DRAYTON VALLEY RCMP LAY CHARGES AFTER STOLEN VEHICLE FOUND

On Jan. 22, 2025, Drayton Valley RCMP responded to a report that a truck had been stolen in the area of 50 Street, in Drayton Valley.

Surveillance was obtained from a local business which relayed to the Central Alberta District Crime Reduction Unit (CAD CRU).

Later that same day, CAD CRU members who were assisting the Rimbey RCMP, observed what they believed to be this same stolen truck, along with a second stolen truck, in the area of Highway 22 in Clearwater County, near Alder Flats.

Air Services was requested to assist and the two vehicles were located shortly after and the two trucks fled the area upon RCMP arrival. A tire deflation

device (TDD) was deployed and was successful in stopping the vehicles momentarily until the drivers eventually abandoned the truck stolen from Drayton Valley, fleeing in the second vehicle to a residence, dropping off one occupant near Alder Flats to a residence, and then tried to hide the stolen vehicle in a forested area, fleeing

DEVON RCMP AND ALBERTA RCMP COMMUNITY RESPONSE TEAM RECOVER STOLEN ITEMS AND CHARGE REPEAT OFFENDERS

In late November early December 2024 Devon RCMP began investigating several incidents of break and enters to commercial businesses in the Devon area. Police believed that these thefts were committed by the same group of people. Devon RCMP with help from the Alberta RCMP

Community Response Team (CRT) were able to identify some of the suspects involved. On Jan. 9, 2025 officers executed a search warrant at a property on Range Road 14 in Parkland County.

As a result of the search, RCMP have recovered over \$250 000 in stolen property including a Light tower, tool, commercial equipment, motorcycles, generators.

RCMP have arrested and charged Parkland County resident, Lake Joseph Robinson (29), with:

- Break and enter (x4);
- Possession of property obtained by crime over \$5000.

Robinson was taken before a justice of the peace and release from custody with his next court date set for

Morgan Bud Hansen (30), a resident of Brazeau County, Alta., was charged with: possession of property obtained by crime over \$5000 x2, possession of break in instruments, flight from police officer, possession of weapons for dangerous purpose, dangerous operation of motor vehicle, op-

eration of motor vehicle while prohibited, failure to comply with alcohol/drug recognition demand, and his traffic safety act related warrants.

Hansen was brought before a Justice of the Peace, where he was remanded with a court date of Feb. 12, 2025, in the Alberta Court of Justice in Breton, Alta.

Derek Fernand Lavoie (35), a resident of Brazeau County,


who was out on a conditional sentencing order, was charged with: possession of property obtained by crime over \$5000 x2, possession of break in instruments and flight from police officer.

Lavoie was brought before a Justice of the Peace, where he was remanded with a court date of Feb. 12, 2025, in the Alberta Court of Justice in Breton.

Kristy Lee Knapp (38), a resident of Brazeau County, was charged with: possession of property obtained by crime over \$5000 x2, possession of break in instruments and failure to comply with release order conditions x 2, as well as her 5 warrants for possession of stolen property x2, flight from police officer and failure to attend court x2.

Knapp was brought before a Justice of the Peace, where he was remanded with a court date of Feb. 12, 2025, in the Alberta Court of Justice in Breton.



Jan.30, 2025 at the Alberta Court of Justice in Leduc.

RCMP have arrested and charged Parkland County resident, Troy Jack Dupuis (41), with:

- Break and enter (x5);
- Possession of property obtained by crime over \$5000.

Dupuis was taken before a justice of the peace and remanded into custody with his next court date set for Jan. 30, 2025 at the Alberta Court of Justice in Leduc.

RCMP have charged 28-year-old Parkland County resident Louis-Lee Lamouche with:

- Break and Enter (x5);

- Possession of property obtained by crime;
- Breach of Probation (x3);
- Fail to comply with release conditions (x3).

Lamouche who was already in custody on other matters remains in custody with his next court date set for Jan. 30, 2025 at the Alberta Court of Justice in Leduc.

“This investigation was an example of exemplary coordination between Devon, Leduc Parkland Detachments as well as the Alberta RCMP Community Response Team, says Sgt. Christopher Mosely Commander of the RCMP, “focusing our enforcement efforts on repeat offenders such as these have the larg-

est overall impact on reducing property crime.”

RCMP have been successful in identifying the owners of many stolen items. Several specific items have been seized that police believe are stolen and we asking for public assistance in identifying their owners. DRAYTON VALLEY RCMP LAY CHARGES AFTER PROACTIVE TRAFFIC STOP

On Jan. 22, 2025, Drayton Valley RCMP members were conducting proactive patrols in the area of 50 Avenue, in Drayton Valley, when members observed a vehicle violating the traffic safety act, so a traffic stop was initiated.

RCMP identified the driver as Trey Justice Raine (24), a resident of O'Chiese First Nation, who was failing to comply with his release order conditions.

Raine was charged with 5 counts of failing to comply with his release order con-

ditions, in addition to violation tickets for operating a motor vehicle without a drivers license, having an incorrect license plate on a vehicle and driving an uninsured vehicle on a highway.

Raine was brought before a Justice of the Peace, where he was released with a court date of Feb. 18, 2025, at the Alberta Court of Justice in Drayton Valley.

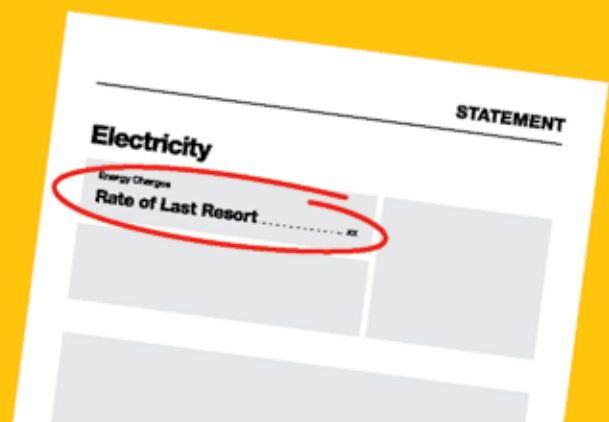

IF MY CHILD IS WITNESSING BULLYING:

- Explore the different options for your child to stand up against bullying

 - Abstaining from violence
 - Not counter-bullying
- Help your child to build their self-esteem by:
 - Engaging them in activities they enjoy

 - Remind your child that you love them

- Accessing child pornography

Stepanko was taken before a Justice of the Peace and released

on a release order with conditions.

Stepanko is scheduled to appear at the Alberta Court of Justice in Leduc on Jan.23, 2025.


