ALBERTA RCMP HISTORICAL HOMICIDE UNIT SENDS PUBLIC PLEA ON BEHALF OF FAMILY AFTER 50 YEARS

On the evening of Aug. 2, 1976, Marie Goudreau was returning home to Beaumont after dropping off a friend at the Edmonton International Airport and visiting friends in Edmonton. Shortly after midnight, her vehicle, a blue Plymouth Cricket, was located abandoned on a rural road south of Edmonton. The vehicle was found with the

engine running, headlights on and Marie's personal belongings still inside. Two days later, Marie's body was discovered in a rural area north of Devon. An autopsy later determined she had been murdered.

Over the past five decades, investigators have pursued numerous avenues of investigation, reviewed evidence, and followed information provided by members of the public. Despite those efforts, Marie's homicide remains unsolved.

Investigators have long believed Marie was simply travelling home after an evening with friends. Marie was the youngest of eight siblings and had recently graduated from high school and was preparing to begin the next chapter of her

life.

As August 2026 marks 50 years since her death, investigators and her family continue to seek answers and accountability for those responsible.

"Marie was our little sister, a bright, vibrant light who brought warmth, humour and endless energy into our family," said the Goudreau Family. "She had just finished high school and was excited about her future. Fifty years ago, our beloved sister was tragically taken from us, and the pain of that loss remains as deep today as it was then. Not a day goes by that we do not miss her presence and the future she was robbed of living."

"Half a century later, her murder remains unsolved,

leaving our family still searching for truth and justice. Somebody knows something—or suspects something. Even the smallest detail could help bring long-awaited answers. For our family's sake, if you have information, please come forward. It is never too late to do the right thing."

Investigators are reminding the public that information that may have seemed insignificant in 1976 may be viewed differently today. The passage of time can change perspectives, relationships and circumstances, and investigators remain hopeful that someone may come forward with information that could assist the investigation.

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REDUCE COLD-WEATHER FIRE RISK

Plenty of things heat up when the temperature drops, including the risk for fire hazards. Fireplaces, stoves, heating systems, candles, and even electric lights are used more often during the winter than any other time of year, so it makes sense that the risk of home fires increases when the mercury drops.

The U.S. Fire Administration says 905 people die in winter home fires each year. Cooking is the leading cause of all home fires and contributes to around \$2 billion in property loss each year. Understanding potential risks and exercising caution can help homeowners protect themselves, their families and

their homes from fire.

Cooking

Home heating fires peak between the hours of 6 p.m. and 8 p.m., when many people are home preparing dinner. The following steps, courtesy of the American Red Cross, can improve safety in the kitchen and reduce the likelihood of a home fire.

- Never leave cooking food unattended, as it can take just seconds for fires to ignite.

- Keep anything that can catch fire away from the stove or other appliances that generate heat.

- Clean regularly to prevent grease buildup.

• Make sure appliances are turned off before leaving the room or going to bed.

Heating

The National Fire Protection Association warns that heating is the second leading cause of home fires, deaths and injuries in the United States. The NFPA offers these safety guidelines.

• Install heating appliances according to manufacturers' instructions or have a professional do the installation.

• Fuel-burning equipment needs to vent to the outside.

• Never use an oven to heat a home.

• Keep anything that can burn away from heating equipment, including portable space heaters.

• Clean and inspect heating appliances regularly.

• Turn off portable heaters when leaving the room or going to bed.

Electric

The National Safety Council estimates that between 600 and 1,000 people die each year from electrocution. Electricity also can contribute to home fires. The Energy Education Council offers these safety suggestions.

• Never force plugs into outlets.

• Check that cords are not frayed or cracked. Do not run cords under carpets or place them in high-traffic areas.

• Use extension cords only on a temporary basis.

• Make sure light bulbs are the proper wattage for fixtures.

• Install ground fault circuit interrupters in kitchens, baths, laundry rooms, and elsewhere, making sure to test them regularly.

• Check periodically for loose wall receptacles and loose

wires. Listen for popping or sizzling sounds behind walls.

Home fires are no joke and can be prevented with simple safety checks.
