PARKLAND RCMP INVESTIGATES VEHICLE VERSUS YOUTH PEDESTRIAN HIT AND RUN

On June 14, 2026, at approximately 11:13 p.m., Parkland RCMP responded to a call involving a vehicle and a youth pedestrian on Larrys Road near Range Road 15 in Parkland County.

Through investigation, police determined that between 8:30 p.m. and 10:00 p.m., a vehicle described to be an older dark colour Chevrolet pickup with

a grey canopy and a burnt-out headlight was travelling down the gravel road when they hit a male youth pedestrian and fled from the scene. The youth was located on the road, assessed and treated by EMS for injuries.

“Those involved may be scared; however, fleeing the scene and leaving a victim behind is egregious and unacceptable.” Said Constable Butcher of the Parkland RCMP. “We urge those involved to turn

themselves in to the RCMP.”

PARKLAND RCMP CHARGE IMPAIRED SUSPENDED DRIVER TRAVELLING OVER DOUBLE THE SPEED LIMIT

On June 7, 2026, at approximately 2:13 a.m., a Parkland RCMP officer on patrol observed an older Ford truck fail to stop for a red light while making a right turn at the intersection of 44 Avenue and Southpark Drive in Stony Plain. The vehicle then proceeded westbound at a high rate of speed.

Police followed the vehicle and observed it travelling at 120 km/h through Stony Plain, which is double the posted speed limit of 50 km/h in that area. At the

time, Stony Plain was hosting an event near the area, resulting in increased vehicle and pedestrian traffic, as well as patrons leaving local establishments in the area.

The vehicle was subsequently stopped at the intersection of 48 Street and 49 Avenue. During the investigation, police determined the driver was impaired and operating a motor vehicle while under suspension.

As a result, the driver was issued:

- A violation ticket for careless driving;
- A 24-hour Immediate Road-

side Suspension due to impairment; and

•A summons for driving while unauthorized.

The vehicle was also seized for 30 days under Alberta's Suspended Driver Program.

“Driving impaired and at excessive speeds is a serious danger to everyone on the road,” said Inspector McGillivray of the Parkland RCMP. “This type of reckless behaviour puts motorists and pedestrians at risk, and the outcome could have been far more serious.”

ALBERTA'S SUMMER SPORT SEASON IS UNDERWAY

Communities across Alberta are welcoming thousands of athletes and fans as a full lineup of major sport events unfolds for summer 2026.

Through the Major Sport Events grant program, Alberta's government is supporting 12 national and international competitions held between February and August 2026. Funding will help communities across the province host major events that drive tourism, showcase Alberta on the national and international stage, and drive the local economy.

Alberta's government has invested \$1.3 million through the program to support events in Calgary, Canmore, Grande Prairie, Edmonton and St. Albert across a wide range of sports, including climbing, triathlon, wrestling, curling, BMX, softball and taekwondo.

"Alberta continues to lead the way as a premier destination for major sport events, attracting top competitions, welcoming athletes and delivering real economic benefits for communities across our province. We are proud to support events that strengthen our reputation on the world stage while creating jobs and supporting local businesses."

In the first half of 2026, seven supported events were successfully hosted in Alberta between February and May, attracting more than 103,000 athletes, coaches, officials and spectators from across Canada and around the world. These events generated significant tourism and economic activity for host communities while showcasing Alberta's ability to deliver first-class competitions.

Looking ahead, five upcoming major events will take place through the summer. Together, all 12 supported events are projected to welcome more than 115,000 attendees and generate over \$82 million in local economic activity.

Alberta communities will welcome five more events through the summer months, including the Edmonton Athletics Invitational, the World Triathlon Cup, the U17 Women's Canadian Fast Pitch Championships in Calgary and the Canadian BMX Championships in St. Albert. These events are expected to attract more than

12,000 athletes, coaches, officials and spectators.

The Major Sport Events grant program provides up to \$250,000 per event to eligible hosting organizations. Funding can be used for venue rentals, infrastructure enhancements, marketing and promotion, broadcasting, and accommodations for athletes and attendees.

Applications for the next round of funding open in fall 2026. Event organizers interested in bringing major sport competitions to Alberta are encouraged to apply.

WATER QUALITY ADVISORY ISSUED FOR CAMP YOWOCHAS BEACH, PARKLAND COUNTY

Due to elevated levels of fecal indicator bacteria, Alberta Health Services (AHS) is advising the public not to swim or wade at the Camp Yowochas beach area on Wabamun Lake, effective immediately.

Elevated levels of fecal indicator bacteria were detected via testing of the lake water at this beach location. At current levels, gastrointestinal illness may result from ingestion of the water at Camp Yowochas beach. As well, there is the possibility of skin, ear and

eye infections with water contact.

As always, visitors and residents are reminded to never drink or cook with untreated water directly from any lake or streams, at any time. Water-borne organisms, including fecal bacteria, can cause vomiting and diarrhea.

AHS Environmental Public Health inspectors will continue to monitor the water at Camp Yowochas beach.

This advisory will remain in effect until further notice.



Summer Village of Seba Beach/Parkland County Intermunicipal Development Plan Amendment**

Pursuant to Sections 216.1(1), 606(1), and 692(1) of the *Municipal Government Act*, R.S.A. 2000, c. M-26, as amended, the Council of the Summer Village of Seba Beach hereby gives notice of its intention to consider Bylaw No. 05-2026, a bylaw to amend Bylaw No. 5-2019 Summer Village of Seba Beach/Parkland County Intermunicipal Development Plan (IDP). The purpose of this amendment (Bylaw 05-2026) is to include future opportunities for commercial uses in the IDP Plan Area and a specific change of future land use for a parcel of land located at SE-12-53-6-W5M from R- Residential District to C- Commercial District to facilitate future commercial land uses.

In accordance with the requirements of Section 606 of the *Municipal Government Act*, as amended, the Council of the Summer Village of Seba Beach has scheduled Public Hearings regarding the proposed adoption of the following Bylaws:

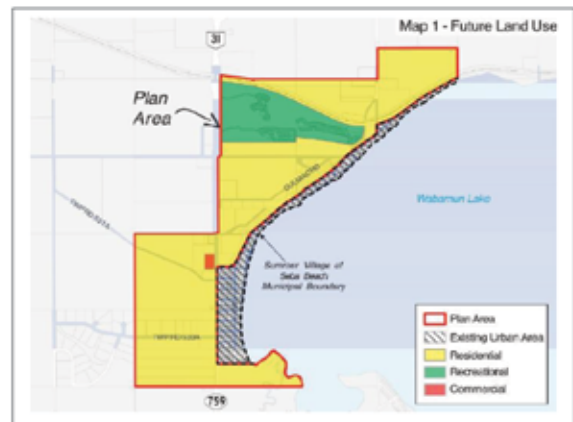

Bylaw 05-2026 Amendments to Bylaw 5-2019 Summer Village of Seba Beach/Parkland County Intermunicipal Development Plan			

The Summer Village of Seba Beach Council will consider the following amendment:

Intermunicipal Development Plan

An Intermunicipal Development Plan (IDP) Amendment Application, which proposes to amend the Summer Village of Seba Beach/Parkland County IDP, Bylaw 5-2019 (Summer Village of Seba Beach) and Bylaw 2019-09 (Parkland County). Both a text and map amendment are being proposed to the IDP, to support commercial uses on a portion of SE-12-53-6-W5M and includes amendments as follows:

- 5.7 **Commercial** – The Plan Area shall allow for a variety of high-quality commercial, tourism, and recreational Uses that provide services to surrounding communities. The following uses shall be prohibited in the Plan Area:
- i. Vehicle Services, Maintenance and Sales, Light
 - ii. Vehicle Services, Maintenance, and Sales, Heavy
 - iii. Crematorium
 - iv. Data Processing Facility



Hearing Procedure

This is a formal Public Hearing and Council is prepared to hear and receive formal submissions and presentations (verbal or written) from those who wish to speak to the proposed Bylaw. Written submissions or presentations may be submitted in advance to cao@sebabeach.ca by 12:00 p.m. on June 18, 2026.

Verbal presentations at the Public Hearing will be limited to a maximum of five (5) minutes. Anyone wishing to make a verbal presentation who has not made prior arrangements may be allocated a time at the commencement of the Public Hearing. Council advises that this is your last opportunity to comment on the proposed Bylaws as Council is unable to receive further submissions after the Public Hearing is closed.

I am so glad to be out of the legislature. Premier Klein was very correct when he stated that if you stayed in there too long, you would contract “Dome Disease.” I wonder what he would have said about social media or the mainstream media, given the state it is in today. I personally think it’s a little like walking through the barnyard with your favorite pair of boots—you want to wash them off very carefully before you head to church. You never know what you stepped in, you can’t smell it, but those around you sure can.

One of the highlights of getting out of session is the Rainmaker Rodeo for my staff and I. For the last several years, great folks from around our constituency have made a horse available for me to ride, and it has expanded to include the MLA from St. Albert-Morinville, as well as a number of our staff. I usually have a pickup, some great volunteers to drive it, and folks to walk along handing out candy to the kids. It’s a rodeo parade after all—lots of fun all around. As tradition dictates, we take all the horses and the volunteers through the DQ drive-through for ice cream afterwards!

As usual, we had a great time, and I’d say 99.99 percent of the people in the crowd did as well. St. Albert may be a little polarized in its politics, but as elected officials, our duty—there and in our constituency offices—is to represent the folks in our area, not the party we may belong to.

I was thoroughly disap-

pointed to see some negative posts online claiming that I was in a “separatist truck” in the parade, especially when the post was made by a former provincial minister. A little light-hearted correction was in order, and we pointed out that we were on horses, not trucks. It didn’t stop there, however, and this is where I am, quite honestly, a little angry and disappointed in the rhetoric and mob-like mentality that is becoming too common.

A great locally owned business that offers riding programs for seniors, kids, single moms, and veterans—one that provided a horse for me to ride—was attacked online, with calls to boycott their business because they were “supporting separatists.” This company does so much for the community at the east end of the constituency. Some real good comes from giving folks—who often need a mental break—a bit of light in their lives, and what better way than with

horses?

When did it become OK to go after one another like this? Who said it’s acceptable to dox, shame, call names, and outright slander someone or their business because you don’t like who over 68 percent of the constituency elected? So, the idea is that because they can’t get to me, they go after my kids, my wife, and now family-owned businesses. It is deplorable, despicable behavior, and

Bylaw 06-2026 Amendments to Bylaw 05-2025 Summer Village of Seba Beach Land Use Bylaw

The Summer Village of Seba Beach Council will consider the following amendment:

9.1 ACCESSORY BUILDINGS AND USES

9.1.2 In residential districts, all accessory buildings, including detached garages and guest houses (garage suites and garden suites) shall be located according to the following:

d. An accessory building shall not be more than 9.0 m (29.5 ft.) 4.5 m (14.8 ft.) in height, unless it is a garage suite on the second floor over a garage, in which case the accessory building shall not exceed 9.0 m (29.5 ft.) in height.

INFORMING ALBERTA'S FUTURE

Submitted by Government of Alberta

Alberta's government has appointed an independent advisory panel to oversee the development of a report on the potential economic impacts of Alberta leaving Canada.

Alberta has clear citizen-initiated referendum laws that protect democratic participation, and Albertans deserve the opportunity to express their views at the ballot box on Oct. 19. Alberta's government is committed to ensuring Albertans have access to objective, evidence-based analysis so they can be confident in their decision.

The University of Calgary's School of Public Policy has been selected to conduct an independent analysis of the potential economic impacts of secession so that Albertans can make an informed decision. The report will give voters a better understanding of the estimated transition costs, economic impacts, potential savings and risks that could result if the province pursued this constitutional change.

"Albertans deserve clear and credible information on the potential impacts of separation. This is a huge decision that will impact our kids and grandkids long into the future, and we cannot approach it lightly."

Alberta's government has also appointed an expert advisory panel that will provide input and act as a consultative body for both the School of

Public Policy and government throughout the process. While the panel will offer input, the school will retain full and independent control over the final report.

Economist Dr. Jack Mintz will lead the panel, joined by Ted Morton, political scientist and former Alberta finance minister; Adam Legge, president of the Business Council of Alberta; Alex Pourbaix, board chair of Cenovus Energy Inc. and Janice MacKinnon, former Saskatchewan finance minister.

"Albertans need to know and understand the potential impacts of separating from Canada. This work is highly complex, carried out by researchers at the School of Public Policy. The advisory council will provide feedback to ensure that the in-depth assessment of economic considerations associated with separation enables Albertans to make an informed decision."

After the report is completed, the advisory panel will review

the findings and deliver an independent written assessment. This approach will allow for further and potentially differing views to be shared, ensuring Albertans are equipped with all the facts.

The final report is expected to be released in late summer so Albertans have time to read, discuss and decide for themselves on the Oct. 19 referendum vote.
