of Whitecourt has issued a fire ban, which will be enforced. Whitecourt RCMP members are doing proactive patrols in order to stop these fires before they get out of hand and will keep charging those responsible.

ALBERTA RCMP MAJOR CRIMES UNIT INVESTIGATE HOMICIDE IN PARKLAND COUNTY UPDATE

One year later and the Alberta RCMP continue the investigation into the found remains of 19-year-old Eric Moonias who was located in a treed area South of Spruce Grove in Parkland County

on May 15, 2024.

The body of Eric Moonias was located in a container and RCMP believe he was transported there from a different location.

Constable Peter Crockford of the Alberta RCMP Major Crime Unit, "Anyone with information about his death and his activities in the weeks leading up to his death are asked to call police."

- Tiki torches.
Allowed for use during the fire ban:
- CSA approved or ULC certified gas or propane barbecues used for cooking,
- CSA approved or ULC certified Wood Pellet Smokers,
- Propane and natural gas fire pits,

- Catalytic or infra-red-style heaters,
- Electric or propane meat smokers.

The fire ban will remain in effect until conditions improve.

The operation of Off Highway Vehicles (OHV) within the Town of Whitecourt is prohibited under the Traffic Bylaw 1573 which prohibits OHV use within Town boundaries between April 1

and November 30 annually. Penalties for contravening Bylaw 1573 range from monetary fines to OHV seizure.

SECTION 251 – The *Municipal Government Act*

TAKE NOTICE that the Council of Lac Ste. Anne County, in the Province of Alberta, has given first reading to borrowing Bylaw No. 14-2025 which will, upon final passage and approval, authorize the proper officers of the said Lac Ste. Anne County to borrow monies from the Province of Alberta by way of debenture issue, to pay for the cost of the following municipal purposes(s), namely the purchase of Fire Services Apparatuses within the limits of the said municipality.

The total cost of the aforesaid project amounts to \$1960,000. After deducting from this cost the amount of \$95,000 to be received way of the Local Government Fiscal Framework Grant, and the amount of \$40,000 to be received way of sale of assets contributions, the net amount to be borrowed on the credit and security of Lac Ste. Anne County at large by the issue of debentures is \$1,825,000. The debentures are to be repayable to the Province of Alberta in twenty (20) equal consecutive semi-annual installments of combined principal and interest, the semi-annual interest not to exceed eight (8%) per cent or the interest rate as fixed from time to time by the Province of Alberta.

NOW THEREFORE NOTICE is hereby given by the Council of Lac Ste. Anne County that, unless a petition of the electors for a vote on Bylaw 14-2025 is demanded, as provided for by the terms of Section 231 of the *Municipal Government Act*, the said Council may pass the said borrowing Bylaw.

All persons interested are hereby notified and they are required to govern themselves accordingly.

INFORMATION FOR ELECTORS

Pursuant to Section 1(i) of the *Municipal Government Act* an "elector" means:

A person who is eligible to vote in the election for a councillor under the *Local Authorities Election Act*.

Pursuant to Section 47(1) of the *Local Authorities Election Act*, a person is eligible to vote in an election if the person:

- a. is at least 18 years old,
- b. is a Canadian citizen, and
- c. resides in Alberta and the person's place of residence is located in the local jurisdiction on election day.

A poll may be demanded in Lac Ste. Anne County by electors equal in number to at least 10% of the population of 11,300 (1,130 electors), in accordance with the provisions of Section 223 of the *Municipal Government Act* and in accordance with the provisions of Section 251 of the *Municipal Government Act*.

The petition for a vote must be received by the Chief Administrative Officer within 15 days of the last publication of this notice and shall contain on each page "an accurate and identical statement of the purpose of the petition". (Further requirements of the petition are provided in Section 224 of the *Municipal Government Act*).

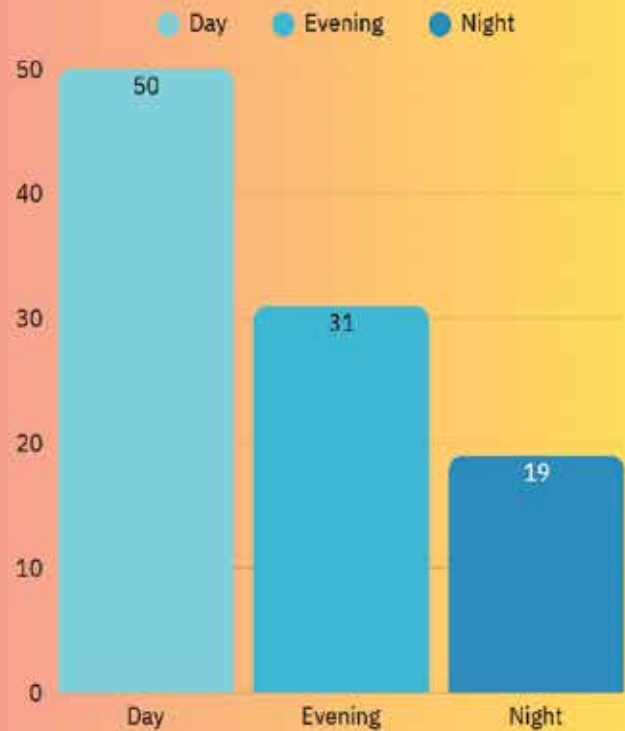

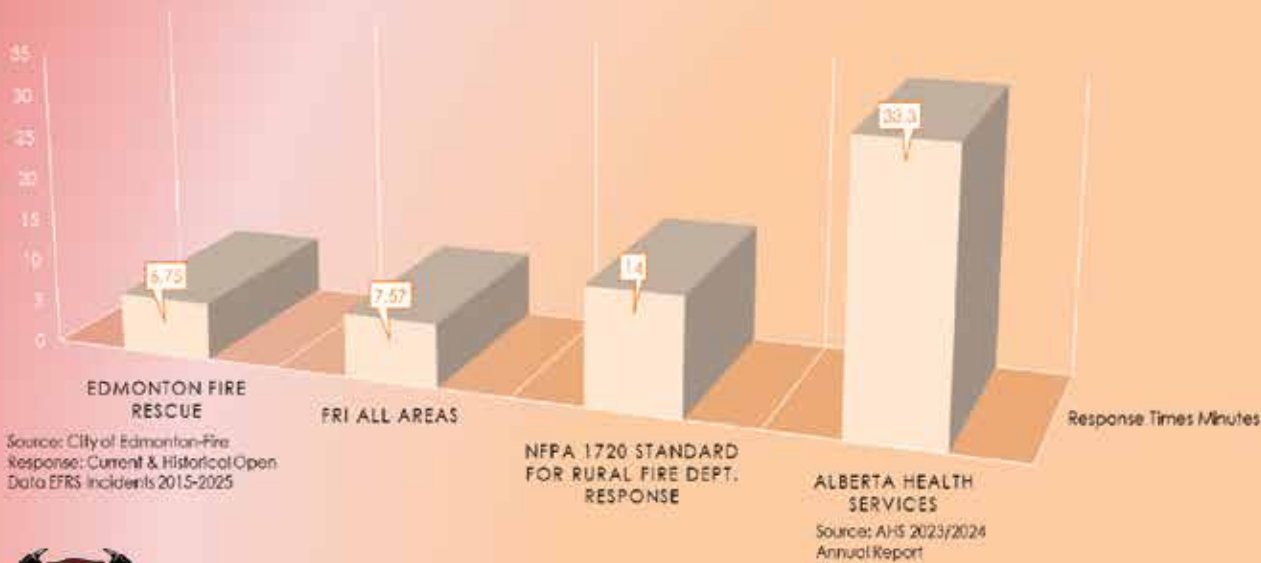

COMPLETE FIRE BAN IN EFFECT FOR LAC STE. ANNE COUNTY

The Fire Hazard Rating for Lac Ste. Anne County is extreme. As a result, the Fire Restriction has been upgraded to a COMPLETE FIRE BAN, effective Monday, May 5, 2024 until further notice.

No new Fire Permits will be issued, and all existing Fire Permits are hereby cancelled.

This Fire Ban affects **all** burning, including cooking/warming fires (backyard fire pits and campground fire pits), brush pile fires, slash pile fires, and burn barrels. This Fire Ban also includes backwoods or random camping areas, charcoal briquettes, deep fryers (e.g. turkey fryers), tiki torches, fireworks, and wood fires in outdoor recreation facilities such as group campsites, gazebos, teepees, and wood-burning stoves inside tent-like structures.

Please exercise extreme caution and closely monitor conditions when operating ATVs/UTVs and limit use to essential activities such as agricultural or industrial operations during this Fire Ban.

Please report any wildfire to 9-1-1 with the exact location to assist Lac Ste. Anne County Fire Services in locating and extinguishing these fires. Your cooperation is greatly appreciated.

WEED AND CROP INSPECTORS ARE ON THE JOB

LSAC.ca/weeds

A friendly reminder that Lac Ste. Anne County's annual crop and weed inspection program to prevent the spread of noxious and prohibited weeds is underway. The County has appointed nine weed and pest inspectors to conduct inspections from May through September.

During inspection season, the Agricultural Services team inspects all private and County properties for noxious and prohibited noxious weeds as per the Alberta Weed Control Act and the Alberta Agricultural Pests Act.

These inspectors will enforce and monitor compliance with regulations throughout the municipality. Residents are encouraged to report any weeds or pests to help benefit the agricultural community and uphold regulatory standards.

As always, inspection crews will exercise extreme care when entering fields to minimize any potential spread of crop issues from field to field. Precautions include the use of disposable boots and/or disinfection with a bleach solution prior to entering any field.

WHAT'S NEXT?

In case you missed it, we have a new Prime Minister in Ottawa—and his first name is not Pierre. Like many of you, I was hoping for more than just a change in leadership; I was looking for a fundamental shift in policy and direction for our country. Clearly, I wasn't alone. The regions that voted blue sent a strong message: they were seeking relief from the “sunny ways” and promises of “self-balancing budgets.”

Some speculate that NDP loyalists shifted their support to the Liberals en masse. It's hard to disagree, considering the party once led by Jack Layton lost official party status under Jagmeet Singh. After propping up a minority government for years, the lines between the NDP and Liberals became blurred in the eyes of many voters. To add to the confusion, several NDP figures openly endorsed Liberal candidates.

The Conservatives gained 40 seats—numbers that would have secured a government in the past. But in 2025, that's no longer the case. We're seeing a consolidation of the political spectrum: what used to be center-left and left has merged, while the far left has nearly vanished, holding just seven seats. The center-right and right remain solid, and the Quebec sepa-

ratist party has also lost ground. Canada appears to be evolving into a de facto two-party system, with divisions increasingly aligned along transfer payment lines.

Regardless of which party formed government, we were always going to arrive at the same question: What's next? What policies must change to allow Alberta—and the West more broadly—to grow? Make no mistake: we've faced significant barriers over the past decade. Our Premier met with both federal leaders before the election, presenting the same nine priorities needed to reset the relationship between Alberta and Ottawa. One party was aligned from the start; the other, not so much. Now that the election is over, these priorities have been restated:

To reset this relationship, Prime Minister Carney must address the following within the first six months of his term:

- Guarantee Alberta full access to unfettered oil and gas corridors to the north, east, and west
- Repeal Bill C-69 (the “no new pipelines” act)
- Lift the tanker ban off the B.C. coast
- Eliminate the oil and gas emissions cap, which is effectively a production cap
- Scrap the Clean Electricity Regulations
- End the prohibition on single-use plas-

tics

- Abandon the net-zero vehicle mandate
- Return oversight of the industrial carbon tax to the provinces
- Halt federal censorship of energy companies

So what happens if we don't hear back? What if the federal government continues to ignore Alberta's concerns, as it has for the past 10 years? First and foremost, we will not allow the status quo to continue. Albertans are proud Canadians who want a strong, united, and prosperous nation—but we will no longer tolerate having our industries threatened and our resources landlocked.

We've been boxed in, with limited access to markets beyond the U.S., and we've paid the price in time, cost, and uncertainty—much of it caused by federal policy. Even the new west coast pipeline, paid for by taxpayers, came at great cost.

In the weeks and months ahead:

- Albertans will have the opportunity to discuss our province's future, explore options to protect ourselves from future federal overreach, and choose a path forward.
- We want to hear directly from you—what matters to you, and how we can implement meaningful strategies.
- Our government will lead this process with the sincere hope of

securing a prosperous future for Alberta within a united Canada—one that respects our constitutional rights, enables resource development, and treats us as a valued partner in Confederation.

There was a special caucus meeting on May 2 to discuss these matters further. I've been receiving your calls and emails both before and after the federal election—please keep them coming. Your voices are being heard in the boardrooms where decisions are made.

I strongly believe in nation-building. I believe we must establish corridors from Alberta to Hudson Bay, the Arctic, and the Pacific. This is essential for responsible development and long-term growth. Alberta has a critical role to play in building a resilient Northwest Canada—an integral part of Fortress North America.

We can do this. We must do this. And if the federal government won't help, the least they can do is stop standing in the way. But we must also agree that we will no longer tolerate obstruction. We've seen what the last 10 years have brought, and we won't accept more of the same for another four.

I hope you have a great week. Keep the faith, keep pushing forward, and know that I'll continue doing everything I can to voice what matters to you.

Stay strong. Stay free.

PARKLAND RCMP ARREST INDIVIDUALS IN RELATION TO AN ARMED ROBBERY AND CRIME SPREE

On Feb. 24, 2025 in the area of Wabamun, two individuals were attempting to steal a truck outside of a local business. When confronted one of the individuals pointed a firearm at the owner of the truck before both individuals fled the area in what was later determined to be another stolen vehicle.

In the early morning of Feb. 26, 2025 in the area of Spruce Grove an individual attempted to steal a vehicle parked in a driveway with a youth inside. The parent of the youth confronted this individual, entered the

moving vehicle and struggled with the individual until they stopped the vehicle and fled the scene.

Following an extensive investigation by the Parkland RCMP which included the execution of several search warrants in the Parkland and Edmonton area the individuals were identified.

As a result of this investigation Kalob Kochanowsky(25), a resident of Edmonton was charged with the following:

- Robbery with a firearm;
- Using a firearm in the commission of an offence;
- Pointing a firearm;

• Possession of a weapon contrary to an order;

- Operating a conveyance while prohibited;
- Possession of property obtained by crime over \$5,000.

Kochanowsky was taken before a Justice of the Peace and remanded into custody, his next court date is scheduled for May 20, 2025 at the Alberta Court of Justice in Stony Plain.

As well a youth, a 17-year-old male resident of Parkland County who cannot be named under the Youth Criminal Justice Act, has been charged with the following:

- Robbery with a

firearm;

- Robbery;
- Abduction;
- Possession of property obtained by crime over \$5,000.

The youth was taken before a Justice of the Peace and remanded into custody, his next court date is scheduled for May 21, 2025, at the Alberta Court of Justice in Stony Plain.

"This investigation was a priority and we will continue to dedicate significant resources to stop violent offenders who jeopardize public safety" said Inspector Kevin McGillivray the Detachment Commander of the Parkland RCMP.

ARMY CADET NEWS

Close to five years in the planning stage, but the citizenship trip of a lifetime was finally able to happen for the senior cadets of 3053 RCACC as they travelled to our nation's capital! From March 30th to April 4th we would have a very busy and hectic schedule in Ottawa and area.

4 am on March 30th had everyone excitedly meet at the airport to catch our flight to Toronto departing at 6am. For a couple of our cadets this was their first time on an airplane! During our layover we had lunch at the Maple Leaf Lounge before continuing onto Ottawa. Our 3 rental cars then transported everyone to CFB Connaught Range and Training Area where the barracks would be our base during this tour.

Day #1 had us heading to the Department of National Defence Headquarters at Carling Campus. We were given a guided tour of the Military Police station and their equipment, which the cadets really enjoyed. Then drove back to Connaught for a hands-on demonstration by members of the CF Protective Services Unit, again the cadets were excited by this experience. Following a quick return back to our quarters for a change into our dress uniforms followed by a speedy lunch at Subway, we now began a more solemn part of our trip. We went back to DND HQ for a tour of the national Afghanistan Memorial Hall. This was a very emotional experience to view this beautifully designed building which only opened in 2019 to house the original Kandahar cenotaph and all the memorial plaques to the fallen of that mission. Truly a moving time that most Canadian citizens don't get to experience since it is located on secure DND property and only available to view by appointment. I'm glad our cadets were able to experience. Following supper at the Connaught mess, we went to the pool for a public swim to relax and prepare for the next day.

Day #2 our first site to view was the RCMP Musical Ride

stables. This is where the horses and riders learn to become teammates and form part of the world famous troop. It was very interesting to learn all the hard work of man/woman and animal involved in the Musical Ride that everyone loves. The afternoon had us travelling down the highway to Carp, Ontario where the "Diefenbunker" and museum is located. With my love of history, I found this tour very informative. Although the reasons for this bunker being built during the height of the Cold War is somewhat frightening; it still was quite an eye-opener for our cadets who were not even born when this facility was eventually closed. After supper the cadets went to the gym for an hour before getting their uniforms ready for tomorrow's adventure.

Day #3 early morning to travel the 100kms to Petawawa Garrison to tour 450 Sqn; everything from SIM's, tour of the Chinook helicopter up close and getting to experience Night Vision Goggles that the aircrew use...CWO Bear even stopped at the mess during lunch to say hi...then took the cadets on the flightline to watch a Chinook run up... Returned home tired just as the snow started to fall.

Day #4 Woke up this morning to -4c and some snow (but more slush) from last night's storm, but by supper time the weather was very windy and the temperature hit 15c!! Crazy temperature fluctuations are common here I was informed.

Headed up the road to the RCMP ERT (Emergency Response Team) training centre in Orleans. Because of the nature of their job, we were not allowed to take any photos except of their very old armoured car since the detachment will be getting a new response vehicle shortly. In the afternoon we were booked for a guided tour at Rideau Hall but with heavy traffic and no parking available, we sadly missed the tour and had to be satisfied with walking the grounds. We saw a wild turkey run past the front door of the Governor-General's residence and many trees on the grounds with pails attached and collecting sap.

From there we drove to the

Parliament Building and had an interesting guided tour of the place where the MPs currently meet due to construction. I hadn't realized that most of the building has been under intensive renovations the last few years and are expected to last another dozen years before completion! It was weird to see parts of the outside original building now inside and covered with a large roof. We saw the House of Commons and all the seats that hold our elected members plus the viewing gallery. Was interesting to see all the portraits of former Prime Ministers that have been moved from their original locations to this new hallway in this building. The temporary room that contains the Books of Remembrance (normally in the Centre Block under the Peace Tower), although just locked while we were on our tour, we asked Security if they would unlock it for us to go inside and give our respect. Fortunately they agreed and came back and allowed us 15 minutes to view the open pages with the names of Canadians who had given their lives in the service of Canada since the War of 1812. Definitely MY highlight of the day! Tonight we are packing our suitcases as we leave Connaught barracks for a bit more sightseeing in Ottawa before we leave for Alberta the next evening.

Day #5 Would be a very long day as we first cleaned our barrack rooms after breakfast and then left Connaught for the trip to the national War Museum. But first we made a quick detour to the city centre for a stop at the National War Memorial and the Tomb of the unknown Soldier. Very solemn couple minutes but I loved that our cadets and staff were able to give their respect. Then to the War Museum for lunch at the cafeteria and only a couple hours of viewing; I could have spent all day at that remarkable place! Truly a 1st class museum to honour our military throughout the country's history. A few important items

we viewed were Hitler's car, Sir Isaac Brock's death tunic, Billy Bishop's fighter plane, armoured vehicles and the timely Vimy Ridge story (since this was Vimy Ridge week while we were there). After changing out of our dress uniforms into civvies, we rushed to the airport to catch our flight to Calgary. At least a 20 minute delay before departing Ottawa made for an anxious trip to catch the connecting flight to Edmonton! Luckily 1/3 of the passengers on this flight needed to get north so they held the plane for us. However once in YEG, there was mechanical difficulties with the unloading dock and we again had to wait 20+ minutes before disembarking just before midnight.

A welcoming group of parents were waiting patiently. To the couple cadets that had never flown before, I told them they were lucky to have travelled on 3 different aircrafts and seen 4 airports all in 1 trip!

This trip was truly remarkable and I hope the cadets will remember it forever. BUT It could not have happened without the Cadet Parent Committee raising the required funds over the years and to Sgt Jew and Captain Cooper's hard work to plan, organize and do the required paperwork for HQ authorization.

ALBERTA RCMP COMMUNITY RESPONSE TEAM TOGETHER WITH ASSISTING UNITS SEIZE FIREARM AND DRUGS

On April 22, 2025, your Alberta RCMP Community Response Team, with assistance from Alberta RCMP Police Dog Services, Parkland RCMP, and Parkland RCMP Drug Unit, located a stolen Dodge Ram in Stony Plain. During the course of the investigation, police searched the stolen vehicle and the surrounding area, resulting in the seizure of:

- 6.8 grams of Fentanyl;
- 3.5 grams of Methamphetamine;
- One Bolt Action Rifle;

- Ammunition; and
- Stolen License plate.

Alicia Flahr (31), a resident of Entwistle, Alta., and Kevin Loughran (35), a resident of Sturgeon County, Alta., were jointly charged with:

- Possession of Stolen Property;
- Possession of Fentanyl;
- Possession of Methamphetamine;
- Possession of a Firearm without being the holder of a licence;
- Possession of a Firearm knowing that they were without the holder of a licence;
- Possession of a

Firearm in a Motor Vehicle; and

- Possession of a Weapon Dangerous to the Public.

In addition, Flahr was charged with:

- Fail to Comply with a Release Order.

And Loughran was charged with:

- Possession of a Firearm while Prohibited to Possess; and
- Operate Motor Vehicle while prohibited from doing so.

Flahr was remanded into custody and appeared in Alberta Court of Justice in Stony Plain on April 28, 2025. Loughran was remanded into custody and

appeared in Alberta Court of Justice in Stony Plain on April 30, 2025.
