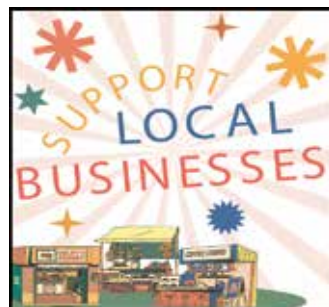
In late Feb. 2026, prolific male and female property offenders were released after serving sentences for prior offences. One

investigation, Patrick Wilis Fair (69), a resident of Spruce Grove, has been charged with 5 counts of

sexual assault.

Fair was taken before a Justice of the Peace and released with his next court appearance on Mar. 25, 2026, at the Alberta Court of Justice in St. Albert.

"The investigation began with a report of sexual assault that occurred in the summer of 2025 involving a female youth," says Cpl. Rachel Geense of the Parkland RCMP SIU. Further investigation determined that additional female victims existed spanning from 1984 to 2025. "Due to the period of

time these offences are alleged to have occurred, it is our concern that additional victims may exist and have not yet come forward."

Police are releasing a photo of Patrick Fair in hopes that it will assist in identifying additional victims.

Fair is described as:

- Fair complexion,
- 5 feet 11 inches tall,
- Approximately 176lbs,
- Slender build,
- White hair,
- Wears glasses.

for illegal tobacco.

The operation was run like

a business, with the distributors handing out business cards to potential customers. A search warrant was obtained and officers conducted a search of the Edmonton residence, and several vehicles associated to the operation. Officers seized 202,460 illegal cigarettes and \$53,000 in cash as proceeds of crime. The seizure represents more than \$100,000 in avoided taxes and a significant loss to local retailers. Four males are facing charges in connection with the investigation.

Two adult male residents

of Edmonton are facing charges under the Federal Excise Act.

Two different adult male residents of Edmonton are facing charges under the Criminal Code for trafficking unstamped tobacco and charges under the Federal Excise Act.

"The illicit tobacco trade is often linked to organized crime," says Sergeant Collin Kuca of the Parkland RCMP. "There is evidence that this operation was netting profits in the hundreds of thousands of dollars a month."

stealing the 2007 Kia Sportage. On Mar. 6, in the afternoon, a motor vehicle was stolen from a parking lot in Spruce Grove, Alta. Security footage was collected depicting the vehicle stolen from Stony Plain earlier, arriving at the location and a male passenger exiting to then steal a 2004 Ford F350 truck.

On Mar. 7, a break and enter was reported at a commercial business in Spruce Grove. During the break and enter, a Cadillac ATS sedan was stolen and keys to multiple other vehicles were taken. Security footage from a neighbouring business was collected showing the stolen Kia Sportage at the scene and same individuals involved.

On Mar. 8, a 2010 Toyota Prius was stolen from a church parking lot in Parkland County. A Cadillac sedan was observed in the area at the time. A short time later, the stolen Cadillac and stolen Toyota Prius arrived

at a convenience store in Stony Plain, and a female suspect enters the store, fraudulently using stolen credit cards obtained from the Toyota Prius. This behaviour is repeated at a second convenience store in Stony Plain.

On Mar. 10, Parkland RCMP members and Parkland plainclothes investigators attended a rural property in Parkland County and seized the stolen 2004 Ford F350 truck and a stolen 2024 Precision flat deck trailer from the property connected to one of the suspects. The Parkland RCMP Crime Reduction Unit took carriage of these investigations and coordinated efforts with policing partners to locate and apprehend these repeat property offenders.

On Mar. 11, the K-Division Community Response Team (CRT) located the stolen Cadillac ATS in the Onoway area of Lac Ste. Anne County, occupied by the female and male suspects. The vehicle travelled

through both the areas of Lac Ste. Anne and Parkland County, being operated in a dangerous manner. RCMP Real Time Operations Centre (RTOC) was essential in coordinating the efforts of CRT, Parkland Plainclothes members, an RCMP Air Services helicopter, Police Dog Service, and RCMP uniform personnel from both Parkland and Evansburg detachments in the monitoring; allowing a successful deployment of a tire deflation device, which resulted in the vehicle being disabled and a safe arrest of both suspects.

“Targeting repeat property crime offenders is a priority of ours,” says RCMP Sergeant Collin Kuca. “The Parkland Crime Reduction Unit will relentlessly pursue the individuals responsible for these activities and partner with other units to share resources and intelligence, which furthers this goal.”

Colten Battaglini, (28), a resident of Onoway, was arrested and charged with the following

offences:

 - Failure to comply with release order x6,
 - Possession of property obtained by crime x2,
 - Dangerous operation of a motor vehicle,
 - Flight from police,
 - Theft from motor vehicle
- Jayden Stebbings, (19), a resident of Stony Plain, was arrested and charged with the following offences:
- Theft over \$5,000 x3,
 - Failure to comply with release order x8,
 - Possession of property obtained by crime x4,
 - Dangerous operation,
 - Flight from police,
 - Fraudulent use of a credit card x3.

Battaglini and Stebbings were both remanded into custody with their next court appearances on Mar. 30, 2026 at the Alberta Court of Justice in St Albert.

PROVINCE OF ALBERTA ANNOUNCES PLANNING FOR K-12 FRANCOPHONE SCHOOL IN STONY PLAIN

Submitted by Town of Stony Plain

The Town of Stony Plain is welcoming the Government of Alberta's announcement last week that planning is underway for a future Kindergarten to Grade 12 school for École La Trinité in Stony Plain.

The announcement marks an important step toward developing a permanent school for francophone students in Stony Plain and the surrounding region. Since opening in 2022, École La Trinité has operated from modular classrooms and has continued to grow as demand for French-language education increases. The Province's announcement through Budget 2026 supports the next phase

of the project by advancing planning and design work for a permanent school facility.

"This is an important milestone for francophone families in our community and across the region," says Mayor William Choy. "We appreciate the Government of Alberta's commitment to supporting the planning for this permanent school. This also reflects the continued growth of Stony Plain and the strong demand for French-language education. Projects like this help attract new residents and support families choosing to call Stony Plain home."

The Town of Stony Plain has supported advocacy efforts alongside Conseil Scolaire Centre-Nord (CSCN), parents, regional partners, and government representatives

to help advance the need for expanded francophone education facilities.

"Providing a permanent home for École La Trinité is a high priority for our region, and I am proud to see this project advancing through Budget 2026," says Searle Turton, MLA for Spruce Grove-Stony Plain. "This announcement shows the strength of our partnership with the Town of Stony Plain and Conseil scolaire Centre-Nord to build a school that provides our region with access to high-quality education for generations to come."

"The announcement of a new building for École La Trinité would not have been possible without the ongoing and enthusiastic support of the Town of Stony Plain,"

says Étienne Alary, Conseil Scolaire Centre-Nord Board Chair. "On behalf of all the students, staff and families of École La Trinité – un grand merci!"

The future school site is planned within the Old Town South Redevelopment area, near the new Community Recreation Facility. This area is being redeveloped as a civic and community hub bringing together recreation, education, culture, and public spaces.

While the announcement confirms planning for a future school, additional steps will take place before construction can proceed, including design work and future capital funding approvals from the Government of Alberta.
