outcomes.

Alberta's government is committed to providing high-quality health care services for all Albertans, no matter where they live in the province. To ensure Albertans can get the care they need close to home, Alberta's government and the Alberta Cancer Foundation are partnering with the not-for-profit 19 to Zero to support mobile lung health units that will bring screening services to underserved communities across the province.

Investing in mobile services available in rural and remote communities will increase the likelihood of early detection and treatment, improving health outcomes and bridging gaps in the health care system. The mobile screening program will receive \$1.5 million from Alberta's government, which will be matched by the Alberta Cancer Foundation.

"We are committed to ensuring every Albertan has access to the health care services they need when and where they need them. These mobile units will help bridge existing gaps in the health care system and improve outcomes for Albertans in rural and remote areas.

The mobile lung health units will travel to and service underserved, high-priority communities across the province. Patients in these communities often experience lengthy travel times to reach their closest diagnostic centres, which can lead to delayed diagnoses and the suboptimal management of lung conditions.
"19 to Zero is excited to be

partnering to provide mobile health services for lung cancer and lung health testing. Many Albertans face health care access challenges, particularly in rural and remote areas, and this mobile unit will help improve equitable access across the province."

The mobile units include a converted medical sprinter van for pulmonary function testing (PFT) and a custom-built diagnostic imaging truck. The units will be designed and operated by Aceso Medical, and they will use mobile internet and Starlink to integrate with Connect Care, ensuring instant access to test results for radiologists and pulmonologists.

The mobile lung health units

will provide PFT and computed technology (CT) scans, which are critical diagnostic tools for identifying and managing lung diseases like chronic obstructive pulmonary disease and lung cancer. Across Canada, these services are predominantly available in urban centres, leaving rural and remote communities without access close to home.

Alberta's government work with health care partners and local leadership to help determine areas of need for mobile visits. A website will be developed where the location and schedule of the units will be available.

The pulmonary function testing van is expected to be operational and on the road in spring 2025, with the CT truck following in late summer. Once operational, these mobile units will be able to complete more than 4,000 PFTs and up to 6,000 CT scans per year.

Alberta's government is committed to improving outcomes for Albertans diagnosed with cancer and will continue to engage in partnerships to leverage the growing life sciences sector.



The week culminated in a festive gala celebrating the 90th Anniversary of Onoway Branch 132. Guests were treated to music from the Loyal Edmonton Regiment Band, complemented by the stirring sounds bagpipes performed by local piper Will Howie. During the gala, Richard Mosses, President of the Onoway Legion, reflected on the organization's journey over the past nine decades. "We wouldn't be here tonight without the many contributions from everyone who has helped make our Legion branch a success," he remarked. "Our first president, Edwin Coates, played a crucial role in forming Onoway Branch 132, and every president and member since has shown remarkable dedication to making our branch

a cornerstone of this community."

Mosses also emphasized the importance of collaboration with the wider community. "A Legion branch doesn't exist in a vacuum," he said. "Without a symbiotic relationship with the community, we simply couldn't accomplish what we do for our veterans."

The Onoway Legion was formed by local World War 1 veterans. The group hosted a summer picnic and dance, then in November 1934 they attended a Remembrance Day church service. From these two events, the Legion was formed and on December 10th,1934 the Onoway Legion Branch 132 received its charter.

The Legion's first building opened in July 1939 in a small hut at our current location.

The current building (the west wing of the former On-

oway elementary school) was moved to the current location and opened on November 28, 1974. Recently, the Onoway Historical Guild honored this location with a historical plaque, further cementing its significance in the community.

As the Onoway Legion celebrates its 90th anniversary, it reflects on the dedication and hard work of its members over the decades. Thank you to Academy for your sponsorship, the volunteers from the Onoway Community Hall and finally our own Legion volunteers for making this evening such an enormous success. This legacy of service ensures that the Legion remains a vital part of the Onoway community for years to come.




