EVANSBURG RCMP NABS PROLIFIC OFFENDER

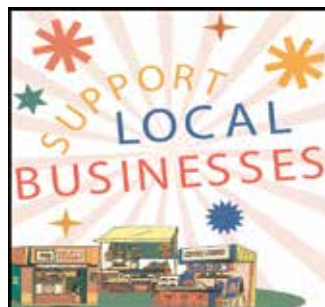

Evansburg RCMP Nabs Prolific Offender

Mayerthorpe RCMP, Drayton Valley RCMP, Parkland RCMP, all overseen by the Alberta RCMP Real Time Operation Center (RTOC). The vehicle was disabled, resulting in the suspect feeling on foot, to be tracked down by the Alberta RCMP Police Dog Services (PDS).

As a result of the investigation, Jesse Haarstad (32), of no fixed address, was arrested. Haarstad is not known to be from the area but has extensive criminal history in the Central Alberta area. Two arrest warrants, one out of Lacombe, Alta., and one out of Hinton, Alta., in relation to motor vehicle operation and possession of property obtained by crime, were executed as well.

For the incident of Oct. 15, 2025, Haarstad was charged with:

- Flight from police officer;
- Assault with a weapon on police officer;
- Dangerous operation of motor vehicle;
- Possession of property obtained by crime over \$5,000;
- Possess break in instruments;
- Mischief under 5,000; and
- Fail to comply with probation.

HAARDSTAD was brought before a Justice of the Peace and was remanded into custody. He appeared before the Alberta Court of Justice in St. Albert on Oct. 20, 2025 and was once again

remanded, to appear before the Alberta Court of Justice in Red Deer on Oct. 27, 2025.

"I would like to thank the members of the public who called in their concerns" said Sgt. Sutherland, Detachment Commander of the Evansburg RCMP. "Thanks to these calls, we were able to locate this prolific offender and arrest him, potentially preventing further crimes from taking place. We encourage the public to keep partnering with us in keeping our community safe by calling in suspicious activity".

PARENT PAYMENT PORTAL NOW OPEN

Applications are now open for the parent payment program to support Alberta families affected by the teacher strike.

To help ease the extra costs families may face while children are home due to ongoing labour action, Alberta's government is launching the Parent Payment Program, providing \$30 per day, per student for the duration of the disruption.

Visiting parentpayment.alberta.ca or clicking the

link on [Alberta.ca](https://alberta.ca) are the only ways to access the Parent Payment Portal.

Starting Oct. 14, families can apply for the parent payment program on [Alberta.ca](https://alberta.ca).

Payments are available to parents and guardians of students aged 12 and under who attend a public, Catholic or francophone school affected by the disruption, and is intended to cover additional costs related to child care, tutoring or other learning activities while students are unable to attend school. Additional support is available for

families of children with active Family Support for Children with Disabilities (FSCD) agreements who are enrolled in schools affected by the teacher strike. While families will be asked to provide their child's FSCD File ID number, found on their FSCD agreement, a separate application process is not required.

Families of children aged 12 and under with active FSCD agreements are eligible for an additional \$30 per child per school day. Combined with payments through the Parent Payment Program, this totals

\$300 per five-day school week.

Families of children aged 13 through 17 with an active FSCD agreement are eligible for \$60 per child per instructional day, totalling \$300 per five-day school week.

Throughout the duration of labour action, payments will be issued on the last day of each month and will be retroactive to Oct. 6. The first payment will be issued by e-transfer on Oct. 31.

ALBERTA RCMP ISSUES 1,918 TICKETS AS PART OF #OPERATIONIMPACT2025 SAFETY CAMPAIGN

This Thanksgiving long weekend, the Alberta RCMP

participated in enforcement initiatives as a part of the Ca-

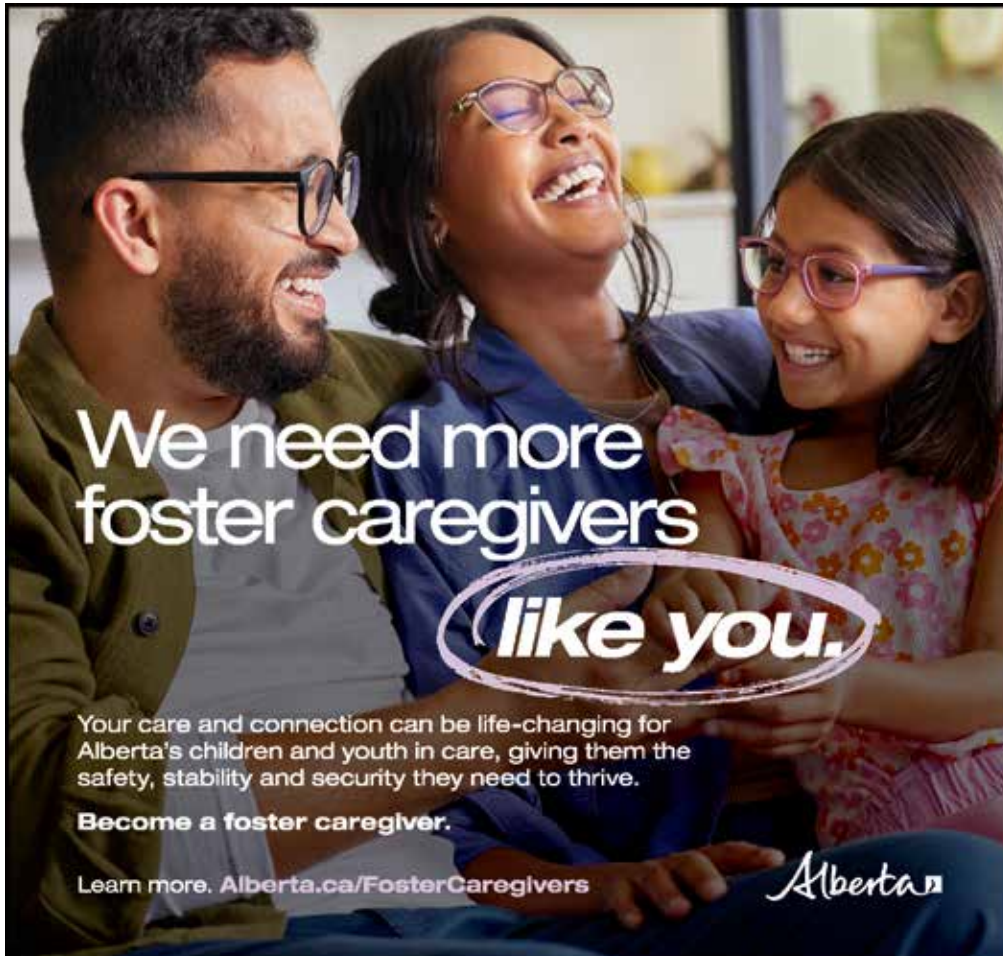
nadian Association of Chiefs of Police's #OperationImpact2025, a campaign aimed at making Canada's roads the safest in the world. This year's theme was "Safety is in MY hands."

While patrolling Alberta's provincial roads this past weekend, the Alberta RCMP issued 1,918 tickets. 55 tickets were issued for distracted driving, 13 tickets were issued for seatbelt infractions, and 841 tickets were issued for speeding. Additionally, 106 drivers were removed from the roads for being impaired due to drugs and/or alcohol.

There were 45 collisions which resulted in injuries, though zero collisions resulted in fatalities.

"The Alberta RCMP would like to remind drivers that traffic safety is everyone's responsibility," says Sgt. Darrin Turnbull, Alberta RCMP Traffic. "We would like to thank those who helped keep themselves and others safe by following the rules of the road this Thanksgiving."

For the first time in more than 40 years, Alberta is refreshing its licence plate with a Strong and Free motto, and the final look will be decided by Albertans.

From Oct. 15 until Nov. 5, Albertans can take part in a tournament-style online vote for a new provincial licence plate design that proudly reflects who we are every time we hit the road.

The new licence plate will be available in late 2026 and will be based on a “Strong and Free” theme, echoing the Latin motto of our province and reflecting Alberta’s bold identity, economic strength and deep-rooted provincial pride. The motto’s inclusion on the licence plates will also serve as a

nod to Canada’s national anthem and Alberta’s position as a strong and sovereign province within a united Canada.

“From our wide-open landscapes to our entrepreneurial spirit, Alberta has so much to be proud of, and our new licence plate will reflect that pride. For the first time in four decades, Albertans will choose how we tell that story. I look forward to seeing which design is selected to show the world that this is the land of the strong and free.”

With options that include famous Alberta landmarks such as the Three Sisters Mountains, and long-standing symbols of our province’s core industries including agriculture and energy production, the po-

tential plates each contain symbols of Alberta’s beauty, history and spirit.

In the first phase of voting, Albertans can vote for their favourite of eight unique concepts that incorporate Alberta’s unique landscape and history. Following the first phase, four designs will advance to the next round of voting where the top two will be selected, and subsequently, there will be a final vote for the winning plate concept. The winning new licence plate will be announced during the fall session of the legislature.

“Alberta is strong and free, and Albertans will have the opportunity to choose a new licence plate that captures that spirit. The new licence plate will be a fresh design that every Albertan will be proud to show off,

whether they’re driving to work, heading to the lake or exploring North America.”

If an Albertan wants to replace their current plate for the new licence plate once it is released, they can voluntarily pay a \$28 fee. Alternatively, Albertans could obtain a new plate on their vehicle registration renewal date at no additional cost. Motorists may also continue using the previous licence plate once the new licence plate is brought on-board, provided it is still in good condition.

FILING AN INDIAN BOARDING HOMES CLAIM IF YOU FILED A CLAIM IN ANOTHER SETTLEMENT

If you filed a claim in another settlement related to federal education programs, you may still be eligible to apply for the Indian Boarding Homes Class Action Settlement. These are separate legal processes, and receiving compensation under one does not automatically disqualify you from applying for the Indian Boarding Homes Settlement.

The Indian Boarding Homes Program recognizes the unique experiences of First Nations, Métis and Inuit children who were placed in private homes between September 1, 1951 and June 30, 1992 for the purpose of attending school. Survivors of

this program faced isolation, loss of culture and language, and risks of mistreatment while living away from their families and communities.

A Different Process, Focused on Survivors

Unlike past legal settlements, survivors applying to the Indian Boarding Homes Class Action are not required to testify or recount their story in order to receive compensation. The process is confidential and designed to acknowledge harms without forcing people to relive traumatic experiences.

Eligibility Requirements

You may qualify for the Indian Boarding Homes Settlement if you:

- Are First Nations, Métis or Inuit

- Were placed in a private home by the federal government to attend elementary or high school

- Lived in that home between September 1, 1951 and June 30, 1992

If you received compensation from the Residential Schools Settlement or any other settlement, you could still receive compensation from the Indian Boarding Homes Settlement, if you meet all the eligibility requirements.

Filing a Claim for Compensation

The claims process for the Indian Boarding Homes Class Action Settlement is now open, with a deadline of February 22, 2027. Survivors can submit claims for com-

pensation through a process that is designed to be clear, confidential, and accessible.

Support is available through Community Engagement Teams, who host Information Sessions across Canada to answer questions, provide resources, and guide survivors through how to file a claim.

You can also find detailed information and claim forms online.

Support and Resources for Survivors

Survivors and families do not need to navigate this process alone. Resources for emotional, cultural, and practical support are available to help you take the next step if you choose

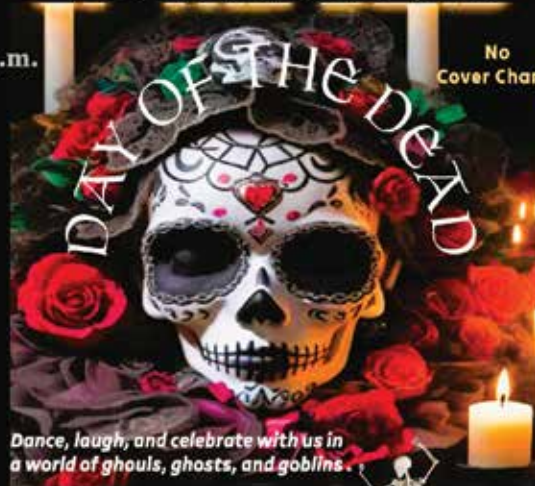

ALBERTA RCMP INVESTIGATES FRAUDS, SHARES TIPS TO PROTECT AGAINST FRAUD

Alberta RCMP reminds residents about the importance of staying vigilant as more of our daily activities take place online and over the phone. With the rise in digital communication, fraudsters are finding new ways to scam unsuspecting victims.

Over the past month, Alberta RCMP have seen an increase in reported frauds with fraudsters purporting themselves as representatives of government agencies, using technology to “spoof” that the person calling appears to be from a legitimate government agency. Victims were contacted, told they had outstanding fines or were wanted by police, provided a link to pay those fines or given instructions to download an app and provide personal information in order to avoid arrest.

Alberta RCMP offers the following tips on how to protect yourself from online fraud and scams:

- Protect your computer and accounts, and be cautious of urgent-looking pop-ups and suspicious emails with spelling or formatting errors.
- Don't click on unknown links or attachments.
- Use anti-virus software and keep your operating system up to date.
- Secure your online accounts with strong and

unique passwords.

- Do not use the same password for numerous accounts.
- Don't be afraid to say no. If a caller pressures you to buy something or send money immediately, hang up. Scammers often create a sense of urgency to manipulate victims.
- Confirm the legitimacy of businesses by checking official websites and contacting them directly before you act. If someone calls about a family member in trouble, reach out to others before acting.
- Guard your personal information and never share personal details (name, address, birthdate, banking info, etc.) unless you initiated the contact. You never know who's on the other end of an unsolicited call or message.
- Beware of upfront fees. In Canada, legitimate prizes do not require fees or taxes to claim.
- If you didn't enter a contest, you're not a winner.
- Create passwords with at least eight characters, including uppercase and lowercase letters, numbers, and symbols. Never reuse passwords across different accounts.
- Keep your computer, smartphone, and tablet secure with updated antivirus software and automatic system updates.
- Don't be afraid to say no. If someone pressures you to send money or provide personal information

right away, end the conversation. You're not being rude – you're being safe.

- High-pressure sales tactics, requests for secrecy, urgent demands, or upfront fees are all signs of potential fraud.
- If you're unsure about a message, email, or phone call, talk to a family member or someone you trust. You can also visit the company's official website and call their verified contact number to confirm any claims.
- Be suspicious of calls or messages claiming you've won a prize, especially if you're asked to pay a fee to receive it.
- Legitimate businesses and government agencies will never ask for payment using gift cards. This is a common tactic used by scammers.
- Use a family safe word. If someone calls claiming to be a relative in distress, ask for the safe word. If they can't provide it, hang up immediately and call the person they claimed to be directly.
- Never give out personal information. This includes your SIN, banking details, or passwords – especially if you didn't initiate the contact.
- Report suspicious activity, even if you didn't lose money. Reporting scams helps protect others. Contact your local police or the Canadian Anti-Fraud Centre at [www.antifraud-](http://www.antifraud-centre-centreantifraude.ca)

Alberta RCMP encourage anyone who suspects they have been a victim of fraud to report it to police.

The Canadian Anti-Fraud Center offers information on what to do if you're a victim of fraud. This includes:

- Gather all information about the fraud including documents, receipts, copies of emails and / or text messages
- Report the incident to the financial institution that transferred the money
- Tell family, friends, neighbours and co-workers about your experience. You may prevent someone else from becoming a victim.

Alberta RCMP encourage the public to report any criminal or suspicious activity to police. Reports tell us where to look, who to look for, and where to patrol in the future. If you see a crime in progress, dial 911. If you wish to remain anonymous, contact Crime Stoppers at 1-800-222-8477 (TIPS), online at www.P3Tips.com or by using the “P3 Tips” app available through the Apple App or Google Play Store. To report crime online, or for access to RCMP news and information, download the Alberta RCMP app through Apple or Google Play.

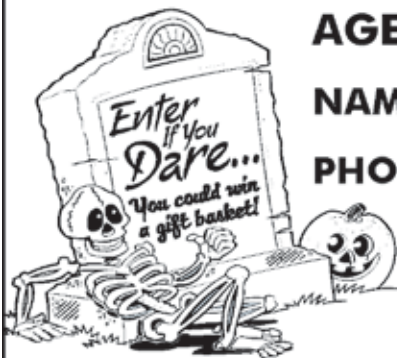
