


Beyond the Legion, Edward has

improve, buy or build a home.

3. Home equity loan: Individuals also can borrow against equity in their homes with a fixed interest rate through a home equity loan. 4. Personal loan: Home-

rates. Again, like a credit card, PLOC gives a person a maximum borrowing amount and is ideal for ongoing purchases.



- · Olefin: Olefin is made from polypropylene or polyethylene. It is prized for its strength, resistance to staining and colorfastness. It is often suited well to loop pile or high, dense cut piles.
- · Wool: Wool is durable, albeit less re-

sistant to soiling than some other materials. However, because it is an all-natural material, it is prized by people who want natural beauty.

FIRE ADVISORY IN EFFECT

Due to a very high fire hazard rating for Lac Ste. Anne County, a FIRE ADVISORY was issued—effective April 14, 2025 until further notice.

What this means:

With increasing temperatures, wind, and dry conditions, the County will NOT be authorizing any new Fire Permits for large burns until further notice. Smaller burns may be considered with prior approval, contact your Fire Guardian for details.

Currently issued Fire Permits for allowed burning and any burn barrels, campfires, wood-fired appliances, and approved fire pits will be allowed at this time; however, please use with extreme caution with more frequent monitoring and enhanced extinguishing methods.

Existing Fire Permits will not be granted extensions while the Fire Advisory is in effect, and no new lighting of piles is allowed without prior approval. Fireworks during a Fire Advisory or Fire Ban are prohibited.

Please report any wildfire to 9-1-1 with exact location to assist Lac Ste. Anne County Fire Personnel in promptly locating and extinguishing these fires. Your cooperation is greatly appreciated.






