WHITECOURT RCMP MAKES ARREST AFTER SHOTS FIRED AT LOCAL GAS STATION

On Jan. 22, 2026, Whitecourt RCMP were called to a shooting that took place at a gas station in Whitecourt. A thorough investigation began involving both Whitecourt General Duty members and Whitecourt General Investigation Section.

As a result of the investiga-

tion, on July 29, 2026, Mike Lourenco (48), a resident of Whitecourt and Kyle Thebeau (41), a resident of Woodlands County, Alta., were arrested and subsequently charged with:

- Discharge of a firearm while being reckless;
- Pointing a firearm;
- Careless use of a firearm;
- Possession of a weapon for a dangerous purpose;

• Unauthorized possession in a motor vehicle;

• Possession of a restricted firearm with ammunition.

Lourenco and Thebeau were brought before a justice of the peace and remanded into custody. They are to appear before the Alberta Court of Justice in Whitecourt on Aug. 4, 2026.

islative requirements, the Police Review Commission CEO was immediately notified who deployed ASIRT to conduct an independent investigation. The RCMP believes in accountability and transparency and in so doing will provide full support to the ASIRT investigators. Events like this are difficult for everyone involved.

Independent of ASIRT's investigation, the RCMP's internal review process has been implemented to gather a full account of what took place during this incident. RCMP training, policy, police response, and the officer's duty status will be subject to review.

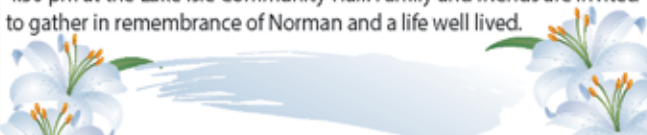

ALBERTA RCMP HISTORICAL HOMICIDE UNIT SENDS PUBLIC PLEA ON BEHALF OF FAMILY AFTER 50 YEARS

On the evening of Aug. 2, 1976, Marie Goudreau was returning home to Beaumont after dropping off a friend at the Edmonton International Airport and visiting friends in Edmonton. Shortly after midnight, her vehicle, a blue Plymouth Cricket, was located abandoned on a

rural road south of Edmonton. The vehicle was found with the engine running, headlights on and Marie's personal belongings still inside. Two days later, Marie's body was discovered in a rural area north of Devon. An autopsy later determined she had been murdered.

Over the past five decades, investigators have pursued numerous avenues of investigation, reviewed evidence, and followed information provided by members of the public. Despite those efforts, Marie's homicide remains unsolved.

Investigators have long believed Marie was simply travelling home after an evening with friends. Marie was the youngest of eight siblings and had recently graduated from high school and was preparing

to begin the next chapter of her life.

As August 2026 marks 50 years since her death, investigators and her family continue to seek answers and accountability for those responsible.

"Marie was our little sister, a bright, vibrant light who brought warmth, humour and endless energy into our family," said the Goudreau Family. "She had just finished high school and was excited about her future. Fifty years ago, our beloved sister was tragically taken from us, and the pain of that loss remains as deep today as it was then. Not a day goes by that we do not miss her presence and the future she was robbed of living."

"Half a century later, her murder remains unsolved,

leaving our family still searching for truth and justice. Somebody knows something—or suspects something. Even the smallest detail could help bring long-awaited answers. For our family's sake, if you have information, please come forward. It is never too late to do the right thing."

Investigators are reminding the public that information that may have seemed insignificant in 1976 may be viewed differently today. The passage of time can change perspectives, relationships and circumstances, and investigators remain hopeful that someone may come forward with information that could assist the investigation.

INVESTING IN HEALTH CARE FOR VULNERABLE ALBERTANS

Sprayer Rentals: Backpack, ATV, and pasture sprayers and a roller applicator are available to rent directly through the County Administration Office to make application easy.

Parkland RCMP is reminding motorists that safe driving habits play a critical role in preventing collisions and saving lives. Whether travelling locally or on longer trips, drivers are reminded that responsible choices behind the wheel can mean the difference between arriving safely and a tragic outcome.

Keep the following in mind before getting behind the wheel:

- Avoid all distractions: Distracted driving is not limited to texting or talking on a handheld device. It also includes personal grooming, reading, writing, adjusting GPS or audio devices, attending to passen-

gers or pets, or any other activity that might impair your ability to operate a vehicle safely.

- Never drive impaired: Alcohol and drugs affect judgement, coordination, and reaction time. Arrange a safe ride home.

- Buckle up: Ensure everyone in the vehicle is properly restrained before driving.

- Be alert at intersections: Slow down, watch for traffic in all directions, and look twice for pedestrians, cyclists, and motorcyclists before proceeding.

- Drive to conditions: Adjust your speed to weather, road, and traffic conditions.

- Share the road: Be mindful of cyclists, pedestrians, motorcyclists and other road

users.

- Share your travel plans: For longer trips, let someone know your destination, route and expected arrival time.

STRENGTHENING RESPONSE FOR VULNERABLE MISSING PERSONS

Alberta’s government is taking steps to identify opportunities to improve Alberta’s emergency alert system.

Following the tragic death of 11-year-old Parker Wells, which has had a profound impact on his family, friends and community, Alberta’s government is taking steps to identify opportunities to strengthen the systems and processes in place when a vulnerable person goes missing.

Public Safety and Emergency Services will engage with law enforcement, disability advocates and oth-

er community partners to examine emergency alert processes when a vulnerable person goes missing, including a review of the Amber Alert system and its current criteria.

The engagement will bring together a range of perspectives and expertise to better understand the current system and identify potential opportunities for improvement. Feedback gathered through the engagement will help inform options for government to consider.

In addition, Assisted Living and Social Services will undertake a review of the policies, procedures and protocols of the ser-

vice provider responsible for Parker’s care at the time he went missing. Alberta’s government is committed to understanding what happened and carefully considering any findings or recommendations that emerge from this review.

“Parker’s death is a heartbreaking tragedy, and our thoughts remain with his family and everyone who knew and loved him. We want to make sure we learn from what happened. By listening to law enforcement, disability advocates and community partners, we can better understand how emergency alerts are working today and what

options should be considered for the future.”

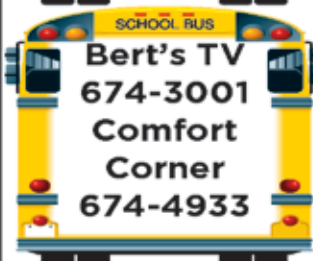
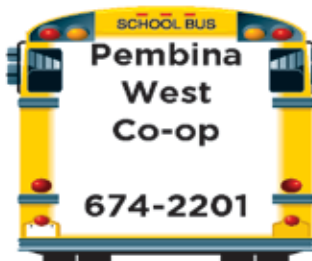

CYANOBACTERIAL (BLUE-GREEN ALGAL) BLOOM ADVISORY ISSUED FOR MATCHAYAW (DEVIL'S) LAKE

A cyanobacterial (blue-green algal) bloom and/or toxins have been identified in the waters of Matchayaw (Devil's) Lake. Residents living near the shores of this lake, as well as visitors, are advised to take the following precautions:

- Do not swim or wade in any areas where cyanobacterial blooms are visible.

- Avoid all contact with cyanobacterial blooms in the water and washed up on shore. Wash with clean tap water as soon as possible if contact occurs.

- Do not drink or cook with water from this lake.

- Do not eat whole fish or fish trimmings from this lake as fish may store toxins in their liver. Fish fillets contain less toxins and are safer to eat.

- Keep pets away from the water. Do not allow pets to swim in areas where cyanobacterial blooms are visible or to contact blooms in the water or on the shore.

- Do not feed whole fish or fish trimmings from this lake to your pets.

As always, visitors and residents are reminded to never drink or cook with untreated water directly from any body of water, including Matchayaw (Devil's) Lake, at any time. Boiling of this water will not remove the toxins produced by cyanobacteria. An alternate source of drinking water should also be provided for pets and livestock while this advisory is active.

Cyanobacteria are naturally occurring and large growths called 'blooms' are more common during warm weather. Cyanobacterial blooms can be blue-green, greenish-brown, brown, pink and/or red, and can look like scum, streaks, grass clippings, fuzz balls, paint or pea soup. They often smell

musty or grassy.

People who come in contact with a cyanobacterial bloom or who ingest water containing cyanobacteria may experience skin irritation, rash, sore throat, sore red eyes, swollen lips, fever, nausea and vomiting and/or diarrhea. Symptoms can appear within one to three hours and resolve in one

to two days. Symptoms in children are often more pronounced; however, all people are at risk of these symptoms. Exposure to cyanobacteria may be fatal to pets.

Weather and wind conditions can cause cyanobacterial blooms to move from one location in the lake to another. As such, this advisory

will remain in effect for Matchayaw (Devil's) Lake until further notice.

Please note waters of Matchayaw (Devil's) Lake in which the cyanobacterial bloom is NOT visible can still be used for recreational purposes, even while this Health Advisory is in place.
