WAD CRU MAKES ARREST AFTER TRAFFIC STOP LEADS TO DRUG BUST

On April 30, 2026, Western Alberta District (WAD) Crime Reduction Unit (CRU), with assis-

tance from Whitecourt RCMP, conducted a traffic stop in the Whitecourt area. The traffic stop resulted in the arrest of the two people within the

vehicle and a search of the vehicle incidental to arrest revealed approximately 269 grams of cocaine and 152 grams

of methamphetamine. As a result of the investigation, Christopher Doucette (44), a resident of Fox Creek, Alta., and Jessica Hough (33), a resident of Whitecourt, were charged with two counts of possession for the purpose of trafficking. Furthermore, Hough was arrested on an out-

standing warrant and charged with failure to comply with a court order.

Hough was brought before a justice of the peace and remanded into custody while Doucette was released on conditions. They are to appear before the Alberta Court of Justice in Grande Prairie, with Hough appearing May 11, 2026 and Dou-

cette appearing July 14, 2026.

Alberta RCMP Advise Public On Protecting Personal Information

The Alberta RCMP recommend the following steps to safeguard your personal information:

- Review bank and credit card statements for any unauthorized transactions and report suspicious activity immediately.
- Consider requesting a free credit report from recognized Canadian credit bureaus and review it for unfamiliar accounts or inquiries.
- Fraudsters may

use stolen information to create convincing phishing emails, phone calls, or text messages. Do not provide personal or financial information unless you have verified the source.

- Use strong, unique passwords for online accounts and enable multi-factor authentication where available.
- Avoid sharing sensitive details such as your Social Insurance Number (SIN) unless necessary and ensure documents contain-

ing personal information are stored securely.

- You may contact a credit bureau to place a fraud alert on your file, which can help prevent unauthorized accounts from being opened in your name.
- When possible, deal with your financial institution in-person should one or more of your bank accounts become compromised. Unfortunately, an internet search may provide a fake toll-free number to an individual who may victim-

ize you further.

• If you believe you have been a victim of identity theft or fraud, report it to your local police service and the Canadian Anti-Fraud Centre at www.antifraudcentre-centreantifraude.ca. Early reporting can help limit potential damage and assist in ongoing investigations.

PARKLAND RCMP RESPOND TO FATAL MOTOR VEHICLE COLLISION

On May 4, 2026, around 11:04 a.m., Parkland RCMP responded to a fatal motor vehicle collision between a Southbound semi-truck and a Northbound pickup truck near Township Road 524 and Highway 770. Both vehicles subsequently caught fire.

The 62-year-old male driver of the semi-truck was able to exit his vehicle, was assessed at scene and transported to hospital.

As the investigation continued, it was confirmed that the pickup truck had a sole occupant, who was pronounced deceased at the scene. Parkland RCMP extend their condolences to the family and friends of the deceased.

An RCMP collision analyst from Parkland RCMP attended the scene, and RCMP's Real Time Operations Centre in Edmonton was

engaged. Police would like to thank Stony Plain Fire & Parkland Fire for responding to the collision, while Parkland County Enforcement Services and LEDCOR assisted with traffic detours.

ALBERTA RCMP AND SEARCH AND RESCUE ALBERTA SHARE OUTDOOR SAFETY TIPS FOR NATIONAL EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS WEEK

May 3-9, 2026, is Emergency Preparedness Week. Together, the Alberta RCMP and Search and Rescue (SAR) Alberta are sharing outdoor safety tips following this year's campaign theme: "Be Prepared. Know Your Risks."

With the weather warming up, many Albertans will be spending time outside in our parks and backcountry. However you choose to enjoy the great outdoors, it's important that you understand the risks wherever you are trekking to help be better prepared in case of emergency.

- Research your hiking route in advance. Use accurate information from guidebooks, satellite images, topographical maps and trail reports on AlbertaParks.ca to inform your trip.

- Leave your itinerary with someone you trust. Include your route, when you'll return, who you'll be with, emergency contacts and vehicle details, including your license plate number.

- Cell service is not available in many parks and backcountry recreational areas. Always carry a satellite communicator when going outside cell service areas. To report an emergency once in an area with cell service, call 911.

- Wear bright or reflective clothing, especially if trekking at night.

- Pack appropriate equipment for whatever activity. This includes proper footwear; extra layers of clothing including a hat or toque; protection from the sun, wind and insects; a life jacket; a flashlight; food and water; as well as a tarp and some rope for an emergency shelter.

- Whether you're in the woods or out on the water, check local forecasts and be prepared for sudden changes and inclement weather.

- Always be prepared to spend an unexpected night outdoors due to an emergency. It may take hours for search and rescue personnel to reach you, depending on your location, terrain and weather conditions.

"Planning and preparedness are your best defence in emergency

situations," says Cst. S.J, Alberta RCMP. "As Albertans head outside this spring and summer, we encourage everyone to take the time to understand the risks and carry the right equipment. Being prepared not only helps keep you safe, but it also supports first responders and our search and rescue partners when minutes truly matter."

"Exploring all that our province offers is an incredible experience and the best way to keep that experience positive is by being prepared. Leaving a detailed trip plan with a trusted person results in a quicker search and rescue response when you really need it. Help us help you," says Christian Stenner, South Central Regional Director, SAR Alberta.

SAR Alberta is the provincial association for 33 highly trained volunteer search and rescue teams across the province. It is responsible for the coordination of ground and inland water search and rescue incidents under the jurisdiction of the Ministry of Public Safety and Emergency Services in the province of Alberta.

MESSAGE TO ALBERTANS FROM THE CHIEF ELECTORAL OFFICER

RE: Unauthorized Use of List of Electors

"We are hearing from hundreds of Albertans concerned about the impacts of the unauthorized use of the List of Electors by the Centurion Group Ltd.," said Gordon McClure, Chief Electoral Officer. "People are unhappy, scared, and anxious about the situation. We have heard countless stories about the risks people face having their information made public, including stories from domestic violence survivors, law enforcement, marginalized communities, and more. We at Elections Alberta hear you, and share your concerns in a very real way. Our staff are among the 2.9 million Albertans who are on the List of Electors. We agree this is an extremely serious situation.

"We have been asked why Elections Alberta did not act sooner; who has the information and how it is being used; how to find out if you are on the list; what can be done to prevent a similar situation in the future, and the impact on citizen initiative petitions. This message contains the answers we are able to share at this time."

Why did Elections Alberta not start an investigation sooner?

Elections Alberta is held to a very high standard on what we can and cannot investigate. The legislation requires that we must have "reasonable grounds to believe an offence has occurred" to start investigations. "Reasonable grounds" is a much higher standard than "grounds to warrant" (the previous standard in the legislation), or "what might seem obvious" based on a complainant's suspicions or beliefs. This is similar to the amount of evidence that, in a criminal matter, police would need to arrest someone. Elections Alberta takes all complaints seriously, whether or not it is able to start an investigation.

Keep in mind, Elections Alberta is prohibited by law from commenting on any complaint or investigation that may or may not be happening.

A typical complaint progression looks like this:

- A complaint or information is received.

- A complaint or information may not provide the evidence needed. If it does not, we are not able to initiate an investigation.

- We will seek clarification from the complainant where possible.

- Where an investigation is not started, we hold the information and monitor the situation.

- As time progresses, if enough information to establish reasonable grounds is received, we start an investigation.

In the case of the unauthorized use of the List of Electors, as soon as we were able to share information on the injunction, and the data breach, we made two public statements, in the interests of the public, sharing as much information as we could.

I issued a cease and desist letter on April 28, 2026, sent representatives to ensure the database was not being accessed at a Centurion Group event on April 29, and had an emergency injunction issued by the Court of King's Bench on the morning of April 30, 2026.

We are now working closely with law enforcement and other agencies on this matter, and are doing everything we can within the limits of the legislation.

Who has the information and how is it being used?

The Court Order directs the Centurion Project Ltd. and the Republican Party of Alberta to, within four days of the Order:

- Identify every person or entity the Centurion Project Ltd. and the Republican Party of Alberta have provided a copy of the List of Electors, or a portion of the List of Electors, and

- Identify every person or entity the Centurion Project Ltd. and the Republican Party of Alberta have permitted to access the information from the List of Electors or portion of the List of Electors, and

- Provide to the Chief Electoral Officer all contact information the Centurion Project Ltd. and the Republican Party of Alberta have for these people or entities.

In our news release yesterday, we highlighted details of the injunction obtained and served.

What steps can be taken to prevent a similar situation in the future?

As the legislation is currently written, Elections Alberta cannot prevent an unauthorized distribution or use of a List of Electors provided to a registered political party or other authorized entity. Elections Alberta may only ensure compliance with and enforcement of the legislation. Elections Alberta administers provincial electoral legislation in Alberta that is passed by the Legislative Assembly. Elections Alberta does not write legislation.

On May 9, 2025, the Chief Electoral Officer wrote to all members of the Legislative Assembly of Alberta outlining several concerns with Bill 54: Justice Statutes Amendment Act before it was passed. The Chief Electoral Officer's letter included a specific section on "Changing the Threshold for Investigation to the Criminal Law Standard of "Reasonable Grounds".

The letter warned that:

"[u]nder Bill 54, for an investigation to begin, the Election Commissioner will need to be satisfied that a breach of the Legislation has occurred, before they can speak to anyone about the allegation, or gather and review any records. Practically this means that the onus will fall on a complainant to provide a substantively completed investigation in order for the Election Commissioner to look into a matter."

The letter went on to describe the potential impact on Albertans:

"The proposed changes will eliminate the majority of the compliance activities undertaken by the Election Commissioner and impact Albertans' trust that the rules... are being followed."

Elections Alberta can confirm that requiring "reasonable grounds" in Legislation has indeed impacted Albertans in this and other matters, as predicted in that letter.

In addition to the recommendations provided in its May 9, 2025, letter to the Legislative Assembly, Elections Alberta is preparing further recommendations for legislative changes that will strengthen our democratic system.

What is the impact on Citizen Initiative Petitions?

The Legislation prevents Elections Alberta from confirming or

denying whether the name of a person who inquires is on a signature sheet for a Citizen Initiative petition. The Legislation also prevents Elections Alberta from removing the name of person at their request from a signature sheet for a Citizen Initiative petition.

Elections Alberta's role is to validate and verify the petition signature sheets as they are delivered by the proponent or petition applicant.

Consequential amendments to the signature verification processes

The Chief Electoral Officer has directed that the Citizen Initiative petition verification process be amended. Verification after today's date will include determining if any of the seeded names from the Republican Party of Alberta's List of Electors are contained in any incoming petition. If any of the seeded names are included, further scrutiny will result.

This updated process will apply to "A Referendum Relating to Alberta Independence" petition, the "No New Coal Mining in the Eastern Slopes of the Rocky Mountains" petition, and the two current recall petitions. The updated process will also apply to all petitions in the future.

The amendment is in addition to the existing steps that Elections Alberta takes to verify the petition signature sheets. Elections Alberta staff currently contacts a statistically valid random sample of electors whose signatures are on the petition to verify their information and signatures, using the contact information recorded on the petition signature sheets.

Final comments

Elections Alberta supports the Information and Privacy Commissioner of Alberta's April 30th statement regarding the need for legislation that protects the personal information of Albertans that is in the hands of registered political parties.

Elections Alberta is an independent, non-partisan office of the Legislative Assembly of Alberta responsible for administering provincial elections, by-elections, and referenda.
