### EVANSBURG RCMP ON SCENE AT MOTOR VEHICLE COLLISION

### DRAYTON VALLEY EMBRACES RURAL NURSING PLAN

It takes a village to raise a child – and a community to graduate a rural nurse.

Drayton Valley has embraced this idea, partnering with the University of Cal-

gary (UCalgary) and Alberta Health Services (AHS) to bring the Bachelor of Science in Nursing (BScN) program to town.

In September, the program welcomed its first nine students, combining virtual learning with hands-on labs

and clinical training to prepare them for a future as registered nurses.

“We are a community of 6,700 people three hours away from Calgary, 1.5 hours from Edmonton, and we wanted to make sure

climb the next step in their educational journey.

“It’s quite important to us. Whether it’s getting academic upgrading so they can level up some of the subjects they didn’t do so well in in high school, to where today I’m looking to attract certificate programs, diploma programs and degrees. So, we were looking for the next level for students, right? It’s that continuity.”

The town is trying to further sweeten its offerings to students, as staff work on a student recreation package, which offers a subsidized student rate for pool and recreation centre access, in addition to ongoing conversations to secure prioritized daycare spaces for students

with children – all in an effort to retain healthcare workers locally.

In addition to the town’s efforts and the support of area businesses, the Drayton Valley Health Foundation is planning its contribution to healthcare education and long-term community wellness as well. The group plans to support the creation of a future eSIM lab. The eSIM (educate, simulate, innovate, motivate) lab uses simulation to recreate clinical events safely.

In addition to benefiting patients in the region, eSIMs can help with skills development, recruitment and retention of healthcare staff.

“You have young adults born and raised in Drayton Valley who see opportuni-

ties elsewhere, and that’s tough from an economic development perspective because the 18-25 age group is meant to be a workforce for the community and they’re the ones most susceptible to outmigration,” says Nyambirai.

“For businesses looking to locate here, they can find these amenities in Drayton Valley. And for a young workforce, compared to other communities, it makes us as capable as we can be.”

The first year of the BScN program in Drayton Valley is already underway, but applications are being accepted for the second cohort of students to begin the program next September. Deadline to apply is March 1. See details here.

# ENOCH RCMP AND EPS ARREST MALE FOLLOWING A DOG TRACK

In the early hours of Jan. 12, 2025, the Enoch RCMP received a call to the River Cree Casino for a female reporting an assault by a male suspect who was known to her. Members arrived on scene and while conducting their investigation learned

that the male suspect had fled the area on foot.

In cooperation with Edmonton Police K9 Unit a dog track led to the location and arrest of the male suspect. During the course of the arrest, the male was treated for injuries sustained from the police dog. The suspect was later medically cleared at a hospital

and released into police custody.

Consequently, George Monias (61), a resident of Edmonton, was charged with the following offences:  
•Assault with a weapon;  
•Theft under \$5,000;  
•Possession of methamphetamine.

Monias was also found to be on a Canada wide war-

rant for a parole violation at the time of his arrest.

Monias was taken before a justice of the peace and remanded into custody and his next court date is scheduled for Jan. 15, 2025, at the Alberta Court of Justice in Stony Plain.

This is where Alberta can lead now and in the future.

Alternate forms of energy and energy sources exist abundantly in Alberta. We may not have turbines embedded in the rivers yet, but we do have hydroelectric power. In many areas of Alberta the wind is blowing right now. Placing wind-collecting devices in several locations could ensure a reliable electrical grid. We may not yet be saving excess electrical generation from solar and wind farms, but we have not truly considered the possibility of using that energy (and water) to do such things as store hydrogen as a non-polluting fuel to run generators in the less productive or higher demand

times. Or to sell as fuel for transportation or production use.

Alberta even has the clever technicians who can adapt the wind turbines to operate vertically, using less space, and to trap solar power by various means, and has people with the experience of compressing small molecules for storage and the containers that are required for hydrogen use. In the long run, existing but unused pipelines could even transport hydrogen to facilities for selling it.

Alberta has uranium for small reactors. It has geothermal potential and the drillers to tap into it. It has space (over roadways and rivers and parking lots, if we do not wish to waste farmland or rooftops) for wind

farms and solar collection plants. There are also already numerous other ways to generate power.

We need not fear loss of jobs or excessive costs as we adapt for the future. If it is done thoughtfully and deliberately, our population will simply adapt as changes occur. New jobs will be added, and new opportunities for sharing our new technology will open. Imagine selling our solar ideas in Arizona or China!

Please help us reach a better future by encouraging our governments at all levels to face up to climate change and strive to achieve a safer world for our great grandchildren. Please act to stop providing benefits and subsidies to corporations that use our resources to

contribute to the problems. Instead, please provide support to those who would solve the problems.

The past is no longer here. Please support our future.

As the new Communication Director, I decided I wanted to learn more about this small community of ladies, so I sat down with Sally Turco, whom the ladies call their Grand Poobah, to see what makes them tick.

Sally told me it all started about 15 years ago when they met at a quilting re-

treating. You see, these ladies had one thing in common and that was "quilting was their drug of choice"...their words! Thus, they decided to start their own quilting community. The Fallis Community Hall was where they began their meetups, but then moved to the Pavilion in Seba Beach, and finally ended up at the May Hall in the Seba Seniors Centre. Seba Seniors were more than happy to take the quilters under their wing! After all, this is what Seba Seniors is all about... helping their community! One of the most wonderful things I learned about this quilting community is they make what some refer to as "charity quilts". The first

Wednesday of every month, starting around February, the quilters donate their time to make as many quilts as they can throughout the year, and then in December, they hand them over to a non-profit of their choice. Although most of the fabric for these quilts is provided by the quilters themselves, the Seba Seniors Thrift Shop is also a source this group leverages to get fabric for these quilts. This year, they were able to make another 10 quilts which they chose to donate to the Be Brave Ranch which is affiliated with Little Warriors.

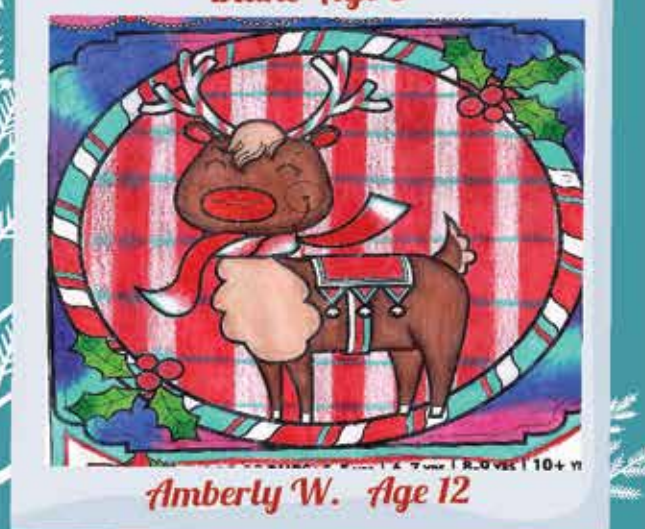

Investing in infrastructure to guide sustainable growth

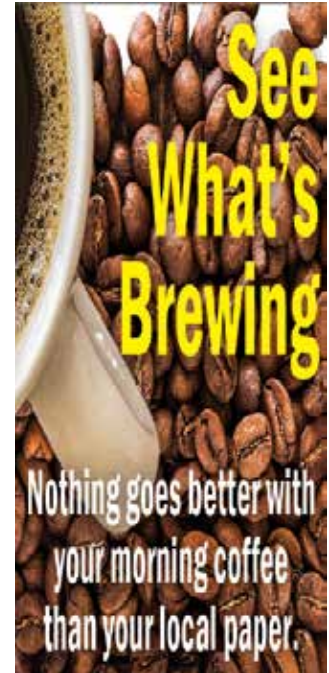
"Our annual Strategic Planning Session is essential in aligning Council and Senior Administration's vision for the future," says
