The first immigrant families in the area were served by various missionaries or circuit priests who spoke the Ukrainian language. For very special occasions, such as the blessing of the Easter bread "paska", baptisms or marriages, many traveled to Edmonton for their church needs.

As more Ukrainians settled in the Onoway area, the leading members agreed that a parish of their own should be organized. A dedicated group was formed in 1942 and people were elected to further the church interest of Onoway and District Canadian Ukrainians. Elected were: Karpo Yaroschuk, Dennis Nemenko and Nicolia Hreneshyn. They established priorities and a decision was made that the most urgent need was the purchase of land for a cemetery and that a church would be built when sufficient funds were pledged by the membership. A committee of three, Stan Koziar, John Shabada and Andrew Wengreniuk,

was elected to find and purchase suitable land.

On April 12, 1943 four acres of land north of Onoway were purchased for \$40.00. Plans were quickly underway to build a church and an intensive membership drive was undertaken to support the proposed building.

There were approximately 40 Ukrainian families who either pledged labour or financial support. Some names you may recognize include: Karpo Yaroschuk, Peter Yanchar, Roman Shabada, Alex Shabada, Peter Shabada, Paul Shabada, William Shabada, Nick Shulak, John Shulak, Steve Shulak, O. Derechy, John Bakan, Dennis Nemenko, Mike Storenchuk, N. Hre-

neshyn, P. Lewoniuk, Anani (Emil) Borys, Bill Koziar, Sam Koziar, Alex Koziar, John Shelenko, Phillip Tyschuk, Bill Tyschuk, Jim Tyschuk, John Tyschuk, Mark Omelchuk, Fred Antoniuk, John Antoniuk, Andrew Wengreniuk, C. Rocko, Paul Yanda, Bill Melenka and Bill Sawka. (The Church organization apologizes for any names that may have been omitted.)

The construction of a very modest building was underway; however, during the actual construction, the Roman Shabada family made a very generous donation in memory of their son, Peter, who had passed away. This enabled the final addition to be built on the church, which now serves as the al-

tar.

Bill Tyschuk donated a very large amount of lumber, which was greatly appreciated. Almost all the interior furnishings such as vestments, crosses, holy pictures, Bibles, icons, candelabras and other church artifacts were donations of numerous members of the church over the years.

On April 8, 1950 the newly elected church executive was instructed by memberships to plan for the blessing and opening of the church. Elected were Andrew Wengreniuk (president), Nick Shulak (vice president), Alex Shabada (secretary) and Peter Shabada (treasurer). The financial control

BLUE-GREEN ALGAE ADVISORY ISSUED FOR LESSARD LAKE absca/eph

Alberta Health Services has issued a public health advisory following the detection of a blue-green algae (cyanobacteria) bloom in areas of Lessard Lake. Residents living near the shores, as well as visitors to the area, are advised to take the following precautions:

- Avoid all contact with algae blooms. If contact occurs, wash with tap water as soon as possible.
- Do not swim or wade, or allow your pets to swim or wade, in any areas where algae is visible.
- Do not feed whole fish or fish trimmings from this lake to your pets.
- Consider limiting human consumption of whole fish and fish trimmings from this lake, as it is known that fish may store toxins in their liver. (People can safely consume fish fillets from this lake).
- Do not use water contaminated with cyanobacteria to water edible plants. This is particularly
 important for plants with edible parts exposed to the ground surface (such as cabbage, lettuce,
 tomatoes, and other salad vegetables).

committee was Alex Koziar and Peter Yanchar, white Phillip Tyschuk and John Shelenko made up the church welcome com-



mittee.

Although the church was not fully completed, the first service was celebrated on Sunday, July 14, 1950. Reverend Ambrose Chrustanka blessed the church in the names of the Patron Saints Peter and Paul. Words cannot express the joy of all present as they participated in the first service of their new church, in their native language.

For decades, yearly services were held for Ukrainian Easter, Prasnak (celebration in July for the Feast of St. Peter and St. Paul) and Thanksgiving. The celebration in July brought out many former members from Edmonton

and the surrounding area. It remains a wonderful service followed by the blessing of the graves and potluck lunch & fellowship. Of course, the church has also been used over the years for weddings, funerals, vow renewals and baptisms.

For 75 years, maintenance of both the grounds and the church has been kept up by the volunteer efforts of the congregation. To this date, the church is heated by a wood stove and lit by candles.

The church bell had been missing for several years and was recovered in the Rich Valley area, discovered by a grader operator. It was refurbished and stood proudly again for decades, only to be stolen in the summer of 2022 along with the church contents. The precious bell and sentimental artifacts remain unrecovered.

This little church continues to serve as a place of worship, but also stands as a monument to the Ukrainian pioneers who, in their wisdom, saw not only a need for their own spiritual development, but also a heritage to be left for the younger generation.

PARKLAND RCMP ARREST MALE ENGAGING IN CRIMINAL FLIGHT AND STEALING A MOTOR VEHICLE

On June 2, 2025 at in the area of Stony Plain an RCMP member out on patrol observed a silver Ford F250 leaving a local Mc-Donalds at a high rate of speed, when the member attempted a traffic stop the vehicle fled. With the assistance of Edmonton Police Air Services the F250 was located parked in a residential area of Stony Plain and another traffic stop was attempted, again the F250 fled at a high rate of speed, to avoid any risk to the public, members did not pursue.

The F250 was observed driving at high rates of speed, crossing medians, driving the wrong way on the road and nearly colliding with civilian and police vehicles.

At approximately 3:00 a.m. on June 2, 202,5 in the area of Spruce Grove the F250 stalled and the

suspect driver exited the vehicle, entered a nearby truck and attempted to steal it. At this time RCMP officers were able to move in and arrest the suspect who resisted arrest.

The suspect was transported to a nearby hospital where he was assessed and released back into the custody of the RCMP.

As a result of this investigation the suspect was identified as Colter Trynchy, a resident of Spruce Grove, who was charged with the following:

- Flight from Police;
- Dangerous operation of a motor vehicle;
- Theft of motor vehicle;
- Resist / Obstruct a Peace Officer:
- Operating a vehicle while prohibited.

Trnychy was taken before a Justice of the Peace and remanded into custody, his next court date is scheduled for June 11, 2025, at the Alberta Court of Justice in Stony Plain.

"The Parkland RCMP is committed to keeping our community safe, we would like to thank Edmonton Police air services for their assistance in this investigation" said Inspector Kevin McGillivray, the Detachment Commander of the Parkland RCMP.

WHITECOURT RCMP CONDUCTS ARRESTS FOLLOWING ERRATIC DRIVING COMPLAINTS

On June 4, 2025, White-court RCMP received a complaint involving an erratic driver in the town of Whitecourt. Whitecourt RCMP, with assistance from Alberta RCMP Traffic - Whitecourt Unit and

Whitecourt RCMP General Investigation Section (GIS), located the suspect vehicle and conducted the arrest of the two individuals within. A search of the vehicle incidental to arrest revealed a loaded firearm.

Two individuals were charged with Criminal Code offences, Traffic Safety Act Offences, and Alberta Gaming and Liquor Act offences, namely the following:

• Joshua Carter (32), a resident of Whitecourt, was charged with several Traffic Safety Act and Alberta Gaming and Liquor Act offences, as well as the following Criminal Code and Excise act charges:

- o Failure to comply with court orders (x3);
- o Failure to comply with Peace Bond;
- o Possession of a weapon for a dangerous purpose;
- o Other firearm-related offences (x5); and
- o Possession of unstamped tobacco.
- Taylor Clarke (33), a resident of Fox Creek, Alta., was charged with:
- o Careless use of a firearm:
- o Possession of a firearm inside a motor vehicle;
- o Possession of a firearm knowing its possession is unauthorized;
- o Possession of a weapon for a dangerous purpose; and
- o Possession of unstamped tobacco.

Carter and Clarke were brought before a justice of the peace. Carter was remanded into custody while Clarke was released on conditions. Both Carter and Clarke are set to appear before the Alberta Court of Justice in Whitecourt on June 24, 2025.

"I would like to thank the public for taking the time to call the Whitecourt RCMP regarding this incident" said S/Sgt. Matthew Clarke, Detachment Commander of the Whitecourt RCMP. "You. as members of the community, are most often the first to notice anything suspicious or any criminal activity. We would like to keep encouraging this behaviour as it allows us to better protect the community as a whole".

\$14.8 MILLION PROVINCIAL INVESTMENT STRENGTHENS WASTEWATER INFRASTRUCTURE AND WATERSHED PROTECTION IN LAC STE. ANNE REGION

The Danwell and North 43 Lagoon Commissions are celebrating a major step forward in rural infrastructure and environmental protection thanks to a \$14.8 million investment from the Government of Alberta through its Water for Life program.

Announced today alongside MLA Shane Getson (Lac Ste. Anne–Parkland), the grant will fund 90% of a major transmission line project connecting the Darwell Lagoon to the Tri-Village area, the North 43 Lagoon, and onward to the Northeast Lagoon. This system expansion will ensure long-term capacity, protect local watersheds, and support future community growth.

This \$14.8 million investment builds on more than \$11 million previously committed to lagoon and wastewater infrastructure in the region—bringing the total provincial support to over \$25 million.

The project serves the municipalities of Lac Ste. Anne County, and the Summer Villages of Silver Sands, South View, Castle Island, Yellowstone, and Ross Haven. With both the Darwell and North 43 lagoon systems nearing capacity, this critical infrastructure project comes at the right time—and at a fraction of the cost of other alternatives.

"Our government understands that rural Alberta needs reliable, sustainable infrastructure that keeps costs down and environmental protection front and centre," said MLA Shane Getson, "This is exactly what the Water for Life program is meant to do."

"This is a smart investment for our region. With 90% of the funding coming from the province, we're able to build a long-term solution for a fraction of the cost. Instead of spending \$10 million or more on expanding two lagoon systems, this single transmission line project costs local municipalities about \$4 million—and sets us up for the future." stated Joe Blakeman, Reeve of Lac Ste. Anne County and Chair of the Darwell Lagoon Commission.

"This is about planning ahead, not playing catch-up," said Councillor Lorne Olsvik, Chair of the North 43 Lagoon Commission. "We're growing, and this project gives us the long-term solution we need while protecting our lakes, landowners, and recreational areas."

The completed transmission line will reduce the environmental impact of effluent discharge in the Sturgeon watershed, helping safeguard water quality for nearby communities, agriculture, and recreation users. It also reflects a collaborative approach to shared infrastructure that is both cost-effective and future-focused.

The Darwell and North 43 Lagoon Commissions expressed their sincere appreciation to Minister Devin Dreeshen, MLA Getson, and the Province of Alberta for recognizing the urgency of this investment.




