WHITECOURT RCMP INVESTIGATE TWO SUSPECTED ARSON INCIDENTS

Whitecourt RCMP is seeking public assistance with two suspected arson investigations. The first fire occurred on April 17, 2025, at approximately 6 p.m.. The second was on April

25, 2025, at approximately 11:00 p.m. Both fires occurred in the same general area, in the Town of Whitecourt limits, east of the industrial park, specifically south of 41 Avenue and east of 30 Street.

and Whitecourt RCMP responded to both, and both fires were put out within hours. Alberta Wildfire provided assistance. At no time were lives or private property structures threatened, however, approximately 19 acres was burned.

Screen Test is coming to Whitecourt May 13 to 28, 2025

Screen Test is a free service provided by Alberta Health Services that offers screening mammograms. Our mobile screening units travel to 120 communities throughout Alberta to provide convenient access to breast cancer screening.

Having regular screening mammograms is the best way to find breast cancer early, before symptoms appear and when treatment

may work better.

Who should have a screening mammogram?

If you're 45 to 74, you don't need a referral to have a mammogram. Make screening part of your regular health routine. Plan to have a mammogram every 2 years or as decided by you and your healthcare provider.

If you're 40 to 44 or over 75, discuss the risks and benefits of screening with your healthcare provider. You will need a referral if you're 40 to 44 and it's your first mammogram, or if you're over 75.

with Screen Test.

Breast density scores are now included in your Screen Test result letter

Breast density is the amount of dense tissue compared to the amount of fat in a person's breasts. It can be harder to find cancer in dense breasts because this tissue appears white on a mammogram, the same colour as many kinds of breast cancer. It's common to have dense breast tissue.

Dense breasts are only one of many risk factors for breast cancer. Other factors, such as age and genetics, have a bigger impact on your

overall risk. You can't tell how dense your breasts are by size, look or feel. The only way to find out is by having a mammogram.

FUELING INNOVATION, STRENGTHENING ALBERTA'S GRID

Submitted by Government of Alberta

Proposed legislative changes will pave the way for emerging hydrogen technologies, and modernize Alberta's utility system by prioritizing reliability and long-term affordability.

As Alberta's population and economy continue to grow, so does the demand for reliable utilities. From heating and cooling homes to powering communities and businesses, Albertans need to know they have access to affordable utilities they can depend on, when and where they need them.

Bill 52, the Energy and Utilities Statutes Amend-

ment Act, 2025, proposes changes to meet growing demand, prioritizing reliability and affordability in the modernization of the utility system. If passed, the Energy and Utilities Statutes Amendment Act will enable hydrogen use in Alberta's natural gas system. It will also support critical updates to power market rules and transmission policies to strengthen the power grid, lower and stabilize utility bills, and encourage investment in the province.

"Albertans need to know they have reliable and affordable utilities to provide for their families and chase their dreams. From responsibly introducing

hydrogen blending in our natural gas system to strengthening our power grid, the changes we're making will drive new investment and fuel Albertans to pursue a bright, successful future."

Driving innovation in hydrogen

The world is looking to hydrogen as an energy solution for hard-to-abate industries. As the largest hydrogen producer in Canada, Alberta has the resources, expertise and investment-ready environment necessary to be a destination of choice for investors and innovators. Through the Energy and Utilities Statutes Amendment Act, 2025, proposed amendments would allow hydrogen blending in the natural gas distribution system for residential and commercial heating and support new technologies while ensuring the safety and reliability of the natural gas system.

Changes will protect ratepayers from rising costs by ensuring only those who receive hydrogen-blended natural gas in their homes and businesses will pay for any additional system costs. Utility providers will also be required to ensure community support on hydrogen blending projects.

Strengthening the grid, protecting ratepayers

Albertans increasingly rely on electricity to power their homes, businesses and lives. The Energy and Utilities Statutes Amendment Act, 2025, if passed, will put Albertans first by advancing the modernization of the electricity market to

ensure it can meet their growing needs, at a price they can afford.

Proposed amendments support the move to a day-ahead reliability market, ensure there is enough power available and reduce the risk of grid alerts in the future. Much-needed updates will also be made to Alberta's transmission policies to protect ratepayers from rising transmission costs on their utility bills. This includes encouraging more efficient use of existing infrastructure by maximizing the use of existing lines and ensuring new power projects are built in optimal locations. Changes will also see costs assigned on a cost-causation basis, ensuring that Albertans are

not burdened with the full cost of any new transmission lines that need to be built.

Additional legislative changes

The Energy and Utilities Statutes Amendment Act, 2025 also includes an amendment to the Petroleum Marketing Act to increase the number of directors on the Alberta Petroleum Marketing

Commission board from seven to 13 to increase the range of expertise and allow for more robust governance. This will also increase support for new initiatives such as the bitumen royalty in-kind and a proposed gas royalty in-kind, ensuring Albertans receive the maximum value for our resources.

SOME TIPS FOR CHILDREN ON THE NET

1. Do not use login names or nicknames that will reveal age or gender.
2. Never give out personal identification including friends, addresses, school activities, passwords or real names
3. Everyone is a stranger. Identities can be hijacked or passwords compromised so even your "best friend" online might not be who they say they are.
4. Everyone lies. While this might not be true, it is easier to assume that it is true and to act accordingly.
5. The Internet is NOT secure. It is a shared resource. Email is about as secure as a postcard; Chat is about as private as having a phone call with your parents listening in on the other extension.
6. The people who would harm you have often had lots of time, experience and knowledge on how to trap you. You are an amateur compared to them. They will do everything they can to trick you into trusting them.
7. Do not agree to meet anyone offline.
8. If you are even a little bit suspicious, talk to your parents.

SELF DEFENCE

1. Computers used by children should be placed in a supervised area with the screen facing outwards.
2. All computers that can connect to the Internet should have Anti-Virus Software installed and updated at least weekly, if not daily.
3. All computers that have a dedicated connection (cable/dsl) should also have a firewall device or firewall software installed to block intruders.
4. Never open attachments unless they have been scanned. If you do not know the sender, attachments should be deleted.
5. Use passwords to secure your computer even if you are the only user. If the computer equipment is stolen, all your information could be compromised. Change your password regularly.
6. Disconnect your network connection or turn off your computer when you are not using it.
7. Your computer needs regular maintenance, upkeep and periodic upgrades to keep it functioning well.
8. Always back up your data. Keep the data stored securely and separately from the computer.

BULLYING

Tips for Dealing With Bullying

1) Take complaints of bullying seriously. Do not dismiss your child or expect your child to work through the situation alone.

2) Praise your child for reporting bullying situations to you and assure your child you will take action.

3) Talk to your child's teacher, counselor, or other

caregiver about reports of bullying.

4) Work together to address the bullying situation. Don't confront the parents of the bully directly.

5) Ask your child specific questions about how your child is treated by peers, who he or she eats lunch with, and how other children are treated.

6) Teach your child to be assertive. Your child should be able to express feelings and needs clearly, without shouting or other aggressive behavior.



7) Provide opportunities for your child to make friends. Identify some of your child's interests and encourage your child to pursue them through sports, clubs, or other group activities.

8) Teach your child to identify bullying behaviors. These include hitting, damaging possessions, threatening, name calling, & excluding someone

ALBERTA RCMP MARKS NATIONAL PUBLIC SAFETY TELECOMMUNICATORS WEEK AND LAUNCHES PROVINCE-WIDE NON-EMERGENCY LINE

Your Alberta RCMP is recognizing the hard work of its Operational Communications Centres (OCC) and their operators during National Public Safety Telecommunicators Week, running April 13-19. OCC operators are the first point of contact for the public when seeking assistance from the police, in both emergencies and non-emergencies. They work day and night, 365 days a year, and are essential for ensuring public safety.

As a part of National Public Safety Telecommunicators Week, the Alberta RCMP is happy to announce that individuals in Alberta will now be able make non-emergency police reports by calling 310-RCMP, or 310-7267. The new function is designed to streamline the reporting process, optimize early stages of investigations, and reduce unnecessary calls to 911.

"310-RCMP was created to help eliminate confusion about which detachment someone should call if they experience

a non-emergency that doesn't require police attendance," says Chris Spence, director of the Operational Communications Centre in Alberta. "We encourage people to report non-emergencies as this helps us focus frontline efforts on high-priority calls and deploy resources in areas that need it most."

RCMP Police Dispatchers determine when a non-emergency call should be dispatched to a detachment directly or to the Alberta RCMP's Call Back Unit (CBU). The CBU is a unit made up of police

officers whose primary duty is to respond to and investigate files that do not require scene attendance by police officers. CBU officers will contact complainants and investigate the occurrence. If, during the investigation, there is need for further investigation they will contact detachments or specialized units.

Long-distance charges do not apply, and no area code prefix required. The number is accessible to all Albertans within the province with a phone line or an active

COUNTY MOVES TO FIRE RESTRICTION

[LSAC.ca/fire-services](https://lsac.ca/fire-services)

Due to an EXTREME fire hazard rating for Lac Ste. Anne County, a FIRE RESTRICTION has been issued until further notice. Fire hazard conditions in light and medium fuels are at a level where fires can start and grow quickly. With a significant warming trend in the weather forecast, hazards will also increase.

This FIRE RESTRICTION includes:

- No open burning fires or major burn operations are allowed, and no fireworks.
- SAFE fires in acceptable fire pits, burn barrels/incinerators with screens, pellet smokers or other enclosed outdoor wood-fired appliances as well as gas/propane stoves, and barbeques are allowed with conditions.
- A SAFE fire under this restriction is a CONTINUOUSLY monitored fire of LIMITED size for cooking, warming, or recreation, burning within an ACCEPTABLY constructed fire pit or appliance, with a spark-arresting screen, no more than 1 meter in diameter and 60 cm (24 inches) in height, built on a non-combustible surface. No burning of any kind for any reason with winds above 15km/hr. No burning without an acceptable extinguishing method immediately at hand.
- No further fire permits for any open fire under the bylaw will be issued.
- Current permits issued may be suspended or cancelled at any time.

Report any wildfire to 9-1-1 with the exact location to assist Lac Ste. Anne County fire personnel in locating and promptly extinguishing them.

The MUNICIPAL GENERAL ELECTION will be held on Monday, October 20, 2025. Nominations for Councillors will be accepted until noon on Nomination Day—Monday, September 22, 2025.

Tips to Protect your Real Estate Investment Dollars

- * Consult public real estate websites to review property listings in the community where the property is located. Compare features, size & locations to establish if the asking price seems reasonable.
- * Get independent representation for your purchase. If the seller objects, consider it a red flag.
- * Check to make sure your representative is a licensed real estate agent. Contact your local Real Estate Board or the Real Estate Council of Alberta. Using a licensed real estate agent does not cost anything from a purchaser's standpoint. Usually all commissions are paid by the seller.
- * Beware of a real estate agent or mortgage broker who has a financial interest in the transaction.
- * Ask your independent representative to provide you with a comparative market analysis of the property.
- * Ask for a copy of the land title or go to a Registry office and ask them to do a historical title search.
- * Insist on a home inspection to guard against buying a home that has been cosmetically renovated.
- * When you make a deposit, ensure your money is protected by being held "in trust".



Red Flags to Watch for Mortgage Fraud

- * Someone offers you a fee to use your name and credit information to obtain a mortgage
- * You are encouraged to include false information to a loan application
- * You are asked to leave signature lines or other important areas on a loan application blank
- * The loan amount on the mortgage is significantly higher than the value of the property
- * The mortgage has been refinanced several times and each instance, the amount of the mortgage has increased
- * The seller or investment advisor discourages you from seeing or inspecting the property you are offering to purchase

IT'S YOUR DUTY TO REPORT AN IMPAIRED DRIVER

TIPS TO SPOT AN IMPAIRED DRIVER

Drivers who are impaired by fatigue, drugs, alcohol or other distractions such as cell phones, are a danger not only to themselves, but also to the innocent drivers around them. If you witness any of the behaviors below, call 911 and tell the operator that you are calling to report an impaired driver. Be prepared to describe the make, model, color and license plate number of the vehicle, and provide its exact location.

Signs of impaired driving include:

- Failure to turn on headlights at night.
- Illegal or sudden turning.
- Turning within an unusually wide radius.
- Nearly striking other cars or objects.
- Sudden or erratic braking.
- Drifting, swerving or weaving.
- Driving with the face close to the windshield.
- Drinking alcohol in the vehicle.
- Driving much slower than the posted speed limit.
- Rapidly accelerating.
- Tailgating.
- Driving in the middle of the road, or with the left tires on the center line.
- Responding slowly to traffic signals

RURAL CRIME AWARENESS


Protect machinery from theft by leaving valuables locked in a shed or storage facility and by marking equipment with your drivers licence and province of issue (an engraver can be borrowed free of charge from most local police detachments).

Protect livestock by checking herds regularly and keeping accurate records of livestock born, sold or purchased.

"Grain Fette" or "Grain Guard" is a unique approach to identifying your crops. Small bits of paper, each one imprinted with your special code number, are mixed with grain as grain is being augered into the storage shed. This is approved by the Canadian Grain Commission. The paper used is also digestible in animal feed.

Utilize the Report-A-Poacher Program. Their toll free number is 1-800-642-3800. Rural Crime Watch Members are concerned citizens who are watchful for unusual activity in their community. They record information on suspicious people and vehicles and pass it along to local police. Join together with your neighbours to install a crime watch program in your area. Do not approach suspicious individuals on your own.

INFORMATION FOR ELECTORS

A person who is eligible to vote in the election for a councillor under the *Local Authorities Election Act*.

Pursuant to Section 47(1) of the *Local Authorities Election Act*, a person is eligible to vote in an election if the person:

- a. is at least 18 years old,
- b. is a Canadian citizen, and
- c. resides in Alberta and the person's place of residence is located in the local jurisdiction on election day.

A poll may be demanded in Lac Ste. Anne County by electors equal in number to at least 10% of the population of 11,300 (1,130 electors), in accordance with the provisions of Section 223 of the *Municipal Government Act* and in accordance with the provisions of Section 251 of the *Municipal Government Act*.

The petition for a vote must be received by the Chief Administrative Officer within 15 days of the last publication of this notice and shall contain on each page "an accurate and identical statement of the purpose of the petition". mobile phone with a cellular signal.

Non-emergencies:

- Do not pose an immediate or potential threat to life or public safety.
- Include crimes that have already taken place prior to being discovered.
- Often do not re-

quire police attendance, but do require police response.

Examples include but are not limited to:

- Minor motor vehicle collisions.
- Break and enters that already took place.
- Scams in which money or personal information was not transferred or provided.
- Lost property.

- Property damage under \$5,000.

- Theft under \$5,000.

While these types of reports are important, they are not an emergency.
