As the holiday season approaches, Parkland RCMP would like to remind the public to take precautions to protect themselves against porch package thefts. Through December, there is often an increase

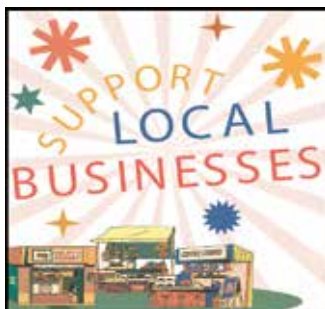
in package thefts with the busy shopping season.

investigation and identified an additional four victims related to several other offences.

Brian Jenkins (44), a resident of Stony Plain, has been charged with the following:

- Sexual interference;
- Invitation to Sexual Touching;
- Make Sexually Explicit Material Available to a Minor;
- Child Luring;
- Making Child Sexual Abuse and Exploitation Material (x2);

•Possessing Child Sexual Abuse and Exploitation Material (x2);

•Accessing Child Sexual Abuse and Exploitation Material;

•Breach of Prohibition Order (x4).

Brian Jenkins is remanded into custody with his next court appearance on Dec. 17, 2025, at the Alberta Court of Justice in St. Albert.

RCMP believe that there may be additional victims and encourage those individuals to come forward. Photos of Brian Jenkins are provided in hopes it will assist in identifying the victims. Note: The close-up photo with the dark colored top is the most recent.

Drayton Valley RCMP Makes Arrest In Vehicle Theft Investigation

the vehicle was tracked and a Tire Deflation Device was successfully deployed. The suspects fled the vehicle on foot but were quickly arrested by officers using information provided by RCMP Air Services. A search incidental to arrest revealed small amounts of methamphetamine.

As a result of the investigation, Ashton Armand Cardinal (23), a resident of Rocky Rapids, Alta., and Dawn Elsie Williams (19), a resident of Brazeau County, Alta., were charged with:

- Possession of methamphetamine;
- Resist police officer; and

• Obstruct use of property.

Furthermore, Cardinal was charged with:

- Dangerous operation of motor vehicle;
- Failure to stop;
- Possession of property obtained by crime under \$5000 (x2); and
- Traffic Safety Act related offences (x2).

Cardinal and Williams were brought before a justice of the peace, with Williams being released and Cardinal remanded into custody. Cardinal is to appear before the Alberta Court of Justice on Dec. 2, 2025, while Williams will appear before the same on Dec. 16, 2025.

"We want everyone to know that we take property crimes seriously" said S/Sgt. Ryan Hoetmer, Detachment Commander of the Drayton Valley RCMP. "We heard the public's concern surrounding sto-

len vehicles and we will keep investigating every complaint received, using various techniques and partnerships in order to apprehend those responsible".

PARKLAND RCMP RESPOND TO BREAK AND ENTER COMPLAINT

On Dec. 2, 2025, at 11:12 p.m., Parkland RCMP received a complaint of a break and enter in progress to a business on South Park Drive in Stony Plain. Upon arrival, police noted a broken door on the side

of the business, which was found to be vacant inside. Police reviewed surveillance which showed three suspects breaking the door, taking items, and exiting the store.

Police located the suspects nearby who matched the surveillance reviewed. The three youth suspects

were arrested, and admitted to committing multiple other break and enters to businesses in Stony Plain, as well as Spruce Grove, Alta. All three youths were charged and released with a court date of Feb. 6, 2026 at the Alberta Court of Justice in St. Albert.

Police are requesting

video surveillance of relevance to property damages or attempted break-ins that have occurred in Stony Plain or Spruce Grove between Nov. 27, 2025 and Dec. 2, 2025; to please contact the Parkland RCMP 825-220-7267(RCMP).

ATHABASCA RCMP ARRESTS INDIVIDUAL MAKING SERIOUS THREATS TOWARDS RCMP OFFICERS

Between Nov. 19 and Nov. 20, 2025, Parkland RCMP received a series of threatening messages from a social media account. The messages in-

cluded direct threats to ambush and kill RCMP officers and demanded a significant sum of money.

Through the course of the investigation, Parkland RCMP developed information that the suspect may have been in

the Calling Lake, Alta., area. Athabasca RCMP assumed responsibility for the apprehension efforts, working closely with Parkland RCMP, the RCMP Critical Incident Command (CIC), and the Emergency Response Team (ERT) due to the nature of the threats and the level of risk linked to the investigation.

On Dec. 3, 2025, officers executed a search warrant at a residence in the Calling Lake area to locate the suspect. The RCMP Emergency Response Team was deployed as a precaution to ensure the safety of the public, the officers involved, and the suspect. The suspect was arrested without incident and there were no injuries to the public or responding officers.

As a result of the investigation, Samuel Jacobs (38), a resident of Calling Lake, was charged with Uttering threats to cause death. He was brought before a Justice of the peace and remanded into custody, to appear before the Alberta Court of Justice in Evansburg on Dec. 8, 2025.

"This coordinated effort reflects the strong collaboration between detachment resources and RCMP specialized units all across Alberta" said S/Sgt. Mark Hall, Detachment Commander of the Athabasca RCMP. "We would also like to take the time to thank residents in the area for their patience and cooperation during the increased police presence".

“Youth gambling is a growing risk that too often goes overlooked. The Gift Responsibly Campaign plays a vital role in helping families and communities understand the importance of keeping lottery products out of kids’ hands,” said Derek Longmeier, President of NCPG’s Board of Directors. “We’re grateful to WCLC for joining this effort and working to expand education and awareness to protect young people from gambling-related harm.”

ALBERTA RCMP ADVISE OF GHOST BROKER SCAM

Alberta RCMP are raising awareness about a ghost broker scam. During a recent motor vehicle collision in the Ponoka area, it was discovered that one of the involved parties was the victim of insurance fraud. The victim provided his pink card as required which indicated the company All Covered Canada, only to find out that this insurance com-

pany did not exist.

Ghost brokers are individuals who disguise themselves as insurance brokers under the false pretext of selling insurance. As a result, those who pay ghost brokers for these fake insurance policies are not covered or insured at all.

Some red flags to look for are:

- Deals that are too good to be true
- No physical office or suspicious online presence

•Unable to provide proof of insurance immediately

•Charging a “finder’s fee”

•Asking for cash only payments

It is recommend that the public should always:

•Speak with an insurance professional who is properly licensed and qualified to sell insurance

•Only purchase insurance from a brokerage or agent you trust

•Confirm a specific in-

surance broker’s license status by referring to the licensing body within your province. For example, in Alberta, Albertans can check the Alberta Insurance Council to look up and confirm details of an insurance representative and the agency they represent.

TAKING ACTION AGAINST FAMILY VIOLENCE

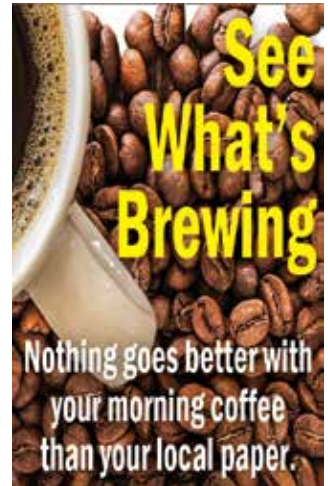
