

oPossession of a weapon for a dangerous purpose (X2).

Thompson and Haubi were brought before a justice of the peace. Thompson was remanded into custody while Haubi was released on conditions. Both are to appear at the Alberta Court of Justice in Drayton Valley on April 15, 2025.

"The Drayton Valley RCMP understands that drug trafficking has been identified as a high priority within the community of Drayton Valley" said Cpl. Cam Turner, NCO/ic of the Drayton Valley RCMP GIS. "Drug traffickers exploit individuals with addictions leading to an increase in property crime and drug overdoses within our community. The Drayton Valley RCMP is committed to continuing to investigate and pursue drug traffickers that profit off and prey on vulnerable people with addictions within the community."

finances.

"With the removal of this costly tax, Alberta drivers will save an average of \$215 per year at the pumps. Our

government expects that retailers will pass these tax savings on to Albertans in full.

ANNUAL VEGETATION MANAGEMENT PROGRAM

Each year, CN is required to manage vegetation on its right-of-way. Managing this vegetation contributes to mitigating fire risks and enhances the efficiency of inspection of track infrastructure.

To ensure safe railway operations, the annual vegetation management program will be carried out on CN rail lines in the province of Alberta. A certified applicator (Davey Tree Expert Company of Canada, Ltd., 1-800-465-6367) will apply herbicides on and around the railway tracks (primarily along the 24-foot graveled area/ballast). Product requirements for setbacks in the vicinity of dwellings, aquatic environments and municipal water supplies will be met.

CN only uses herbicides that have been approved for use in Canada and in the province within which they are applied.

The program is expected to take place from May to October 2025.



they can access the utilities they need – at a reasonable cost."

A total of \$700,000 is allocated to the Rural Electric Program, recognizing the increasing role electricity plays in modern farming and ranching. Under this program, grants are administered by the Alberta Federation of Electrification Associations and support

the construction of electrical services for farms and ranches.

"Alberta's Rural Electric Grant Program is helping rural Albertans access the power they need to continue putting food on tables around the world. We're grateful for the government's ongoing support and commitment to rural electrification."

When it comes to home heating, Budget 2025 commits \$5.7 million to the Natural Gas Program, to be administered by the Federation of Alberta Gas Coops, to expand and update natural gas infrastructure. This funding will help provide more rural Albertans with reliable and affordable home heating options as well as help communities attract new businesses, create jobs and diversify the local economy.

For those who are unable to access the natural gas system, Budget 2025 also commits \$1.6 million for the Remote Area Heating Allowance program. Direct financial relief is provided to more than 2,000 households, the majority from Indigenous communities, to help with the high cost of alternative heating fuels, such as heating oil and propane.

"With this funding, gas co-operatives can continue the ongoing expansion of our natural gas distribution system so that we can connect even more rural communities to affordable gas heating."

firefighters including ice water rescues, toxic material responses and so much more





HOME SAFETY CHECKS TO COMPLETE TODAY

A new kitchen or a bathroom remodeling job might be dream projects for many homeowners, but the right home improvement project at a given moment is not necessarily the most glamorous project. Sometimes safety upgrades around the house must take precedence over more popular projects.

Periodic inspections for


potential hazards can keep everyone safe. The following are a handful of ways for homeowners to ensure their homes are as safe as possible.

check for sturdy handrails and prevent tripping hazards. Falls are one of the leading causes of home injuries. Falls can be a particular threat for youngsters and the elderly. To help prevent falls, make sure that staircases feature sturdy railings and that there is ample lighting in walkways. Remove obstructions from

frequently used paths inside and outside the home. In addition, insert nonslip padding beneath runners or throw rugs.

· Check for frayed wires or faulty outlets. Address any electrical problems around the house, including frayed wiring and faulty outlets. Sparks can lead to fires, and poor wiring may cause unforeseen problems behind walls. Repair or replace any loose or frayed wires on all electrical devices. Be sure that cords do

not run under doorways or rugs. Replace outlets that are in disrepair and install ones with groundfault current interruptors as an added precaution. If small children live in the home, use plastic safety covers over unused outlets.

Practice window

safety. Young children are curious and do not always recognize the inherent dangers around them. Children excited to see the great outdoors

may climb up to peer out windows, and open windows are falling hazards. Screens do not offer an adequate barrier against falls. Consider locking windows or use safety bars to guard against falls. Test to see how easily screens can be pushed out, replacing any that do not provide adequate resistance to curious youngsters' hands.

Check smoke and carbon monoxide detectors. Replace the batteries in smoke alarms and carbon monoxide detectors at least twice per year, and test them to make sure they're in good working order at least once per month. The National Fire Protection Association recommends replacing hard-wired smoke alarms every 10 years. Battery-operated alarms may need to be replaced even sooner. Many carbon monoxide detectors work for five to seven years. Check the back of alarms for a date stamp that indicates how old the product is and when it expires.

Safety checklists are an important part of home maintenance. A proactive approach can prevent both injuries and damage to the home.

think that privacy comes at the cost of light, that's not always the case.

Functional curtain panels can be drawn closed when privacy is desired and then opened to let in light. The thickness of the fabric will also dictate the amount of privacy the panels create.

Tiers are hung on a short rod-pocket panel and usually cover the lower one-third of a window. They're popular choices to let light in from the top, but obscure views

from the bottom portion of the window.

Cellular shades are another option that provide privacy but still let light in. Cellular shades come in hard and fabric varieties and their use depends on the room. Many cellular shades are constructed with a honeycomb design, offers the design resource Houzz, so they can insulate as well as decorate windows.






