EVANSBURG RCMP INVESTIGATE INFANT FATALITY AFTER DOG BITE

On Feb. 16, 2025, Evansburg RCMP responded to assist Alberta Health Services Emergency Medical

Services (EMS) at a residence in the area of Entwistle, where a dog had bitten a 14-day-old infant inside the residence, resulting in serious life-threatening injury.

RCMP arrived to the scene and assisted with the landing of STARS, who transported the infant to the Stollery Children's Hospital in Edmonton.

On Feb. 18, 2025, at approximately 9:00 a.m., Parkland RCMP responded to a shooting on the Paul Band First Nation. Upon arrival,

Parkland RCMP found a 41-years-old male with serious injuries and a 46-years-old male who was assaulted with a weapon. Parkland RCMP engaged multiple resources in order to locate the suspects,

including: the RCMP helicopter, the Parkland RCMP General Investigation Section (GIS), the Parkland RCMP Crime Reduction Unit (CRU), the Central Alberta

District CRU (CAD CRU), the RCMP Police Dog Services and the RCMP Community Response Team.

The investigation revealed that Jeremy Adams and Nelson Saulteaux were responsible for the shooting as well as the assault. They were eventually located and safely arrested.

The male with serious injuries was air lifted by STARS to hospital. He is currently in stable. The second victim suffered non life-threatening injuries. He was transported by EMS to hospital, but has since been discharged.

Adams, a 35-years-old resident of Paul Band First Nation, was arrested and charged with:

- Attempted murder;
- Forceable confinement (x2);
- Aggravated assault;
- Assault;
- Unlawful discharge of a firearm;
- Being an occupant of a motor vehicle in which he knew that there

was at that time a firearm;

- Unlawful possession of a firearm;
- Possess a firearm for a dangerous purpose;
- Fail to comply with a release order (x3);
- Breach of weapon prohibition order (x4).

Adams was taken before a Justice of the Peace and remanded in custody with their next court date set for Feb. 26, 2025, to appear at the Alberta Court of Justice in Stony Plain.

Saulteaux, a 41-years-old residence of Paul Band First Nation, was arrested and charged with:

- Forceable confinement (x2);
- Possession of a weapon for a dangerous purpose;
- Aggravated assault;
- Assault with a weapon;
- Being an occupant of a motor vehicle in which he knew that there was at that time a firearm;

PARKLAND RCMP RESPOND TO SERIOUS MOTOR VEHICLE COLLISION

On Feb. 17, 2025, at 4:50 p.m., Parkland RCMP received a report of a serious collision on Highway 627 and Range Road 273. Upon arrival, emergency responders tended to multiple

patients and STARS was contacted. The driver and passenger of an SUV, were flown by STARS to the University of Alberta Hospital. The other vehicle involved in the collision was an ambulance with three EMS personnel onboard, they were

taken by secondary ground ambulances to area hospitals. Parkland RCMP are now clear of the collision.

Police remained on scene for several hours investigating the collision. Investigation has revealed that the SUV was South-

bound on Range Road 273 and crossing Highway 627 when it collided with the ambulance travelling East on Highway 627.

The police investigation continues at this time.

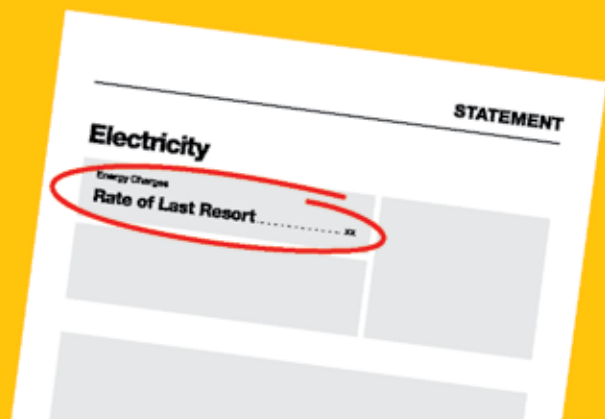

HELP SHAPE THE FUTURE OF YOUR COMMUNITY!

Nominations for Parkland County mayor and six divisional councillors, and Parkland School Division school trustees, are now open. This is your chance to make a difference and represent the voices of your community!

The Nomination period runs January 1, 2025, through to Nomination Day, which takes place September 22, 2025, from 10:00 am – 12:00 pm. Prior to Nomination Day, you must book an appointment with the Returning Officer to submit your completed nomination form. Nomination Papers can be submitted earlier to the Returning Officer by appointment. A \$100 deposit must be provided to the Returning Officer with your Nomination Paper.

The appropriate Nomination Paper and Candidate's Acceptance form must be signed by at least five (5) eligible electors. The Returning Officer is required to refuse a Nomination Paper that has been signed by fewer than five electors as per the Local Authorities Election Act. For a copy of the Nomination Paper and

details on eligibility, either as a candidate or as a nominator, please refer to Parkland County's Candidate Information Guide for mayor and councillor offices, and 2025 PSD Elections Handbook for school trustee offices. Parkland County's Candidate Information Guide is available from the Elections Office at Parkland County Centre, or from our website at www.parklandcounty.com/elections. Parkland School Division School Board Election Handbook will be available on their website at www.psd.ca/board/election-2025.

Parkland County accepts the nomination for Parkland County Council and Parkland School Division.

Parkland County conducts the vote for school trustees under joint agreements. few months leading up to and after President Trump's inauguration, of which, I was very honored to have been invited personally by Senator Roger Victory from Michigan. The Senator only had a couple of passes he could give out; it was an MLA (MPP) from Ontario and myself who got the call. He called in his Canadian friends to be part of a very, very important American event. As it turned out the weather went sour, and as fate would have it, the Canadian Embassy opened its doors to welcome our American friends in out of the cold, so we in turn got to play host to the Senator, that invited us and so many others.

I had many "Kitchen Table" conversations that day, and over the several days that I was there meeting with folks, literally from all around the

world, but for obvious reasons a strong focus on our American friends. The best part about that type of conversation, is that it's real. I had a chance to be at the table with our Premier for a few round tables, and I can tell you full well, it was because of her grounded style of diplomacy, that she was received so well, and that the communication lines have been kept open.

There are a number of subsequent conversations, text messages, and impromptu meetings I had when the tariff concerns were looming that I can't give details on, but it was because of the last several years of developing these relationships that we are still working without a big tariff war. The ask was simple, fix your border issues, and spend what you said you were going to on your military, show us, don't just say you are going to

do it...because that tune does not play any longer.

The "Other" political leaders that were talking about our friends, rather than to them, quite honestly they were putting us on a path that we could not afford to travel. Funny how a number of the "Talk Tough" crowd were also going to use us to be their negotiating stick, throw us under the bus to save the team while kicking our friend, rather than addressing the concern of borders and military. Thank goodness they changed their tune, and went down to DC as a group, with our Premier to share a few cups of coffee.

I have so many updates to share with you, I'm terribly sorry I have not been able to get out an article in a while, I can honestly say this is about the tenth one I have started to write, but this is the first one I've been able to complete.

Things on the USA / Alberta file have been moving fast, and our other international files are picking up steam as well, due to the "Awakening" of a need to build infrastructure in Canada again, and to get our products to alternate markets. Coincidentally, this is the model I've been pitching for a number of years, and now, we are starting to gain traction. In future articles I'll let you know about India, the Arctic, Northern Europe and the Balkans. Further I'll bring it back into perspective on how that is a benefit to all of us back here in God's Country. I look forward to having a town hall, or heck, just even a coffee with you at one of our local coffee shops, or who knows, perhaps at a kitchen table, to find out, what matters to you.

Farm Safety Tips

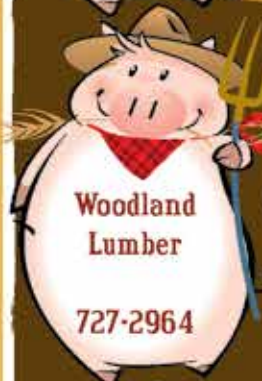
When farming please follow these precautions in order to keep yourself, your family and your workers safe:

- Decrease your risk of being crushed by using lockout procedures before beginning any maintenance or repair work. Lockout means to physically neutralize all energies in a piece of equipment. Machines, devices or power transmission lines can be de-energized by applying blocks to all parts under tension or pressure, bleeding the hydraulic pressure from the lines or by releasing pressure from a coil or spring.
- Provide a safe, fenced play area for all children and supervise closely. The working area of the farm is not a playground any more than a construction site or other industrial area would be a play area. Review the safety rules on your farm with your family often. Fence off all manure, retaining ponds and dugouts, and lock buildings containing hazardous goods.

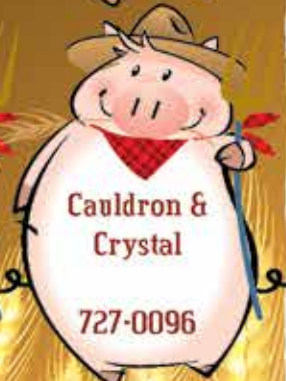

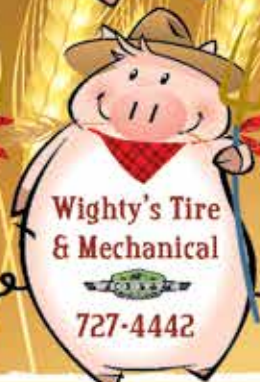

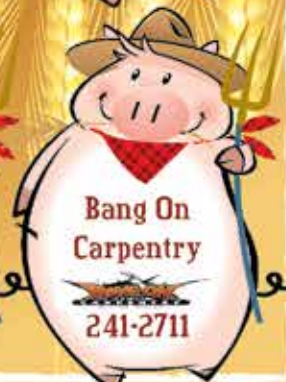

YELLOWHEAD COUNTY COMMUNITY RECREATION GRANTS

GRANT DEADLINE: March 31 (Reviewed Annually)

Community Hall Operational Grant
Registered non-profit groups will be eligible for operational assistance if they are operating a community hall.

Outdoor Amenity Operational Grant
Registered non-profit groups are eligible for operational assistance if operating an outdoor amenity. Amenities include: playgrounds, ski trails, outdoor skating rinks, ball diamonds, soccer pitch, riding arena, hiking trails.

GRANT DEADLINES: QUARTERLY
March 31, June 15, September 30, December 31

Community Hall/Outdoor Amenity Capital Assistance Grant

Entanglements

° The average farm is full of machinery and device that can grab, cut, smash and entangle fingers, hands, toes, and feet causing injury to the extremities and even death. The sad truth is that most of these injuries can be avoided.

° Some of the key entanglement prevention measures to implement when working with or near machinery are:

- Before operating any machine or equipment, ensure that all guards are in place and in good condition.
- Wear tight fitting clothing, such as overalls. Avoid wearing any items that could become entangled, such as long coats or scarves.

-Never step over a PTO shaft or conveyer belt while it is still running.

° Ensure that anyone working with augers, PTOs, and other extremely hazardous machinery receives appropriate safety instruction and adequate supervision.

° Keep young children out of the farm or ranch work site, especially areas where there is moving machinery.

Preventing Crushes

- From rolling machinery to falling front-end loaders there are countless crush hazards on a farm. While farm operators and workers can't prevent every hazard on a farm, they should prevent every hazard they can by taking simple preventative measures while working.
- Failure to block-up equipment safely can result in a fatal crushing injury. A jack may slip, a hose or overhead support may break, or the equipment may roll. Always take the precaution of placing support blocks under the equipment prior to working with raised machinery for any reason.

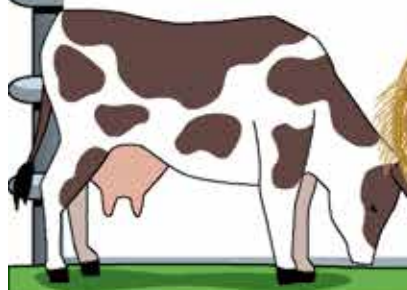

The victim was beaten and received a gunshot wound. The Maskwacis RCMP with the assistance of the RCMP police helicopter and police dog services

arrested 3 suspects. 3 search warrants were executed in the area. The suspected firearm used in the offence was recovered.

Clarence Northwest (36), a resident of Samson Cree Nation, has been charged with the following offences:

- Kidnapping with a firearm;
- Discharge firearm with intent;
- Aggravated assault;
- Adult intimidation;
- Pursuit involved Flight from Peace Officer & 13 Additional charges.


Silas Soosay (25) and Chevez Louis (18), both residents of Samson Cree Nation, have been

charged with the following offences:

- Kidnapping with a firearm;
- Unauthorized possession of a firearm & 4 additional charges.

Northwest, Soosay and Louis were taken before a Justice of the Peace and were remanded into custody. They are scheduled to appear at the Alberta Court of Justice on Feb. 27 and Mar. 4 2025, in Wetaskiwin Alberta.

Police are actively investigating the firearm that was seized.

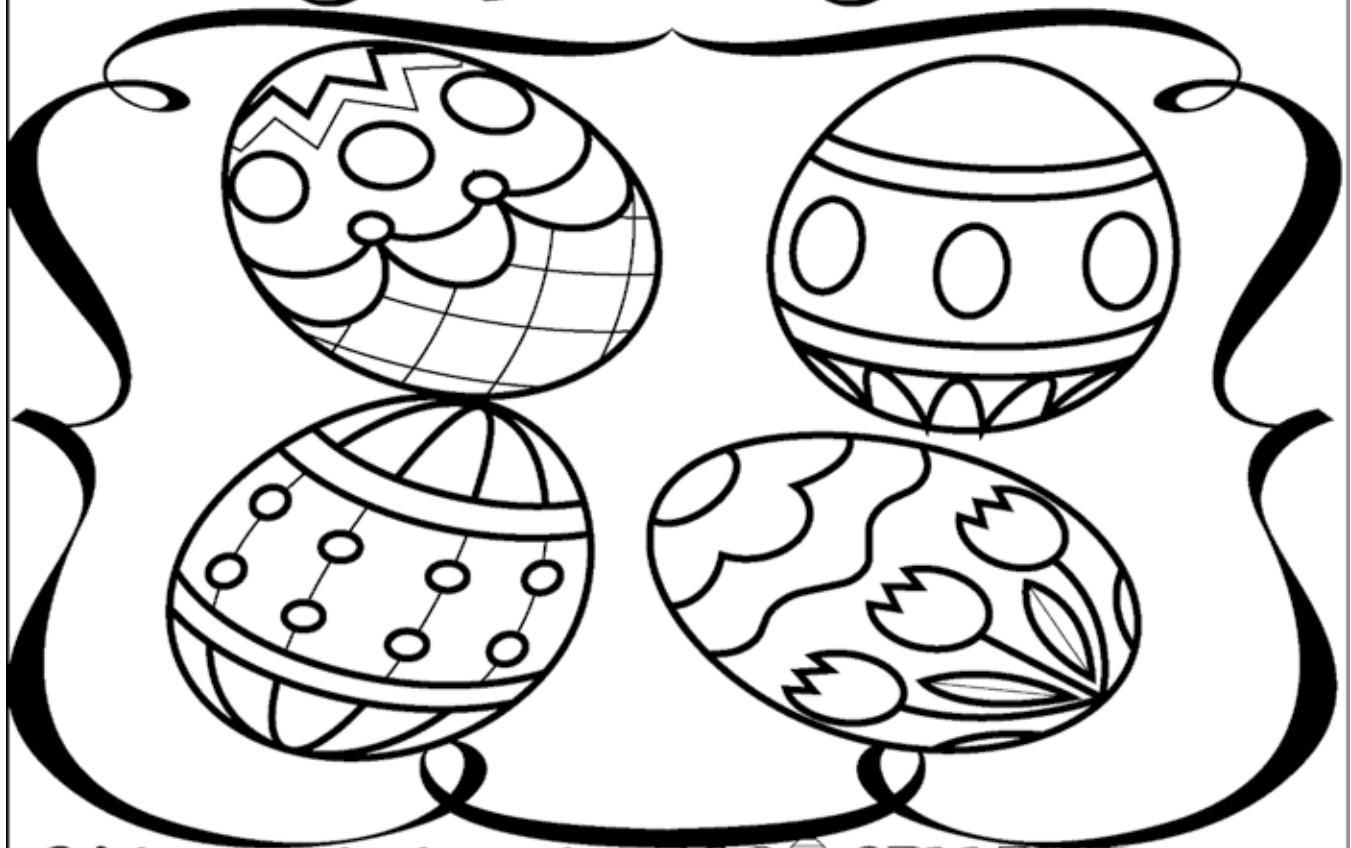
