### INVESTING IN SCHOOLS AND STUDENT SUCCESS

Submitted by Government of Alberta

Budget 2026 makes a record \$10.8-billion investment to put more teachers and EAs in classrooms, support complex learning needs and ease pressure on schools.

Budget 2026, if passed, provides \$10.8 billion in operational funding for education, or about \$54 million for every school day. The funding also represents an increase of \$722 million over Budget 2025.

In February 2026, Alberta's government rolled out the first steps and resources to address classroom complexity and classroom sizes. This

commitment builds on that work and reflects what Albertans have made clear is a high priority.

"Strong classrooms matter to families across Alberta. Our government has been taking action to respond to record enrolment growth, rising classroom complexity and the challenges teachers are facing. Budget 2026 builds on that momentum with the largest investment in education in Alberta's history. We will continue strengthening our education system to ensure every student has the opportunity to succeed."

Budget 2026, if passed, pro-

vides funding to hire more than 1,600 teachers and 800 support staff in the 2026-27 school year. This investment builds on \$143 million announced earlier this month to address class size and complexity, with complexity teams made up of 476 teachers and 952 education assistants.

Over the next three years, education funding will grow by almost \$1.5 billion, reaching \$11.5 billion by 2028-29. This increased funding is expected to support hiring more than 5,000 teachers, education assistants and support staff.

# Investing In Schools And Student Success

address classroom complexity and better support Alberta's students. Every child deserves the strongest possible start in life, and that means ensuring our education system keeps pace with growth and rising demands."

To help support more students and complex classrooms Budget 2026, if passed, is investing \$1.8 billion to support students with specialized learning needs. This represents an increase of \$86.5 million.

The budget also provides almost \$560 million for enrolment funding over the next three years, helping school boards hire the teachers and support staff needed to keep pace with growing student enrolment. Budget 2026, if

passed, would also invest \$355 million next year to address class sizes and classroom complexity.

"Operational funding supports the day-to-day work of teaching and learning. It pays for the people, resources and services students rely on. Recognizing real costs helps schools remain stable, plan responsibly, and focus on classrooms and student success."

Alberta's government is supporting the province's youngest students as they build strong education foundations, investing \$20 million in 2026-27 into reading and math supports. This is an increase of more than 60 per cent from last budget.

"The Government of Alberta's investment in literacy and numeracy, particularly when focused on early learners,

pays dividends throughout a student's education – and after graduation. These foundational skills help students navigate modern life, directly impact future economic stability and health outcomes and foster cognitive development."

Student transportation is a key part of the education system. Budget 2026 invests \$458 million to support safe and reliable transportation for more than 348,000 students across the province.

Budget 2026, if passed, also includes \$41 million to continue renewing Alberta's curriculum. This funding supports teacher professional learning and the development of classroom resources as new subjects continue to be introduced.

# ALBERTA MAKES HISTORIC INVESTMENT IN DOCTORS

Submitted by Government of Alberta

The largest investment in physician funding will strengthen access to care and support the health system priorities of Albertans.

If passed, Budget 2026 will make a record investment of \$7.7 billion in 2026-27, \$1.4 billion or 22 per cent more than Budget 2025, in physician recruitment, training, compensation and development. Family physicians caring for patients with chronic conditions, surgeons performing life-saving procedures and specialist physicians play a critical role in caring for Albertans. This investment helps ensure the province can meet that demand with

timely, high-quality care in communities across Alberta.

“Albertans expect to see a doctor when they need one. Access to care is a priority for families across this province. That is why we are making the largest investment in physicians in Alberta’s history, backing the doctors who care for our families and taking real action to improve care provincewide.”

“We’re seeing record numbers of physicians moving to Alberta, record surgery volumes and more than 700 family physicians taking new patients. This record funding will help pay for treatments, appointments,

services and training so that Albertans can get the care they deserve. This investment in Alberta physicians will support our continued efforts to build a sustainable, modern health care system that delivers better care for Albertans.”

This record investment builds on Alberta’s ongoing efforts to support physicians and the care they provide. In 2025, the government launched a new primary care physician compensation model. Government has provided \$200 million over two years to support the transition to the new model and \$57 million over three years to help

family doctors and nurse practitioners manage their growing patient loads.

As a result of these investments, more physicians are choosing to practise in the province than ever before. Currently, more than 13,000 physicians are registered in Alberta, a 34 per cent increase over the past decade, including an all-time high of 6,362 family physicians. Alberta’s government will continue working to ensure doctors are well supported and fairly compensated while building a sustainable, modern health system that delivers high-quality care for all Albertans.

# SUPPORT FOR HARRY COLLINGE HIGH SCHOOL AND HINTON FAMILIES

Grande Yellowhead Public School Division (GYPSD) deeply saddened by the tragic loss of two students from Harry Collinge High School (HCHS) in Hinton following a motor vehicle accident last night. Our hearts and primary thoughts are with the families and friends of these students during this unthinkable time.

In response to this tragedy, the division has mobilized immediate support systems to assist our students, staff, and the broader community:

- The Division's "Trauma Re-

sponse Team," including Family School Liaison Counsellors is currently on-site at HCHS. They are providing immediate grief counselling and mental health support to any students or staff members in need.

- While classes are not in session, the school remains open as a supervised, safe space for students who wish to gather, support one another, and speak with professionals.

- We recognize that grief does not follow a timeline. We are committed to keeping additional mental health resources available at the school in the coming days and weeks as our

community begins the healing process.

"Our entire district community is mourning today and there are no words that can fully capture the grief of such a loss. Our thoughts and deepest sympathies are with the families, friends, and the HCHS and TLC Hinton communities," shared Superintendent Kurt Scobie. "As Principal Maguhn shared last night to his families, classes at HCHS and TLC Hinton are cancelled today and tomorrow to allow students and staff the space to grieve. However, we are also want to ensure no one navigates this alone. Our dis-

trict's crisis response team are on-site along with myself and members of the central leadership team. We are committed to providing ongoing emotional support for as long as it is needed."

Out of respect for the privacy of the families involved, the Division will not be releasing the names of the students or further details regarding the accident at this time. We ask that the media respect the privacy of our students and staff as they navigate this difficult time.

## LEADING WITH KINDNESS ON PINK SHIRT DAY: MINISTER TURTON

Minister of Children and Family Services Searle Turton issued the following statement on Pink Shirt Day:

"Today, people across Alberta put on pink to show that kindness is powerful. Pink Shirt Day began with a simple, brave act of standing beside a classmate.

Nearly two decades later, its message remains the same: With one caring act, we can make a difference for someone who needs it.

"Alberta's government recognizes Pink Shirt Day each year because visible commitments matter, but what matters most is what we do every day. Kindness is action. It's how we listen to young people in our lives,

how we care for older people and how we welcome new neighbours. Small, repeated actions help build strong, safe and connected communities.

"Model the behaviour you hope others will follow, at home, school, the workplace, online and in every space we share, so that everyone feels respected, valued and knows that they belong.

"If you or someone you know is being bullied, you can get anonymous help 24/7 by texting or calling the Bullying Helpline at 310-1818 or chatting online at Alberta.ca/BullyingChat. You can also access the website to download resources and Pink Shirt Day graphics available in English and French."

## START OF 2026 WILDFIRE SEASON: MINISTER LOEWEN

Minister of Forestry and Parks Todd Loewen issued the following statement on the start of Alberta's 2026 wildfire season:

"The official start of wildfire season is a reminder for all of us to be ready and to stay aware. As wildfires continue to grow in intensity, Alberta's government is taking proactive steps to prepare for the season ahead.

"Preventing wildfires before they start is an important first step. About 60 per cent of wildfires in Alberta are caused by human activity, with the rest started by lightning. While we

have made progress in reducing human-caused wildfire, even small changes in behaviour can make a big difference. Checking conditions, following fire restrictions and ensuring winter burns are fully extinguished help protect our communities, landscapes and firefighters.

"When wildfires start, we are ready to respond; even with winter conditions still affecting Alberta, crews have responded to 27 new wildfires this year. Budget 2026 maintains strong, stable funding for wildfire response, ensuring crews, equipment, aircraft and technology are ready when and where they are needed.

"Alberta is a leader in using

aircraft to fight wildfires and those tools continue to make a real difference on the ground. Helicopters play an important role, and we're building on 2025's success by expanding our hoist-equipped helicopter program with the addition of two helicopters and enhancing training at the Hinton Training Centre to support safe deployment in hard-to-access areas. We're also expanding our night flying capability with three additional night-vision helicopters, bringing our total to seven, allowing crews to fight fires in cooler, more stable conditions and operate around the clock.

"Mitigating the risks of catastrophic wildfires remains a major focus as we work close-

ly with communities to help them take proactive steps to reduce wildfire risk before fires start. Through Budget 2026, we're continuing to invest in FireSmart initiatives and community fireguard projects to reduce hazardous fuels near communities and strengthen long-term resilience.

"Wildfire safety is a shared responsibility. Follow fire bans and restrictions, obtain permits where required and fully extinguish campfires by soaking, stirring and soaking again. By working together, we can reduce risk and protect what matters most this wildfire season."


The role of a substitute teacher requires a specialized skill set. These

# MORE SCHOOLS COMING TO RURAL ALBERTA

Budget 2026, if passed, will fund 16 new school projects in smaller cities and rural communities, bringing the total number of rural school projects underway to 79.

Budget 2026 is investing in what matters and that means building and renovating more schools to meet the needs of growing rural and smaller communities. These 16 new public school projects build on the 63 previously announced projects that are currently underway in communities outside of Edmonton and Calgary.

Together, these new school projects in rural and smaller communities will create or ren-

ovate more than 9,800 student spaces. With a total of 40 new school projects funded in Budget 2026, there are now 161 active school projects underway across the province, helping ensure that every child has a space to engage and thrive in Alberta's education system.

This work is part of the province's generational investment of \$8.6 billion to build and renovate more than 100 schools, creating more than 200,000 spaces for Alberta students. Details of public school projects in Edmonton will be announced in the coming days.

"Growing communities need schools built faster to keep pace with demand. These 16 new projects, in addition to the others already underway, help ensure students in rural Alberta and smaller

cities will have access to modern learning spaces close to home."

Alberta's student population has increased significantly, with 80,000 students joining Alberta's schools in just three years, increasing demand for classrooms across the province. In response, the 16 new school projects moving forward will be located in fast-growing communities including Airdrie, Canmore, Caslan, Cochrane, Fort Saskatchewan (two projects), Lac La Biche, Legal, Paddle Prairie, Red Deer, Spruce Grove, St. Albert (two projects), Stony Plain and Sylvan Lake (two projects).

Oil and gas companies can afford that; otherwise Alberta will suffer more as the resources

and demands dwindle over the years.

Ms Smith and friends, stop accusing "Ottawa" of not operating for the benefit of Albertans. Benefitting Albertans is the provincial government's task. When "Ottawa" offers almost two billion dollars to help tidy up Alberta's old well mess, accept it with dignity. When "Ottawa" sends annual health transfers or constructs over thirty billion dollars worth of pipelines across the mountains for us, be thankful. Work with the other levels of government. You know that Alberta does not "subsidize the entire country" so please stop saying such foolishness. While you are at it, stop interfering with judges and the senate.

You want a referendum? You have one ready. Almost half a million requesters signed it. It

is that Alberta remain a proud province of Canada. Bring that to us before anything else!

Please cancel plans to spend less than needed for population growth, making life progressively harder for everyone. Alberta has underfunded its obligatory services too long already. Ignore the selfish and foolish among us and listen to the wise. Plan for growth. Get more money from resources. Use surpluses wisely. Encourage new industry. Allow for abundant renewable energy. 


