For the first time in more than 40 years, Alberta is refreshing its licence plate with a Strong and Free motto, and the final look will be decided by Albertans.

From Oct. 15 until Nov. 5, Albertans can take part in a tournament-style online vote for a new provincial licence plate design that proudly reflects who we are every time we hit the road.

The new licence plate will

be available in late 2026 and will be based on a "Strong and Free" theme, echoing the Latin motto of our province and reflecting Alberta's bold identity, economic strength and deep-rooted provincial pride. The motto's inclusion on the licence plates will also serve as a nod to Canada's national anthem and Alberta's position as a strong and sovereign province within a united Canada.

"From our wide-open landscapes to our entrepre-

neurial spirit, Alberta has so much to be proud of, and our new licence plate will reflect that pride. For the first time in four decades, Albertans will choose how we tell that story. I look forward to seeing which design is selected to show the world that this is the land of the strong and free."

With options that include famous Alberta landmarks such as the Three Sisters Mountains, and long-standing symbols of our province's core industries including agriculture and energy production, the potential plates each contain symbols of Alberta's beauty, history and spirit.

In the first phase of voting, Albertans can vote for their favourite of eight unique concepts that incorporate Alberta's unique landscape and history. Following the first phase, four designs will advance to the next round of voting where the top two will be selected, and subsequently, there will be a final vote for the winning plate concept. The winning new licence plate will be announced during the fall session of the legislature.

"Alberta is strong and free, and Albertans will have the opportunity to choose a new licence plate that captures that spirit. The new licence plate will be a fresh design that every Albertan will be proud to show off, whether they're driving to work, heading to the lake or exploring North America."

Alternatively, Albertans could obtain a new plate on their vehicle registration renewal date at no additional cost. DIPLOMA EXAM UPDATE

November diploma exams will be optional for students.

With instructional time in schools disrupted due to the teacher strike, the November 2025 diploma exams will now be optional for students. Students who wish to write a diploma exam may request to do so, and their school boards will accommodate the request.

The optional diploma exams apply to all schools provincewide. These exams will still take place on the currently scheduled dates.

Students who choose not to write the November diploma exams can still complete their courses and graduate on time. Their final grade will be based entirely on the school-awarded mark provided by their teacher.

Choosing not to write the November diploma exams will not affect a student's ability to apply to, be accepted by, or attend post-secondary institutions after graduation.

No changes have been made to the January and June diplomas and provincial achievement tests.

CUTTING WAIT TIMES FOR WATER

Submitted by Government of Alberta

Alberta's government has cut wait times for Water Act licences nearly in half over the last year, saving Albertans time and money.

By cutting red tape, setting standards and streamlining processes, Alberta's government has reduced wait times for Water Act licences by 52 per cent in the last year. This makes it easier for landowners, businesses and municipalities to get the water they need to support growing communities and a thriving economy.

"We are getting government out of the way so that farmers, ranchers, communities and businesses can keep on growing. Routine water applications shouldn't take months or even years. I'm proud of the work we've done over the past two years to show we can maintain Alberta's world class environmental standards without holding up good projects or keeping Albertans from getting the water they need."

Alberta's government introduced mandatory service targets for all Water Act applications last year to speed up reviews and stop unnecessary delays. A new online system is also in place that makes it quicker and easier to submit and review applications, and regulatory improvements like eliminating unnecessary 10 per cent hold-backs on most water transfers have reduced unnecessary paperwork.

"These results are good news for every Albertan, company or community looking to access water in this province. Minister Schulz and I will keep looking for ways to cut red tape, reduce bureaucratic delays and get rid of outdated processes that slow good work down."

Thanks to these improvements, wait times for licences have fallen 52 per cent in the last year and 79 per cent since 2021. The 79 per cent improve-

ment means the applicant is receiving a decision 354 days sooner, on average.

"We're tossing out the long delays for regulatory approvals and decisions that hold businesses and communities back. Our government continues to cut red tape, knocking down bureaucratic barriers so Alberta continues to be the best place in Canada to live, work and do business."

This is all part of the government's work to make common-sense changes that modernize Alberta's water management system and make more water available for farmers, ranchers, businesses and growing communities.

"The County of Grande Prairie has experienced a significant reduction in wait times for Water Act applications, thanks to the Government of Alberta's Digital Regulatory Assurance System and streamlined application process. Prior to this, applications could take

six months or more to be approved, depending on project complexity. Now, both small-and large-scale projects are being processed and approved in just one to two months. This system has increased efficiency and clarified requirements, saving administrative time and resources."

"For years, the sand and gravel industry has struggled with permitting delays, which hampers both investment and development. These delays result in wasted money, time and effort, and lead to higher project costs and slower completion times for housing and critical infrastructure.
