

have consistently voiced frustration that excessive red tape is creating unnecessary barriers to development and slowing down the delivery of sand and gravel to market.

To dig into these concerns and build a more efficient path forward, Alberta's government is launching the Sand and Gravel Task Force. 





# CONFIRMED CASE OF MEASLES PROMPTS PUBLIC ALERT TO POTENTIAL EXPOSURES

Submitted by Alberta Health Services

Alberta Health Services (AHS) has been notified of a person with confirmed measles in the Edmonton Zone who has been in a public setting while infectious. Additional locations

Individuals who were in the following location during the specified dates and times may have been exposed to measles:

Connect Care Medical Clinic, Spruce Grove (20 Westwind Drive, #215) Exposure time period:

May 16: Exposure time: Approx. 8:45 a.m. - 1 p.m. (MDT)

Anyone who attended this location at these times, who was born in or after 1970 and has less than two documented doses of measles-containing vaccine, may be at risk for developing measles. They should self-monitor for symptoms of measles and are strongly encouraged to review their immunization records.

Measles is an extremely contagious disease

and the virus spreads easily through the air. Symptoms of measles include:

- Fever of 38.3° C or higher; and
- Cough, runny nose and/or red eyes; and
- A rash that appears 3 to 7 days after fever starts, usually beginning behind the ears and on the face and spreading down to the body and then to the arms and legs. The rash appears red and blotchy on lighter skin colours. On darker skin colours, it can appear purple or darker than the skin around it, or it might be hard to see.

Complications of measles can include ear infections, pneumonia, inflammation of the brain, premature delivery, and rarely death. Persons who are pregnant, less than 5 years of age, or have weakened immune systems are at greatest risk.

If symptoms of measles do develop, individuals are advised to stay home and call the measles hotline at 1-844-944-3434 before visiting any healthcare facility or provider, including a family physician clinic or pharmacy.

Measles vaccine is highly effective at preventing infection and complications. In Alberta, measles vaccine is offered, free of charge, through Alberta's publicly funded immunization program. The recommended schedule for measles vaccination is two doses, the first at one year of age and the second at 18 months.

If you think you have been

exposed, and you are not protected against measles you may be able to receive immunization to reduce the risk of infection. A dose of vaccine needs to be given within 72 hours of exposure to prevent measles. Babies under 1 year of age, people with severely weakened immune systems, and those who are pregnant may be able to receive immunoglobulin within 6 days of exposure to prevent disease. Call the measles hotline at 1-844-944-3434 for more information if these situations apply to you or your family.

Albertans uncertain of their immunization history, or their child's immunization history, can check eligibility and/or book an appointment by calling the measles hotline at 1-844-944-3434.

Individuals who are 14 years of age and older can check their My Health Record.

The measles hotline connects you to a professional who can assist with accessing your immunization records or offer general information; provide advice for those experiencing measles symptoms and are feeling unwell; and assist with booking measles immunization appointments or locating a public health clinic offering immunization in your area.



### ALBERTA RCMP ENCOURAGES FAMILIES TO DISCUSS PERSONAL SAFETY WITH CHILDREN

Submitted by Alberta RCMP

With the arrival of warmer weather and longer days, kids are spending more time outside—whether walking to a friend's house, heading to the park, or just enjoying the outdoors. Your Alberta RCMP is reminding parents and guardians that this is a good time to check in with children about staying safe and being aware of their environment.

Building confidence in children to recognize unsafe situations and trust their instincts is one of the best ways to help keep them safe. Having open, age-appropriate conversations about boundaries, decision-making, and what to do when something feels wrong can go a long way in preparing kids for real-life scenarios.

To support families in the community with these important conversations, the Alberta RCMP is sharing a list of tips that parents and caregivers can review with their children:

- Remind kids never to go anywhere with someone they don't know. Even if a stranger seems nice or asks for help, they should walk away and seek help from someone they trust.
- Let your child know that no adult should ever ask them to do something that makes them feel uneasy. It's okay to say no and remove themselves from the situation.
- If something doesn't sit right—even if they can't explain why—children should be encouraged to leave and talk to a trusted adult as soon as they can.

- Teach kids to check in with a parent or caregiver before accepting anything or going anywhere, especially if it involves someone unfamiliar.
- Help them identify safe adults they can approach if they feel unsure, like a teacher, neighbour, or family member
- Consider setting up a family password. If someone other than you needs to pick up your child unexpectedly, they should know the agreed-upon word
- Encourage kids to stick with friends or siblings when walking or playing outside—there's always greater safety in numbers.
- Walk or bike common routes with your child and point out safe locations they can go to if they need help.

- If your child has a phone, make use of family location features available on most smartphones, like Apple's Family Sharing or Google Family Link.
- Go over how to use emergency call functions and make sure they know their full name, address, your contact info, and how to describe their location to 911 if needed.
- Run through some "what would you do if..." situations with your child to help them think through different safety scenarios.




