### Whitecourt RCMP Concludes Several Investigations And Arrests Prolific Offenders

Whitecourt RCMP General Investigation Section and Alberta RCMP Auto Theft North Division, executed a search warrant at the residence and shop linked to the driver. A plethora of tools were seized as well as several stolen vehicles, a side by side and a trailer.

As a result of the investigation, Joshua Carter (32), a resident of Whitecourt and a prolific offender in the area, was charged with Traffic Safety Act violations as well as the following Criminal Code offences:

oPossession of property obtained by crime over \$5000;

oPossession of property obtained by crime under \$5000 (x2); oPossession of property obtained by crime for the purpose of

trafficking under \$5000; oFlight from police; and

oFailure to comply with court orders (x2).

Carter was brought before a justice of the peace and released on

conditions. He is to appear before the Alberta Court of Justice in Whitecourt on June 24, 2025.

•On June 6, 2025, Whitecourt RCMP and Whitecourt General Investigation Section (GIS), located and arrested Chad Clark (32), a resident of Whitecourt, for outstanding warrants from both Whitecourt and Mayerthorpe, Alta. The combined warrants included a total of 20 Criminal Code charges from both areas. Clark is a prolific offender in both the Whitecourt and Mayerthorpe areas. Clark was brought before a justice of the peace and remanded into custody. He is to appear before the Alberta Court of Justice in Whitecourt on June 24, 2025.

•On June 6, 2025, Whitecourt RCMP received a complaint involving a suspicious vehicle driving down a dead-end road towards an oilfield lease site. Whitecourt RCMP members located the suspect vehicle, which proceeded to flee. The suspect, identified as Michael Bergeson (36), a resident of Whitecourt, was later arrested and charged with two counts of Failure to comply with release order conditions. Bergeson was brought before a justice of the peace and remanded into custody. He is to appear before the Alberta Court of Justice in Whitecourt on June 24, 2025.

"I think it is important for us, your Whitecourt RCMP, to share

our successes and better communicate with you, our community" said S/Sgt. Matthew Clarke, Detachment Commander of the Whitecourt RCMP. "We want you to understand that we hear your concerns and are actively working towards making you feel safer within the community and making sure you have a voice when it comes to policing needs".

#### EXPECT TO ENCOUNTER WEED INSPECTORS THIS SUMMER LSAC.ca/weeds

If you see County weed inspectors in your area, they are visiting every property to check for novious weeds identified by the provincial Weed Control Act. If they find novious weeds, a weed inspection report may be mailed to the fandowner.

Under the provincial Weed Control Act, County weed inspectors have the appointed authority to enter any private property to monitor for noxious and prohibited noxious weeds and enforce compliance with the Act.

The purpose of this program is to educate and inform property owners about regulated weeds found on their land. In-person visits are conducted to provide the most effective guidance and support.

#### Here's how it works:

 Initial Contact: The inspector will attempt to contact you in person at your residence. This allows us to introduce ourselves and explain our process.

 No Response: If you are not home, they will leave a door knocker card with a date range for their return visit and contact information for any questions you may have and to book an inspection appointment.
 Inspection: On their return, the inspector may enter the property to check for noxious and prohibited noxious weeds, inspectors will not go past closed gates or enter areas with livestock or crop without parmission.


Please note, under the Weed Control Act, it is illegal to willfully obstruct or delay an inspector in their duties.





Due to elevated levels of fecal bacteria currently present in the water at Allan Beach on Hubbles Lake, located within the Edmonton Zone of Alberta Health Services (AHS), AHS is advising the public not to swim or wade at this beach area, effective immediately.

Elevated levels of fecal bacteria were detected via testing of the lake water at the Allan Beach location. At current levels, gastrointestinal illness may result from ingestion of the water at Allan Beach on Hubbles Lake. As well, there is the possibility of skin, ear and eye infections with water contact.

As always, visitors and residents are reminded to never drink or cook with untreated water directly from any lake or reservoir, at any time.
