

District CRU (CAD CRU), the RCMP Police Dog Services and the RCMP Community Response Team.

The investigation revealed that Jeremy Adams and Nelson Sault-eaux were responsible for the shooting as well as the assault. They were eventually located and safely arrested.

The male with serious injuries was air lifted by STARS to hospital. He is currently in stable. The second victim suffered non life-threating injuries. He was transported by EMS to hospital, but has since been discharged.



few months leading up to and after President Trump's inauguration, of which, I was very honored to have been invited personally by Senator Roger Victory from Michigan. The Senator only had a couple of passes he could give out; it was an MLA (MPP) from Ontario and myself who got the call. He called in his Canadian friends to be part of a very, very important American event. As it turned out the weather went sour, and as fate would have it, the Canadian Embassy opened its doors to welcome our American friends in out of the cold, so we in turn got to play host to the Senator, that invited us and so many others.

I had many "Kitchen Table" conversations that day, and over the several days that I was there meeting with folks, literally from all around the

world, but for obvious reasons a strong focus on our American friends. The best part about that type of conversation, is that it's real. I had a chance to be at the table with our Premier for a few round tables, and I can tell you full well, it was because of her grounded style of diplomacy, that she was received so well, and that the communication lines have been kept open.

There are a number of subsequent conversations, text messages, and impromptu meetings I had when the tariff concerns were looming that I can't give details on, but it was because of the last several years of developing these relationships that we are still working without a big tariff war. The ask was simple, fix your border issues, and spend what you said you were going to on your military, show us, don't just say you are going to

do it...because that tune does not play any longer.

The "Other" political leaders that were talking about our friends, rather than to them, quite honestly they were putting us on a path that we could not afford to travel. Funny how a number of the "Talk Tough" crowd were also going to use us to be their negotiating stick, throw us under the bus to save the team while kicking our friend, rather than addressing the concern of borders and military. Thank goodness they changed their tune, and went down to DC as a group, with our Premier to share a few cups of coffee.

I have so many updates to share with you, I'm terribly sorry I have not been able to get out an article in a while, I can honestly say this is about the tenth one I have started to write, but this is the first one I've been able to complete.

Things on the USA / Alberta file have been moving fast, and our other international files are picking up steam as well, due to the "Awakening" of a need to build infrastructure in Canada again, and to get our products to alternate markets. Coincidentally, this is the model I've been pitching for a number of years, and now, we are starting to gain traction. In future articles I'll let you know about India, the Arctic, Northern Europe and the Balkans. Further I'll bring it back into perspective on how that is a benefit to all of us back here in God's Country. I look forward to having a town hall, or heck, just even a coffee with you at one of our local coffee shops, or who knows, perhaps at a kitchen table, to find out, what matters to you.





Farm Safety Week

Entanglements

° The average farm is full of machinery and device that can grab, cut, smash and entangle fingers, hands, toes, and feet causing injury to the extremities and even death. The sad truth is that most of these injuries can be avoided.

Some of the key entanglement prevention measures to implement when working with or near machinery are: -Before operating any machine or equipment, ensure that all guards are in place and in good condition. -Wear tight fitting clothing, such as overalls. Avoid wearing any items that could become entangled, such as long coats or scarves.

-Never step over a PTO shaft or conveyer belt while it is still running.

Erisure that anyone working with augers, PTOs, and other extremely hazardous machinery receives appropriate safety instruction and adequate supervision.



MASKWACIS RCMP INVESTIGATE A KIDNAPPING WITH A FIREARM

Submitted by Maskwacis RCMP

In the evening of Monday Feb. 24, 2025, Maskwacis RCMP responded to a call to assist Emergency Medical services in Samson Cree Nation with a male sustaining a gunshot wound. Officers arrived on scene and obtained information that the victim had been kidnapped and tied to a chair in the basement of a residence in Samson Cree Nation. The victim was beaten and received a gunshot wound. The Maskwacis RCMP with the assistance of the RCMP police helicopter and police dog services arrested 3 suspects.

3 search warrants were executed in the area. The suspected firearm used in the offence was recovered.

Clarence Northwest (36), a resident of Samson Cree Nation, has been charged with the following offences:

- •Kidnapping with a firearm;
- •Discharge firearm with intent;
- Aggravated assault;
- •Adult intimidation;
- •Pursuit involved Flight from Peace Officer & 13 Additional charges.

Silas Soosay (25) and Chevez Louis (18), both residents of Samson Cree Nation, have been charged with the following offences:

- •Kidnapping with a firearm:
- •Unauthorized possession of a firearm & 4 additional charges.

Northwest, Soosay and Louis were taken before a Justice of the Peace and were remanded into custody. They are scheduled to appear at the Alberta Court of Justice on Feb. 27 and Mar. 4 2025, in Wetaskiwin Alberta.

Police are actively investigating the firearm that was seized.


