

On Sept. 11, 2025, around 8:45 a.m., Drayton Valley RCMP received a report regarding a man who threatened to kill a mem-

ber of the public as well as RCMP members should they get involved. Drayton Valley RCMP obtained information confirming that the suspect had access to firearms and ensured that the victim was somewhere

safe. Warrants were obtained and Alberta RCMP Emergency Response Team (ERT), as well as Police Dog Services (PDS), were called in to assist.

of the warrants, the suspect fled the scene. Attempts to locate the suspect were conducted by Drayton Valley RCMP, Alberta RCMP ERT and PDS. While the search was ongoing, Wetaskiwin RCMP located a suspicious vehicle, later discovered to be stolen. Further investigation resulted in identifying and ar-

resting the suspect.

The search of the residence revealed an open gun safe containing four imitation firearms.

As a result of the investigation, Shane Curtis Seely (35), a resident of Drayton Valley, was charged with:

- Uttering threats (x2);
- Uttering threats towards police;
- Possession of sto-

len property over \$5000; and

- Robbery.

Seely was brought before a justice of the peace and remanded into custody. He is to appear before the Alberta Court of Justice in Drayton Valley on Sept. 16, 2025.

"I want to take the opportunity to thank the various units and detachments who came together to assist on this file" said S/Sgt.

Ryan Hoetmer, Detachment Commander of the Drayton Valley RCMP. "This just goes to show the resources and the reach that your Alberta RCMP has within the province and how, by being one police force, we can effectively communicate and coordinate, resulting in the arrest of those who would cause harm within our communities."

ALBERTA COMMUNITY RESPONSE TEAM CONDUCT TRAFFIC STOP WHICH LEADS TO DRUG SEIZURE

Your Alberta RCMP's Community Response Team and Evansburg RCMP conducted a traffic stop on Highway 16 near Evansburg which led to drugs being seized and two people arrested.

On Sept. 10, 2025, the Alberta Community Response Team conducted a traffic stop on a Jeep Cherokee for traffic offences. Police identified that the passenger

had outstanding warrants out of Edmonton Police Service for possession of stolen property. As a result of what was observed in the vehicle, police entered into a drug investigation and police located and seized the following:

- 11.8 Grams of Cocaine;
- 11.4 Grams of Methamphetamine;
- \$1500 Canadian Currency;
- Brass knuckles;

- Bear spray;
- Two scales.

Anthony Carleton, a 35-year-old male resident of Edmonton and Cheyenne Smith, a 29-year-old female resident of Edmonton were jointly charged with:

- Possession for the purpose of trafficking (x2);
- Possession of property obtained by crime; and,
- Possession of a weapon for a dangerous purpose (x2).

Anthony Carleton was held for a bail hearing and remanded into custody and is to appear in the Alberta Court of Justice in Edmonton on Sept. 12, 2025. Cheyenne Smith was held for a bail hearing and released on a release order and is to appear in the Alberta Court of Justice in Evansburg on Sept. 22, 2025.

Letter to the Editor

What would happen if Alberta became an independent country? Some members of our province seem to think of the possibility with great fervour, believing that all conditions would rapidly improve for them, that new freedoms could arise, and that all problems would diminish or cease to exist. What a wonderful opportunity, without having to deal with an entire federated family! An immediate permanent paradise!

Not so! Many difficulties must be overcome. Many obligations arise, both internal and foreign. Everything that is now Canadian national responsibility would become Alberta's, of course, in full. Perhaps the most immediate need would be to establish relationships with Canada. That would include border agreements (and security) over such things as water supply and travel and citizenships, trade agreements, shared costs like railway maintenance, establishment of a permanent embassy, removal of Alberta from all Canadian social security aspects, and formulation of a constitution for the new country, along with the multitude of laws to create it, of course. That is just to start - to

open the door, if you will.

Some new responsibilities would include Alberta's new judicial system and set of basic laws, a monetary system, a police system, an international relations commission, a pension plan, a social service and benefits package, development of an international credit rating, import/export regulations within and beyond Canada, compensation for Canadian buildings and investments within Alberta, and much more. And if Alberta has a hard time covering costs of education and health care now, what will it do when federal transfers are no longer helping?

How soon could Alberta start its own pension fund (with at most 17% of the CPP value, not an impossible and unrealistic 53%), and social security arrangements, its postal service, tax department, national police force, and so on? What arrangements could be made for those who do not wish to stay in the new country; perhaps transferring pension benefits (and investments) back to Canada? Negotiate pension transfers based on month by month contributions during a worker's lifetime? Many new departments would be needed.

How soon could Alberta start its own military? Thankfully, it

would be landlocked, so no navy is required, but can a five million population build and sustain a substantial army and airforce with all necessary equipment, or will contribution arrangements have to be made to sustain Canada's forces and NORAD and NATO?

How soon and at what cost could new currency be minted and foreign relations with multiple countries be negotiated? Might Alberta have to pay back the 35 billion or so dollars for the Trans Mountain pipeline it would surely want to keep? It must certainly renegotiate its passage to the coast! Would Alberta miss the involvements with G7? Would it envy Canada's participation in international games or discussions? Could it afford numerous ambassadors and embassy staff in countries with which we would trade? And more...

Those would be new Alberta National obligations. All current obligations like education, health programs, infrastructure, environmental protections, forest fire controls, and much more would still have to be maintained and planned for the future.

Of course, corporate taxes would soon have to rise to Canada's average, and royalty rates

would have to be increased on fossil fuels. Subsidies and deferrals for such things would have to end, and there will be no-one to blame for problems except Alberta's own government. Albertans will want to know why the Heritage Fund has barely grown while oil profits have boomed, why no balancing fund smoothed out the waves as oil prices rose and fell, what to do about taxes owed to municipalities, why professional workers left the province before the separation, why Alberta does not use more free green energy sources, why climate change is not considered worth studying, why vaccines cost more than anywhere else, and so on. Suddenly the answers must all come from Alberta's leaders without blaming elsewhere.

For those who think that joining the United States could be of benefit, remember that Alberta is about 11% of Canada's population, and would have far less influence as less than 1.5% of the United States IF that country even accepted Alberta as a state. As a territory, it would have even less than that.

ALBERTA FIRST TO ADD CITIZENSHIP TO LICENSES

Alberta is the first province to add a Canadian citizenship marker to driver's licences and ID cards, giving residents a single, secure card to access programs and services.

This fall, legislation will be introduced to implement the addition of Canadian citizenship status to Albertans' drivers licences or ID cards. This change is part of a broader initiative to give Albertans a single, secure document that confirms both identity and Canadian citizenship. By combining identity and citizenship on one document, Albertans will no longer need to carry multiple pieces of ID to access services.

Adding a Canadian citizen-

ship marker to Alberta's drivers licences will also strengthen Alberta's election system by helping ensure that only eligible citizens cast ballots, protecting the integrity of our democratic process. It also positions Alberta to respond quickly to future legislative changes and aligns with international standards.

"This is about more than convenience, it's about trust. With a single, secure card proving both identity and citizenship, Albertans will face fewer hurdles when applying for government services. This will also strengthen the integrity of elections and other systems that rely on proof of citizenship."

Currently, there are more than half a million more health care numbers registered than there are people living in Alberta, based on second quarter 2025 population estimates. Through this process, Alberta's government will be able to identify which health care cards continue to be actively in use and better understand why there is such a large discrepancy.

SAFETY A VITAL COMPONENT OF DIY PROJECTS

Many homeowners enjoy DIY projects around the house. Weekend warriors should recognize that having the right tools and using them in a correct manner is essential to successful, safe projects.

Tools are vital for projects, but without proper understanding and usage, they can cause grave injuries. Studies published by the Occupational Safety and Health Administration, the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention and the Consumer Product Safety Commission found that certain tools are more likely to cause injuries than others. Power nailers, for example, are among the most

dangerous tools DIYers can use. Chain saws, table saws, circular saws, and riding mowers are some additional tools that have very high injury rates.

The following are some safety guidelines all DIYers should heed when using power tools.

- Use tools that are the right size and right type for the job. If you are uncertain about which tools to use, watch online tutorials, contact tool manufacturers or seek advice at home supply stores.

- Always wear eye protection and the right safety equipment when manufacturers recommend doing so. Gloves, sturdy work boots, hearing

protection, and hard hats can protect DIYers from injury.

- Keep cutting tools sharp and in good condition to reduce kick back and potential injuries.

- Regularly inspect tools to make sure they are in working order.

- Never carry tools up a ladder by hand; use a bucket or bag to hoist tools.

- Never leave tools lying out in any area where they can present a hazard. Unplug power tools when not in use.

- Secure work with a clamp or vice grip when appropriate to keep things from slipping.

- Ensure that the handles of tools like hammers and axes fit tightly into the head of the

tool.

- Keep work environments tidy to avoid clutter, as cluttered workspaces can contribute to accidents.

- Read the manual and operate the power tool as instructed.

- Do not force open a safety on a power tool or modify a tool to override safety features.

- Cut away from yourself when using chisels and other edged tools.

Let common sense prevail when using tools. If it doesn't seem like a good idea, it probably isn't. Safety is important to avoid injuries and help prevent delays on the job.






