TRANSFORMING DISABILITY INCOME SUPPORT IN ALBERTA

Submitted by Government of Canada

Albertans are invited to share their feedback to help shape the Alberta Disability Assistance Program.

Albertans with disabilities and the organizations that support them have made it clear they want supports that meet their unique needs and abilities, rather than the one-size-fits-all approach currently offered by the Assured Income for the Severely Handicapped (AISH) program. They have stressed the importance of providing pathways to employment for those who can work but still need supports.

In January 2025, Alberta's government announced plans for the new Alberta Disability Assistance Program (ADAP), which will be offered in addition to AISH and will empower Albertans with dis-

abilities to pursue fulfilling job opportunities while continuing to receive the supports they need.

ADAP will allow for the highest income while receiving benefits, meaning Albertans on ADAP can earn more from working while continuing to receive their financial benefits. In addition, Albertans on ADAP will also be able to receive the health benefits they need, regardless of their employment income. Through ADAP, Albertans with disabilities will not only receive the financial and health benefits they rely on, they will also have access to the employment resources they need to gain new skills and work to their full potential.

"People with disabilities shouldn't have to choose between getting the support they need and having the opportunity to pursue a meaningful career."

That's why we're introducing the new Alberta Disability Assistance Program – so Albertans with disabilities aren't punished for getting a job. We've heard loud and clear that this is an important step, and we're grateful for the engagement from Albertans to help us get this right."

- program eligibility
 - applications, adjudication and appeals
 - benefits, income and asset exemptions
 - employment supports and expectations
 - client transitions
- Engagement will be held

throughout August and into September:

- Aug. 13 to Sept. 12: A public survey will be open at alberta.ca/alberta-disability-assistance-program-engagement.

- Aug. 13 to Sept. 12: A discussion guide will be available in pdf and video formats for Albertans to review and provide feedback online or via mail.

- Early September: Public telephone town halls will provide Albertans with more information about ADAP and answer questions. Dates and times for the townhalls will be posted on alberta.ca/alberta-disability-assistance-program-engagement and on YourAlberta social media channels.

- Early September: Roundtable engagement sessions with disability service providers and advocacy organizations.

Child advocacy centres bring together law enforcement agencies and community partners in a child-friendly environment to provide services such as mental health, medical and legal supports to children and youth who experience physical, emotional or sexual abuse and/or neglect.

With eight provincially funded centres located in communities including Fort McMurray, Grande Prairie, Edmonton, Lloydminster, Red Deer, Calgary, Lethbridge and Medicine Hat, this funding will help support more children and youth across the province on their healing journey.

"As our community's re-

sponse to child abuse, the Zebra Centre supports more than 4,000 children and youth every year. Our multi-disciplinary team works together within the Zebra Centre to deliver essential services and supports, and the Ministry of Children and Family Services is a core partner in this important work."

STOPPING FAMILY VIOLENCE BEFORE IT STARTS

Submitted by Government of Alberta

Alberta's government is supporting 31 community-based projects to prevent family violence across the province.

Family violence has devastating impacts and Alberta's government is committed to investing in strategies to promote healthy relationships and support individuals who have experienced family violence. That's why Alberta's government is investing \$4 million this year in 29 agencies offering 31 projects focused on addressing the root causes of family violence.

The funded initiatives are helping teach family violence prevention strategies and fostering healthy relationships through various approaches including educational training, sports programs, mentorship, support groups, and connections to other services and more. The funded agencies work with Indigenous Peoples and vulnerable groups and communities in Alberta, including men and boys, people with disabilities, 2SLGBTQIA+ individuals, rural and remote regions and newcomers and refugees.

"Everyone deserves to feel safe in their own home and community. By giving families the support and skills they need, we can prevent violence before it starts and help build healthy relationships. I am proud to support initiatives and projects that bring hope, healing and lasting change. Together, we can break the cycle and create a future free from family violence in Alberta."

The funding is being provided through two grant programs launched in January – \$2 million through the Prevention Grant Program and \$2 million through the invitational Indigenous-led Approaches to Family Violence Prevention Program.

ed by the National Action Plan to End Gender-Based Violence, builds on the recent release of Building on our Strengths, Alberta's 10-Year Strategy to End Gender-Based Violence, which outlines how the province will work to prevent gender-based violence, support those impacted and ensure those committing these

Purpose of the proposed Bylaws

Parkland County Council will consider applications to amend the Highvale End Land Use Area Structure Plan (Bylaw 2016-12) and the County's Land Use Bylaw (Bylaw 2025-12). The purpose of the amendments is to allow Data Processing Facility uses in proximity to the existing Sundance and Keephills Power Generating Stations.

Hearing Procedure

This is a formal Public Hearing and Council is prepared to hear and receive formal submissions and presentations (verbal or written) from those who wish to speak to the proposed Bylaws. Written submissions or presentations may be submitted in advance to Legislative Services by **12:00 p.m. on August 27, 2025**, or submitted at the commencement of the **Public Hearing on September 3 with continuation, if necessary, on September 4, and 5, 2025**.

Anyone wishing to make a verbal presentation to Council must notify governanceagendas@parklandcounty.com in advance of the Public Hearing by **12:00 p.m. on August 27, 2025**. Verbal presentations at the Public Hearing will be limited to a maximum of 10 minutes. Anyone wishing to make a verbal presentation who has not made prior arrangements may be allocated a time at the commencement of the Public Hearing. Council advises that this is your last opportunity to comment on the proposed Bylaws as Council is unable to receive further submissions after the Public Hearing is closed.

MEASLES: WHO IS AT RISK AND HOW DOES IT SPREAD?

Measles cases are increasing globally, with numerous countries and travel destinations reporting outbreaks including the United States and Europe. Cases have been identified recently in several Canadian provinces, including Alberta, with clusters of high numbers, particularly in Southern, Central and parts of Northern Alberta, impacting babies, children and adults.

What is measles?

Measles is a virus that is extremely contagious and spreads easily through the air when someone who has measles coughs, sneezes, yells, sings, and breathes. You can get measles just by passing through a room or location where a person who is infected was up to 2 hours before. Measles is sometimes called rubeola or red measles.

Measles tends to be more severe in children younger than 5 years, adults, people who are pregnant, and people with weak immune systems.

What are the symptoms?

Symptoms of measles can

include a fever of 38.3°C or higher, cough, runny nose, or red eyes and a rash that appears 3 to 7 days after fever starts, usually beginning behind the ears and on the face and spreading down to the body and then to the arms and legs. The rash appears red and blotchy on lighter skin colours. On darker skin colours, it can appear purple or darker than the skin around it, or it might be hard to see.

If you or your child is showing symptoms of measles, stay at home, avoid contact with others, and call Health Link at 811 before visiting any hospital, clinic, or healthcare provider.

Measles can be dangerous

Measles can cause significant health complications including respiratory failure, swelling of the brain and death. Individuals who recover from measles can live with long-term impacts including blindness, deafness and permanent neurological effects.

Prevent the spread

There are things you can do to prevent getting sick and to protect others: Get your measles immuniza-

tions, stay home when feeling sick and avoid close contact with people who are sick.

The best protection against measles is to ensure you are up to date with your immunizations.

Children in Alberta typically receive their first dose of measles-containing vaccine at 12 months of age, and their second dose at 18 months of age. Children who received 2 doses of vaccine are considered protected. The MMR-Var vaccine is given as part of Alberta’s routine immunization schedule for children and is free. It protects against measles, mumps, rubella, and chickenpox (varicella). The MMR vaccine is another free vaccine that protects against measles.

For pregnant individuals, if you are immune to measles, you will pass measles antibodies to your unborn child. This will give your baby some protection against measles, but this protection will disappear over time. Your baby will need their own measles vaccines to be protected.

To see if you are eligible to

get the vaccine, you can call the Immunization Booking Line at 811 between 8 a.m. and 6 p.m. if you live in the Calgary or Edmonton Zone. If you live in another zone in Alberta, contact your local public health or community health centre.

If you have any questions about measles or immunizations, please contact a primary care provider including your doctor, pharmacist, midwife, nurse practitioner, or public health nurse.

If you aren’t sure about your immunization history, check with your healthcare provider to make sure you’re protected against measles. You cannot get the measles vaccine while pregnant.
