MAYERTHORPE RCMP INVESTIGATE BREAK AND ENTER TO LAC STE. ANNE COUNTY FIRE HALL

On Feb. 17, 2025, Mayerthorpe RCMP responded to a report of a break and enter which had occurred at the Lac

Ste. Anne Fire Hall in Sangudo. Firefighters arrived to the Hall in response to an unrelated call to service, and when they entered the building they immediately saw evidence that a break in and theft had oc-

curred. Through the course of the investigation, it was learned that the Lac Ste. Anne Fire Hall had been broken into sometime between approximately

Mayerthorpe RCMP Investigate Break And Enter To Lac Ste. Anne County Fire Hall

5:30 P.M. on Feb. 16, 2025 and 12:30 A.M. on Feb 17, 2025.

“Lac Ste. Anne County Fire Services was shocked to discover the theft of essential tools for emergency service delivery and maintenance tools

from Station 4. One of which was a set of tools commonly referred to as the Jaws of Life. This discovery occurred upon our members response to the station for a motor vehicle collision in the early hours of February 17, 2025. Temporary measures to outfit the station

with tools from other stations, along with response adjustments will assure service delivery is not interrupted,” said Fire Chief Randy Schroeder.

The Fire Hall is still tallying items that were stolen, but some of these include: the jaws of life, hydraulic pump hoses, forestry power saws, ventilation power saws, a generator, various tools meant for forcible entry into vehicles and houses, a medical trauma kit, chainsaws, mechanical hand tools, all of the hand tools from the work benches, laptops, and a drone.

The investigation is ongoing and RCMP request the publics assistance with checking their cameras around the area for anything suspicious.

CULTURE & EVENTS CENTRE CONSTRUCTION IS ON SCHEDULE & ON BUDGET

Construction on the Culture & Events Centre continues. The project is on

time and within budget, and is expected to be complete by the fall of 2026.

The building's steel construction is 85% complete, and the exterior wall framing is scheduled to start in April 2026.

Construction on the Culture & Events Centre started in the summer of 2024. The facility will be a landmark for the community, and will include three components:

- Arts, Culture and Convention Centre – A venue designed to host a variety of concerts, trade shows, festivals, events, conventions, and celebrations.

- Library – The new library will provide increased floor area and space to better serve the region. It will provide a safe and accessible place for the community to learn and gather, and increase operating efficiency.

- Town Administration Office – The new office space will enhance customer service and accessibility, and provide an administrative facility that can grow with the community.

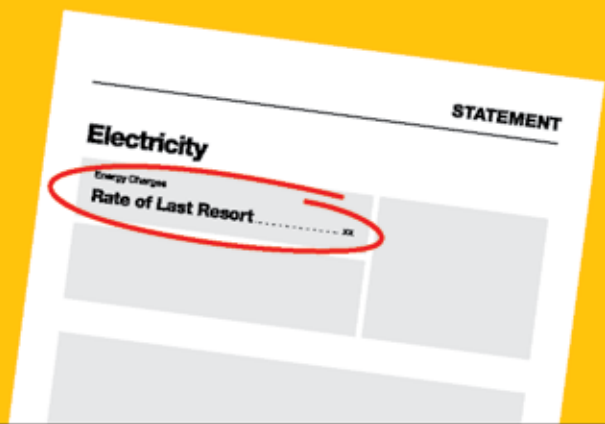

Preventing Crushes

- From rolling machinery to falling front-end loaders there are countless crush hazards on a farm. While farm operators and workers can't prevent every hazard on a farm, they should prevent every hazard they can by taking simple preventative measures while working.
- Failure to block-up equipment safely can result in a fatal crushing injury. A jack may slip, a hose or overhead support may break, or the equipment may roll. Always take the precaution of placing support blocks under the equipment prior to working with raised machinery for any reason.

friends to be part of a very, very important American event. As it turned out the weather went sour, and as fate would have it, the Canadian Embassy opened its doors to welcome our American friends in out of the cold, so we in turn got to play host to the Senator, that invited us and so many others.

I had many "Kitchen Table" conversations that day, and over the several days that I was there meeting with folks, literally from all around the world, but for obvious reasons a strong focus on our American friends. The best part about that type of conversation, is that it's real. I had a chance to be at the table with our Premier for a few round tables, and I can tell you full well, it was because of her grounded style of diplomacy, that she was received so well, and that the communication lines have been kept open.

There are a number of subsequent conversations, text messages, and impromptu meetings I had when the tariff concerns were looming that I can't give details on, but it was because of the last several years of developing these relationships that we are still working without a big tariff war. The ask was simple, fix your border issues, and spend what you said you were going to on your military, show us, don't just say you are going to do it...because that tune does not play any longer.

The "Other" political leaders that were talking about our friends, rather than to them, quite honestly they were putting us on a path that we could not afford to travel. Funny how a number of the "Talk Tough" crowd were also going to use us to be their negotiating stick, throw us under the bus to save the team while kicking our friend,

rather than addressing the concern of borders and military. Thank goodness they changed their tune, and went down to DC as a group, with our Premier to share a few cups of coffee.

I have so many updates to share with you, I'm terribly sorry I have not been able to get out an article in a while, I can honestly say this is about the tenth one I have started to write, but this is the first one I've been able to complete.

Things on the USA / Alberta file have been moving fast, and our other international files are picking up steam as well, due to the "Awakening" of a need to build infrastructure in Canada again, and to get our products to alternate markets. Coincidentally, this is the model I've been pitching for a number of years, and now, we are starting to gain traction. In future articles I'll let you know about India, the Arctic, Northern Europe and

the Balkans. Further I'll bring it back into perspective on how that is a benefit to all of us back here in God's Country. I look forward to having a town hall, or heck, just even a coffee with you at one of our local coffee shops, or who knows, perhaps at a kitchen table, to find out, what matters to you.

Entanglements

° The average farm is full of machinery and device that can grab, cut, smash and entangle fingers, hands, toes, and feet causing injury to the extremities and even death. The sad truth is that most of these injuries can be avoided.

°Some of the key entanglement prevention measures to implement when working with or near machinery are:
-Before operating any machine or equipment, ensure that all guards are in place and in good condition.

-Wear tight fitting clothing, such as overalls. Avoid wearing any items that could become entangled, such as long coats or scarves.

-Never step over a PTO shaft or conveyer belt while it is still running.

°Ensure that anyone working with augers, PTOs, and other extremely hazardous machinery receives appropriate safety instruction and adequate supervision.

°Keep young children out of the farm or ranch work site, especially areas where there is moving machinery.

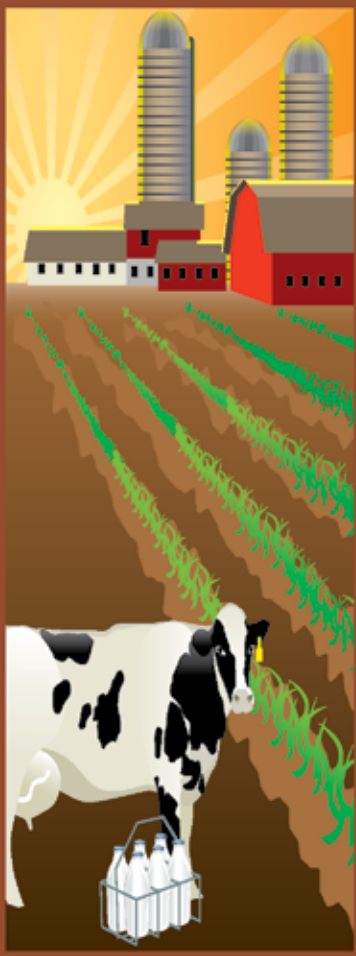

Be SAFE – Plan Ahead Assess Risk

Risk concerns the expected value of results of a situation or event. The value of those results may be positive or negative. In the farming industry, the measure of risk can be rated as high, medium or low. Once the risk has been assessed, through your regular safety checks, employers can determine whether to take immediate action of a hazard or identify those that can be monitored and fixed at a later time. Regular assessment can help with budgeting time and resources for immediate or future repairs.

FARM SAFETY & HEALTH WEEK

Farm Safety Tips

When farming please follow these precautions in order to keep yourself, your family and your workers safe:

- Decrease your risk of being crushed by using lockout procedures before beginning any maintenance or repair work. Lockout means to physically neutralize all energies in a piece of equipment. Machines, devices or power transmission lines can be de-energized by applying blocks to all parts under tension or pressure, bleeding the hydraulic pressure from the lines or by releasing pressure from a coil or spring.
- Provide a safe, fenced play area for all children and supervise closely. The working area of the farm is not a playground any more than a construction site or other industrial area would be a play area. Review the safety rules on your farm with your family often. Fence off all manure, retaining ponds and dugouts, and lock buildings containing hazardous goods.

ROAD BANS COMING SOON

A friendly reminder that spring thaw is just around the corner! Each year, the County implements road bans by placing weight restrictions on all roadways. These bans are weather-dependent but are typically enacted between mid-to-late March and lifted between mid-May and early June.

Road bans help protect our infrastructure by minimizing damage caused by heavy traffic during the thawing period. As frost leaves the ground, roadways retain higher moisture levels, reducing their load-bearing capacity. When heavy vehicles travel on weakened roads, costly repairs—funded by taxpayer dollars—become necessary. By enforcing weight restrictions, we help reduce both the financial and time burden of these repairs.

If you have significant hauling to complete, now is the time to do so before road bans take effect.

As we move into spring, the County wishes our farming community a safe and prosperous season!

WHITECOURT TOWN COUNCIL UPDATE

Submitted by Town of Whitecourt

Whitecourt will be applying to the Province for a Ministerial Order to continue the Whitecourt Protective Services Committee. Changes made by the Government of Alberta to the Police Act have mandated mechanisms for municipal input into policing. The Whitecourt Protective Services Committee, which includes Town of Whitecourt, Woodlands County and Public Members, has been established for several years and meets the intent of the Provincial changes.

The Community Services Department presented its 2024 annual report to Council at the February 24 Council meeting. A complete copy of the report is available online.

• There were over 197,622 scanned visits at the Allan &

Jean Millar Centre in 2024.

• 2,099 participants registered in swimming lessons and aquatic courses in 2024.

• Whitecourt Transit provided service to 33,644 passengers in 2024.

• The Whitecourt Food Bank served 2,626 people with regular food bank fills in 2024.

• The Dial-A-Bus Program provided transportation to over 3,493 passengers in 2024.

Whitecourt has secured \$2,364,587 in funding through the rural Transit Solutions Fund for the replacement of the Dial-A-Bus, purchase of one transit bus, addition/replacement of bus stops and shelters, replacement of traffic signals, and replacement of sidewalks/pathways leading to stops. The Canada Public Transit Fund also awarded Whitecourt with \$697,030 in funding for transit capital projects which will be

provided in annual allocations for the next 10 years. The funding for both programs will assist with capital costs related to offering Transit service in Whitecourt.

Council was provided an update on the Culture & Events Centre. The project is on schedule and on budget. A press release was distributed on February 25, 2025 with further details and is available to view on our website.

Whitecourt Town Council has passed a Land Use Bylaw amendment that has changed the zoning of land in the hilltop residential area from "Municipal Reserve" to "Future Urban Development". The land, located within the Southland Estates Area Structure Plan, was held as Urban Reserve for school development; however, local school divisions indicated recently that they do not require this land.

The zoning change will allow a developer the opportunity to purchase the land and propose a designation they feel is compatible with the built-out area in accordance with the Area Structure Plan.

Land Use Bylaw 1577-4 has been adopted. The amendment has changed the definitions for "Professional Office Services" and "Health Services", and "Health Services" are now permitted in Hilltop Commercial and Urban Services districts.

Council has scheduled a Special Meeting for April 2, 2025 at 4pm to discuss the 2025 Budget.

Street closures have been approved for the Whitecourt & District Chamber of Commerce's Annual Carnival. The Carnival is scheduled for May 2-4, 2025 in downtown Whitecourt.

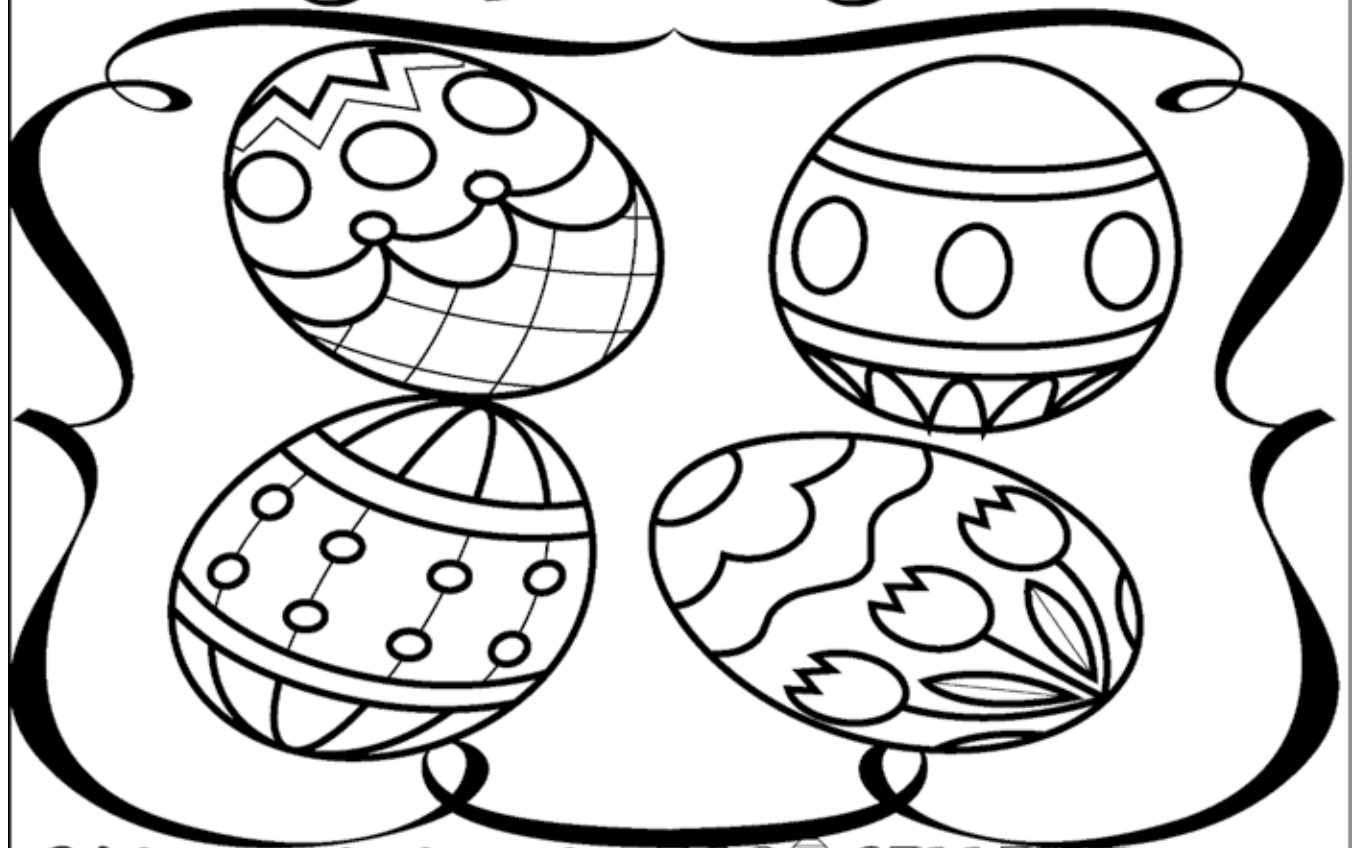
